PENDUDUK Taman Sri Murni, di sini berdepan masalah jalan raya yang kronik dengan keadaan berlubang dan tidak rata dari di Jalan 1/2b dari susur masuk Jalan Kuching, di sini.

Masalah mula muncul sekitar September tahun lalu dan didakwa sudah diturap semula namun kembali berlubang tidak berapa lama kemudian dipercayai akibat kehadiran kenderaan berat yang melaluinya.

Seorang penduduk yang hanya mahu dikenali sebagai Hasami, 32, berkata, dia yang menetap di

Apartmen Sri Murni berdekatan, melalui jalan tersebut setiap hari terutama pada waktu pulang dari tempat kerja di pusat bandar raya.

“Tahun lalu rosak, kemudian jalan itu diturap kembali namun kerosakan kembali. Saya sendiri tidak pasti sama ada ia berkaitan dengan projek pembinaan berhampiran atau disebabkan lori-lori ke Pasar Borong Selayang.

“Apapun, turapan terbaru pada bulan lalu memperlihatkan permukaan jalan kembali rata di persimpangan lampu isyarat

berdekatan Tasik Sri Murni namun Jalan 1/2b terutama dari susur masuk Taman Desa Bakti dan Taman Wilayah masih mengecewakan,” katanya ketika ditemui.

Menurutnya, dia sendiri tidak pasti sama ada jalan tersebut di bawah tanggungjawab Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur atau Majlis Perbandaran Selayang namun berharap pendedahan keadaan jalan raya ini mendapat pembelaan segera.

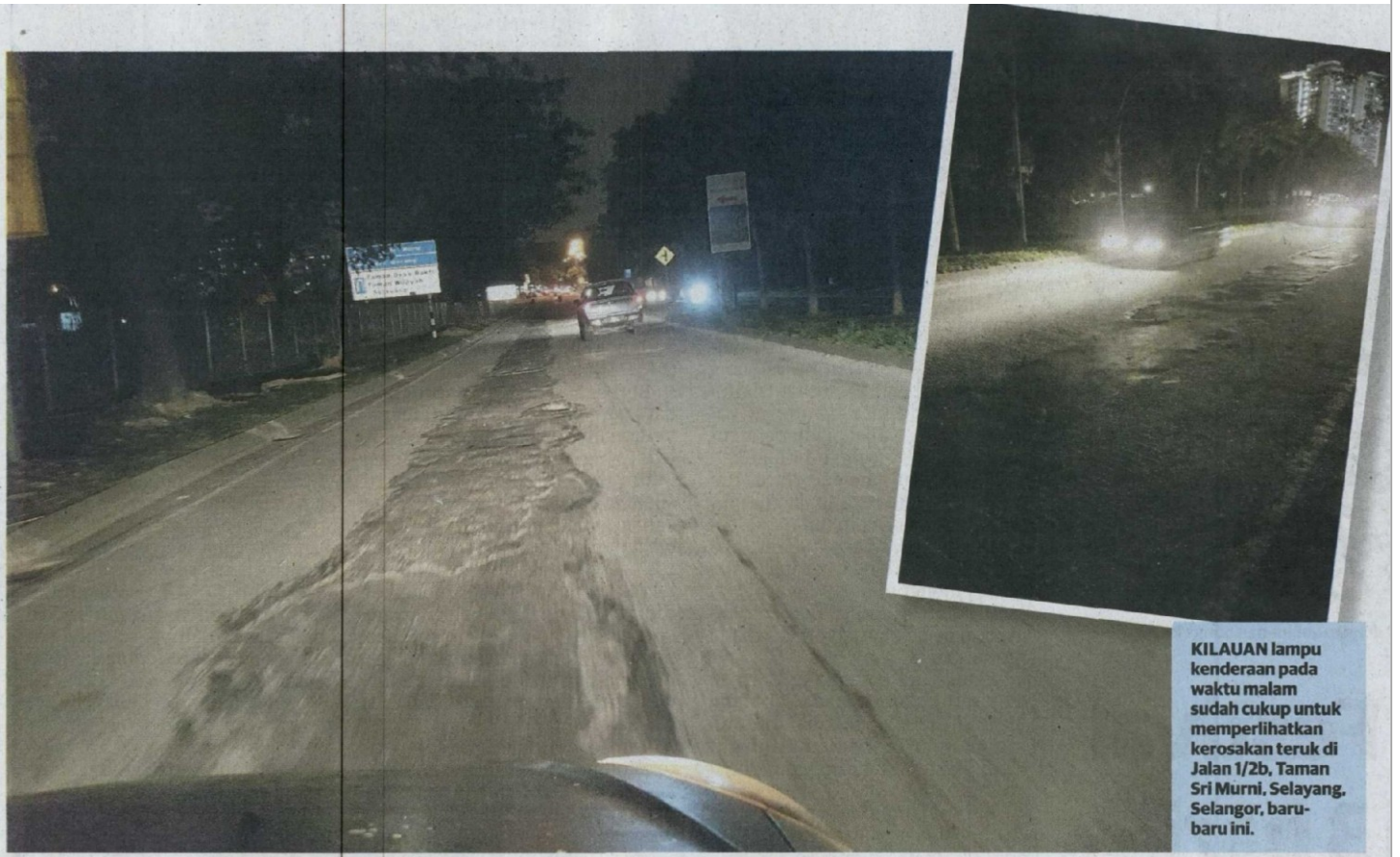
Jalan dua lorong itu, katanya, sering sesak di waktu puncak memandangkan kenderaan terpaksa menggunakan hanya satu lorong kerana turapan tidak rata sepanjang lebih 200 meter pada lorong sebelah dikhuatiri meragut nyawa.

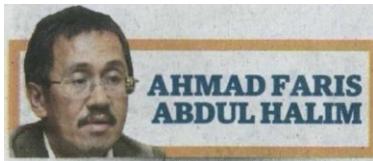

PRK MENGHUKUM AZMIN, GUAN ENG?



KECELARUAN pakatan pembangkang dalam meletakkan calon di dua kerusi pilihan raya kecil (PRK) Sungai Besar dan Kuala Kangsar, serta-merta mengingatkan kita satu adegan filem arahan Allahyarham P. Ramlee.

Dalam filem *Nجوم Pak Belalang* terbitan 1959 itu, Allahyarham Aziz Sattar (Badan) sedang membahagikan duit syiling hasil rompakan dengan Allahyarham S. Shamsuddin (Nyawa) di dalam gua.

Badan: 1 untuk engkau, 1 untuk aku. 2 untuk engkau, 2 untuk aku. 3 untuk engkau, 3 untuk aku. Lepas tiga berapa??

Nyawa: Hentam sajalah...

Badan: Hentam sajalah untuk engkau, hentam sajalah untuk aku. Lepas hentam sajalah??

Nyawa: Bedal daa...

Badan: Bedal daa untuk engkau. Bedal daa untuk aku. Lepas bedal daa??...

Mesej yang terkandung dalam filem P. Ramlee memang tidak luput dek zaman.

Jumaat lalu, Barisan Nasional (BN) dan Pas akan mengumumkan calon masing-masing dalam dua PRK berkenaan ketika DAP, PKR dan PAN terus berserabut menetapkan siapa kalangan mereka yang layak.

Dalam hal ini, jentera BN jangan hanya berpeluk tubuh. Jangan ingat begitu mudah mahu ambil kesempatan atas kecelaruan pembangkang ini andai tiada kerja keras disusun untuk memastikan kemenangan.

Perlu diingat, DAP terutamanya telah menjalankan proses menambah pengundi baharu lebih awal berbanding mana-mana parti di setiap kerusi Parlimen dan Dewan Undangan Negeri (DUN). Ini termasuk di DUN Sekinchan dan DUN Sungai Panjang dalam Parli-

men Sungai Besar.

BN juga jangan terpesona dengan kemenangan besar di Sarawak 7 Mei lepas. Kerja pembangkang hari-hari ialah memindah dan menambah pengundi baharu.

Justeru, kempen di dua PRK ini mesti ada caranya. Strategi perlu lebih santai, menyengat dan luar biasa. Apatah lagi dalam bulan Ramadan. Mungkin strategi semasa PRK Kuala Besut boleh dicuba.

Di sebalik ini, kalangan pemimpin UMNO pula jangan ambil kesempatan untuk mempromosikan diri dengan menunjukkan simbol tertentu. Jangan juga hingga terjadi seperti Pilihan Raya Umum Ke-13 (PRU-13) yang diketahui salah satu sebab kekalahan ekoran kesilapan BN memilih calon.

Kalau berkehendakkan majoriti Melayu, UMNO mesti menjadi tunjang. Pembangkang pun mengakui walaupun peratus undi popular mereka meningkat namun UMNO masih mendominasi undi kawasan majoriti Melayu.

Pengarah Komunikasi PAN, Khalid Abdul Samad mengakui 60 peratus orang Melayu masih memihak UMNO. Tetapi jangan ahli UMNO dan BN alpa atau 'teruja' dengan perkara ini.

Dalam PRK Sungai Besar yang lebih kritikal berbanding PRK Kuala Kangsar ini, jentera parti harus selami dan tunaikan amanat Timbalan Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Dr. Ahmad Zahid Hamidi baru-baru ini:

"Kita tahu kemenangan kita di Sungai Besar terlalu tipis (majoriti 399 undi) tetapi tidak mustahil untuk memperoleh kemenangan dengan dibantu oleh rakan-rakan dari seluruh bahagian dan kawasan Parlimen."

Dalam PRK Sungai Besar, jangan ambil mudah kerana BN menghadapi 'bala tentera' kerajaan negeri.

Dalam tempoh dua minggu ini Menteri Besar Selangor, Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali yang jarang dilihat kelibatnya di kawasan luar bandar secara tiba-tiba mengu-

mumkan perkhidmatan bas percuma di Sabak Bernam melalui Sungai Besar. Begitu agresif.

Menjelang penamaan calon 5 Jun ini, nampak ketara DAP amat perlukan PAN mewakili Pas disebabkan mereka ada 'memorandum persefahaman' (MoU). PAN dianggap pengganti Pas dan mana-mana Pas bertanding selepas ini, DAP mencaturkan calon PAN mesti diletakkan di situ.

Ini juga menjadi indikator pembangkang menghadapi pilihan raya umum akan datang sama ada PAN layak menggantikan Pas atau tidak, seperti dakwaan pemimpinnya bahawa mereka menguasai 80 peratus pengikut Pas.

Mungkin pemimpin PAN wajar 'berlagak' sedemikian setelah 'diberi muka' oleh DAP memandangkan rata-rata mereka ialah profesional, bijak berpolitik, liberal Islam berbanding Pas yang didakwa politik 'kekampungan'.

Justeru, bedah siasat 'imej' PAN ini kelak penting. Lagipun kemenangan atau kekalahan mana-mana pihak di dua PRK ini tidak akan merubah Kerajaan Pusat.

Jika PAN masih gagal 'deliver'

setelah tewas di kesemua 13 kerusi dalam PRN Sarawak, maka Majlis Presiden mempunyai tempoh dua tahun lagi untuk merangka strategi mencari 'kawan baharu'.

Dengan PRK ini berbeza dari segi komposisi kaum iaitu Sungai Besar dengan DUN Sungai Panjang mewakili 83.16 peratus atau 22,227 pengundi Melayu manakala DUN Sekinchan diwakili 56.90 peratus atau 9,166 pengundi Cina, justeru benar-benar menjadi indikator pencapaian PAN.

Namun DAP dan PKR juga cukup maklum bahawa Pas sendiri tidak akan berdiam diri dalam meletakkan calon bukan Melayu mereka. Presidennya, Datuk Seri Abdul Hadi Awang telahpun membuat ujikaji di Sarawak dengan meletakkan calon bukan Islam dari Dewan Himpunan Penyokong Pas (DHPP). Biar pun masih belum berjaya, Pas

boleh menjadikan PRK Sungai Besar tapak DHPP membuktikan ketajamannya.

PRK Sungai Besar mula memaparkan gelagat Setiausaha Agung PKR, Rafizi Ramli 'menyerang' menteri besarnya. Justeru, Mohamed Azmin 'mesti menang' di Sungai Besar untuk menaikkan moralnya.

Pada masa sama, DAP juga tidak jitu. Isu pembelian banglo Lim Guan Eng, siapa yang membocorkan rahsia atau mendedahkan dokumen pembelian? Adakah dari dalam Komtar?

Sekutu-sekutu dalam pakatan pembangkang ketika ini masih menikam sesama sendiri. Ini berbeza dengan BN yang jelas sepakat bahawa calon UMNO yang akan membawa panji-panji BN dalam dua PRK ini. Tidak timbul MCA mencelah atau Gerakan merungut.

Adakah PRK ini bakal menyaksikan berulangnya pertindihan calon pakatan di kerusi yang ditandingi? Adakah 'keluarga Anwar' mahu meletakkan calon PAN

untuk menghukum Mohamed Azmin sebagai kononnya gagal mentadbir Selangor?

Ini semua tidak mustahil dalam politik haru-biru pakatan pembangkang.

SHAH ALAM – Polis Selangor memberi jaminan perjalanan kempen Pilihan Raya Kecil (PRK) Parlimen Sungai Besar yang akan bermula Ahad ini berjalan lancar tanpa ada sebarang unsur-unsur yang boleh menjejaskan keselamatan rakyat di kawasan itu.

Ketua Polis Negeri, Datuk Abdul Samah Mat (**gambar kecil**) berkata, bagi tujuan itu, pihaknya telah menempatkan seramai 5,210 anggota bagi menjaga keselamatan orang ramai sepanjang PRK itu berlangsung.

“Kita telah merancang tugas



melibatkan aspek-aspek keselamatan bermula daripada proses penamaan, kempen-kempen parti politik, hari pengundian sehinggalah kepada proses pengumuman keputusan PRK Parlimen Sungai Besar.

“Justeru, para pengundi

tidak perlu bimbang untuk menunaikan tanggungjawab masing-masing dalam PRK itu nanti,” katanya pada sidang akhbar di Ibu Pejabat Polis Kontinjen Selangor di sini semalam.

PRK Parlimen Sungai Besar diadakan setelah penyangdangnya, Datuk Noriah Kasnon dari Barisan Nasional

(BN) terkorban dalam nahas helikopter di Sebuyau, Sarawak pada 5 Mei lalu.

Setakat ini, PRK Parlimen Sungai Besar menyaksikan BN akan menurunkan Ahli Dewan Undangan Negeri Sungai Panjang, Budiman Mohd. Zohdi manakala Pas diwakili ADUN Meru, Dr. Abdul Rani Osman.

Larang lantik imam luar negara

Jais galak lantik imam tarawih dalam kalangan imam tempatan

SHAH ALAM - Pengarah Jabatan Agama Islam Selangor (Jais), Datuk Haris Kasim, mengingatkan semua masjid dan surau dilarang melantik imam tarawih dari negara luar.

Pihaknya menggalakkan agar imam tarawih dilantik dalam kalangan imam tempatan yang terdiri daripada pelajar atau lulusan tahfiz dari dalam negara.

Menurutnya, semua masjid dan surau turut dinasihatkan supaya melaksanakan solat tarawih 20 rakaat sebagaimana yang diamalkan Saidina Umar RA dan menjadi amalan di Masjidil Haram dan Masjid Nabawi.

Beliau turut mengingatkan agar tidak mengadakan tazkirah atau ceramah di pertengahan solat tarawih dan semua aktiviti tazkirah hendaklah dibuat di antara solat Maghrib dan Isyak atau setelah selesai solat tarawih dan witir.

"Tazkirah pula tidak disampaikan dalam tempoh

yang lama melebihi 20 minit. Isi tazkirah juga tidak dibenarkan menyentuh isu sensitif yang menyinggung pihak tertentu.

"Nazir dan pengerusi surau hendaklah memastikan slot tazkirah tidak dijadikan ceramah politik yang akan menimbulkan rasa tidak senang hati serta perpecahan masyarakat. Perasaan saling menghormati perlulah diterapkan pada bulan yang penuh keberkatan ini," katanya pada Majlis Perasmian Konvensyen Pemantapan dan Pemeraksanaan Pengurusan Masjid dan Surau Negeri Selangor serta Penyampaian

Sumbangan Bantuan Moreh Bulan Ramadan 1437/2016 di Masjid Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz (MSSAAS), kelmarin.

Hadirsama, Senator Dewan Negara, Dr Muhammad Nur Manuty; Exco Hal Ehwal Agama, Jawatankuasa Adat Melayu, Pembangunan Desa dan Kampung Tradisi, Datuk Ahmad Yunus Hairi dan Imam Besar Masjid MSSAAS, Muhammad Farhan Wijaya.

Haris berkata, semua penceramah yang dipanggil atau dijemput juga hendaklah mempunyai tauliah berceramah yang dikeluarkan Jais.

Jelasnya, kebenaran khas daripada Jais perlu dipohon jika penceramah yang dipanggil tidak mempunyai tauliah.

"Keingkaran nazir dan pengerusi surau mematuhi peraturan ini boleh menyebabkan tindakan diambil di bawah Seksyen 119(1) Enakmen Pentadbiran Agama Islam (Negeri Selangor) 2003," katanya.

RM20j elaun guru Kafa

SHAH ALAM-Jabatan Agama Islam Selangor (Jais) menerima peruntukan kira-kira RM20 juta daripada kerajaan negeri untuk kenaikan elaun guru Kelas Agama Dan Fardu Ain (Kafa) di negeri ini.

Timbalan Pengarah Jais, Zaki Arshad berkata, seramai 6,900 guru Kafa akan menikmati faedah daripada peruntukan yang disalurkan itu.

"Kerajaan negeri berhasrat meluaskan perkhidmatan dan meningkatkan elaun guru Kafa dari semasa ke semasa bermula dari RM50-200 mengikut tahun perkhidmatan," katanya ketika Sambutan Hari Guru dan Penyampaian Anugerah Kualiti Pendidikan 2016 Jabatan Agama Islam Selangor 2016, di sini, semalam.

Menurutnya, Jais juga sedang dalam usaha mendapatkan kelulusan kerajaan negeri supaya guru Kafa yang sedia ada diserapkan ke jawatan kontrak.

"Guru yang berjawatan tetap pula akan disemak kemudahan dan kelayakan yang patut diterima agar selari dengan guru alir-

an arus perdana," katanya.

Katanya, kerajaan negeri tidak ketinggalan memperuntukkan RM42.5 juta untuk pembinaan dan baik pulih sekolah bawah kelolaan Jais di seluruh Selangor.

"Jais mempunyai kira-kira 565 sekolah yang digerakkan oleh 9,465 guru untuk mendidik 250,563 murid," katanya.

Justeru itu, Zaki berkata, Jais memandang berat terhadap angka-angka besar itu dengan memberi fokus kepada aspek pembangunan sekolah kurikulum dan kebajikan guru.

Sementara itu, guru besar Sekolah Rendah Agama (SRA) Sabak Bernam, Sarif Taib telah dinobatkan sebagai Tokoh Guru Lelaki 2016 dan Parti Umar, juga guru dari sekolah yang sama pula telah dinobatkan sebagai Tokoh Guru Perempuan 2016.

Katanya lagi, tindakan dilakukan di bawah Seksyen 46 (1) D Akta Jalan Parit dan Bangunan 1974 kerana

membina bangsal tanpa kebenaran.

"Tiada kompaun dikenakan dan tiada sebarang rampasan juga dilakukan hanya perobohan struktur.

"Pemilik dinasihatkan supaya membuat permohonan kepada MPS terlebih dahulu sebelum sebarang kerja dilakukan atas tanah tersebut.

"Pemantauan akan dilakukan dari semasa ke semasa bagi memastikan pemiliknya mematuhi syarat ditetapkan PBT," katanya.

Jelasnya, operasi melibatkan 17 anggota berjalan lancar tanpa sebarang provokasi atau halangan.

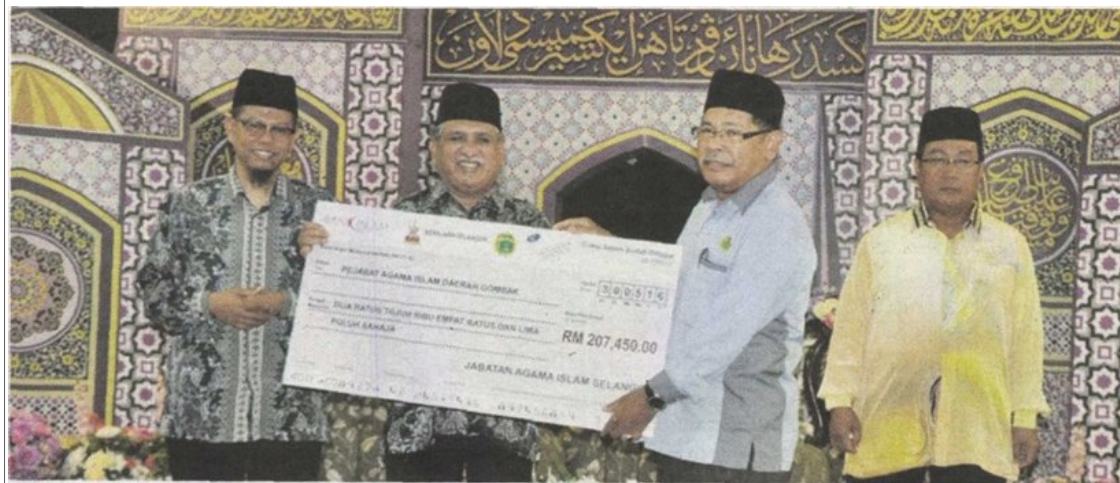

MDKL bersih 35 tan sampah haram

Beberapa jabatan daerah turut bekerjasama kerah tenaga libat dua lokasi

BANTING - Kesedaran awam serta sikap sesetengah masyarakat terhadap cara melupuskan sampah dengan betul merupakan faktor utama menyumbang kepada pertambahan lokasi hotspot sampah haram di daerah ini.

Bagi mengekang masalah ini daripada berlarutan, MDKL telah mengerah tenaga dalam satu operasi bersepadu bersama Pejabat Daerah dan Tanah, Jabatan Kerja Raya (JKR) dan Jabatan Pengairan dan Saliran (JPS) daerah Kuala Langat.

Operasi itu melibatkan 53 pegawai, kakitangan MDKL serta pihak pengurusan tertinggi yang terlibat secara langsung dalam operasi pembersihan 35 tan sampah haram di dua lokasi sampah haram di Jalan Sentosa, Pekan Banting dan Jalan Sungai Ingat, Kampung Chodoi, di sini, kelmarin.

Setiausaha MDKL, Mohd Yasin Alwi berkata, isu sampah haram merupakan antara masalah yang menjadi fokus utama ke arah usaha sifar sampah haram.

Menurutnya, perbuatan tidak bertanggungjawab membuang sampah di bahu jalan serta di tempat tidak sepatutnya oleh sebilangan masyarakat ini telah menyebabkan pencemaran bau serta pemandangan di lokasi tumpuan awam serta dikhuatiri menyumbang kepada kawasan pembiakan aedes.

"Tindakan membuang sampah secara haram amat dikesali dan pihak majlis akan meneruskan usaha yang telah digerakkan dalam menangani kegiatan yang tidak sihat ini.

"Kesalahan tersebut boleh dikenakan tindakan notis kesalahan yang boleh dikompaun dengan nilai maksimum sebanyak RM1,000," katanya.

Mohd Yasin berkata, untuk rekod, sebanyak 62 operasi statik serta pemantauan telah dijalankan anggota penguat kuasa dan sebanyak 23 notis kesalahan telah dikeluarkan kepada pesalah.

Katanya, pelbagai usaha serta kempen dijalankan bagi meningkatkan kesedaran awam terhadap kesalahan membuang sampah secara

haram ini tidak akan tercapai tanpa kerjasama warga masyarakat.

"Ada segelintir orang awam yang menganggap lokasi yang dibersihkan adalah tempat mereka melupuskan sampah.

"Ini salah, pihak Majlis memandang serius perkara ini dan akan meneruskan pemantauan bagi mengenal pasti individu-individu tidak bertanggungjawab melakukan pencemaran sampah haram ini dan dikenakan tindakan," katanya.

Dalam pada itu, beliau berkata, MDKL berterima kasih atas sokongan serta kerjasama tidak berbelah bahagi jabatan daerah yang telah memberikan bantuan dari segi tenaga dan keperluan logistik bagi menjayakan setiap operasi bersepadu.

"Antara jentera yang digunakan termasuklah jentolak, lori muatan 10 tan milik JKR dan JPS selain penggunaan tiga lori roro muatan lima tan milik MDKL bagi kerja-kerja membersihkan dan mengangkut sampah haram," katanya.

SUNGAI BESAR: When he goes campaigning, Barisan Nasional candidate for the Sungai Besar by-election will be banking on his good name – literally.

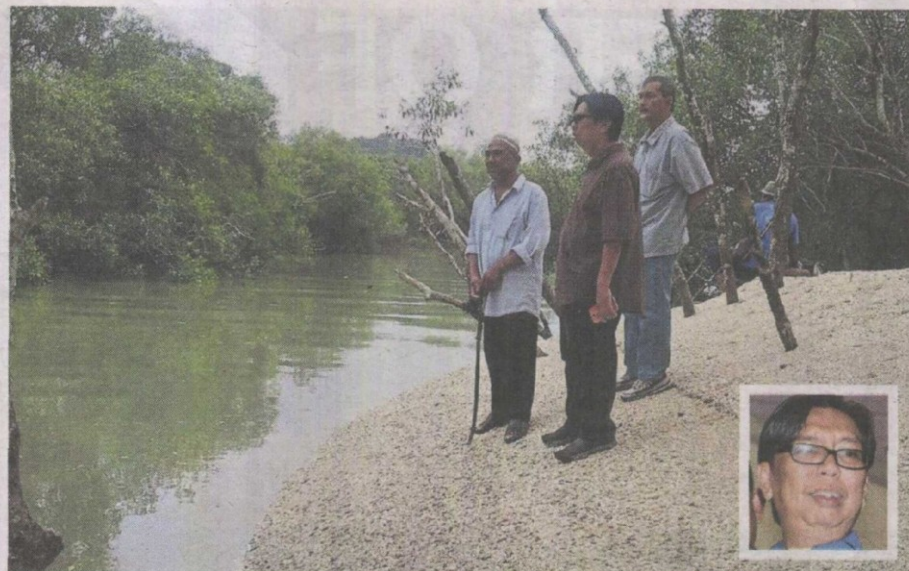
Budiman Mohd Zohdi said he would be making full use of the tagline – *Inilah Budiman* (This is gentleman) – as part of his campaign to woo the voters.

For this by-election, especially as it takes place during the fasting month, Budiman has chosen to meet voters face-to-face instead of holding big ceramah or mega rallies.

“I prefer to interact in a smaller group as it is more personal with voters. I think a low-key campaign will benefit me considering it is the holy month of Ramadan.

“I will not be selling big ideas. I am just selling myself to the voters,” he said at the Barisan Nasional command centre here yesterday.

Budiman, 44, who was born in Kampung Sungai Limau, Sungai Besar, is currently pursuing a PhD

in political science at Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia.

The constituency has 42,837 voters, with Malays comprising 67.18%, followed by the Chinese (30.68%), Indians (1.91%) and others (0.23%).

Budiman, who is also the Sungai Panjang assemblyman, said he had identified several local issues that needed to be addressed, including enforcement issues for fishermen.

“My strength is I always give my service no matter what your race is

or from what political party. If they have a problem, they can come to me.

“In this area, it is about improving the livelihood of the local folks,” he said.

On the possible three-cornered fight with PAS and Amanah, Budiman said he was unperturbed by the other candidates, even if this should turn out to be Amanah president Mohd Sabu.

Pointing out that he has a good

track record with the local community, Budiman said:

“I am a local candidate and if anything happens here, I will be around. I do not know about others who come from other areas. Can they be there for the constituents? I am here to stay.”

For the time being, Budiman will be going against PAS’ Meru assemblyman Dr Abdul Rani Osman in the by-election. Nomination is this Sunday.

Left out of Petaling Jaya's rapid growth

Dilapidated buildings, lack of parking and traffic congestion among problems Old Town residents want resolved

PETALING Jaya Old Town was once a go-to place and a hub of activity some 40 to 50 years ago, but now it is dilapidated and in dire need of a facelift.

What was once a satellite town in the early 1950s with only about 800 houses along Jalan 1 (Jalan Templer) and Jalan 2 (Jalan Othman), the place has since grown and matured.

But the infrastructure in Old Town has not kept pace with the speed of development all around it. As a result, residents and other stakeholders here are saddled with a host of problems.

From the main shoplots in Jalan Othman, business has now expanded into some residential houses that have been converted into commercial premises in Section 1 and Section 2.

Although it is not legal – as the land status still remains residential – the lack of enforcement by Petaling Jaya City Council (MBPJ) emboldens other business owners.

“Enforcement here is not really visible and I believe this has resulted in many problems over the years,” said Old Town Residents Association (RA) chairman K.Y. Lee.

Lee, who remembers Old Town as a peaceful neighbourhood some 40 years ago, said traffic was now getting from bad to worse.

Cars are seen parked haphazardly by the side of the

narrow streets, on both the main roads as well as inner roads among the houses. The problem is due in part to the ongoing underground sewerage works that affected some of the designated bays, which are being used to facilitate traffic flow.

“The illegal restaurants housed in residential premises are exacerbating the situation further reducing parking space and causing traffic congestion,” he said.

On top of it all, motorists are parking their cars on the street beside the wet market. And double-parking is rampant.

Consequently traffic commonly come to a standstill, especially in Jalan Pasar 1/21.

Another unconventional situation has presented itself in this old township – the streets are higher than the kerbs.

Roads such as Jalan 1/10 and Jalan 1/12 are higher than the kerb and even the houses lining the streets.

“As MBPJ and its contractors failed to remove the old tar each time they resurfaced the roads and the street surface kept rising,” noted Lee.

He said this had cause a few problems including cars partially falling into the drain running right beside the narrow kerb. They include vehicles turning at a street corner, as the roads are narrow, too.

“A few times residents and shopkeepers had to help lift a car out of the drain,” he said.

MBPJ has recently tried resolving

this by levelling some of the roads such as Jalan 1/19 and made them wider.

One other major change implemented by MBPJ in March was turning busy, narrow roads namely Jalan 2/38, Jalan 1/10, Jalan 1/4, Jalan 1/18 and Jalan 1/10 into one-way streets with the aim of easing traffic congestion.

The move has received mixed reviews from residents and other stakeholders.

“While we appreciate the intention, traffic flow did not improve much because the traffic change pushed vehicles onto Jalan 1/12 and the situation there is really bad now,” said Section 1B Rukun Tetangga chairman Kok Kuan Yong.

He lamented that MBPJ did not listen to their suggestions for the road changes and hoped the council would now try out the residents' proposals.

For example, they had suggested that the one-way traffic from Jalan 1/14 flow into Jalan 1/12 but MBPJ did the opposite. Now motorists are forced to go one big circle in order to get back onto the main road, Jalan Othman.

“Previously, motorists were also allowed to enter Jalan 1/14 from Jalan Othman but after the changes, motorists will have to drive further down Jalan Othman and turn left at the traffic lights to get onto Jalan 1/12, which has become the only link from the inner roads to the main street,” Kok explained.

Residents are also sceptical about

the new bus station which is still under construction.

This project is to replace the old station built in the 1970s.

Under the plans, a multi-storey building is being constructed with shoplots above the bus terminal on the ground floor.

"We do not need more retail shops. What we need are more parking lots as we are clearly lacking that facility," said Kok.

He revealed that residents' suggestion to MBPJ for a multi-storey parking lot had been rejected as the council was short of funds.

The only multi-storey carpark in Old Town now is on the upper floors of the PJ Old Town market. Parking here costs RM1 an hour.

According to some residents, many visitors are afraid to drive up to that parking lot because the building looks very run-down.

Residents are urging MBPJ to build a carpark at the Medan Selera food court along with a pedestrian bridge connecting it

to the market.

When contacted by *StarMetro*, Taman Medan assemblyman Haniza Mohamed Talha agreed that much more had to be done for Old Town.

"The whole area has now lost its charm and, sad to say, it seems to be slowly dying off," she said.

One of the features she thinks is an attraction is the Old Town market, which is also now in a dilapidated condition.

"I have told MBPJ a few times that the whole area, not just the market, needs a major facelift but so far they have not gotten back to me with their plans," she said.

She hopes MBPJ will come up with specific plans to rejuvenate the township, like the heritage states in Penang and Malacca.

To help conserve history and keep the good parts of Old Town, MBPJ needs to come up with a plan to maintain the old buildings properly.

"The council told me it did not have the budget for this as it is

costly but I believe if they were serious about it, conservation works can be done in stages within five years or so," she said.

She urged MBPJ department heads to come together and seriously work out a plan for Old Town.

Apart from that, Haniza said infrastructure works such as drainage upgrades were also needed because the old drains could no longer cater to the downpours.

Currently, the Malaysian Road Record Information System (Marris) funds from the Federal Government are only allowed for maintenance and repair works.

"We cannot use the money for upgrades and so I have requested for the state to bring it up with the Federal Government to change the rules and include upgrading projects next year," she added.

Meanwhile, local councillor Terence Tan said infrastructure development aside, he had been pushing for the unlicensed

businesses in his area to be legalised.

These include several rows of houses, facing Jalan Pasar and Jalan Othman, that have been converted into shops.

"There are only a few areas which are zoned as commercial, from the Pos Malaysia row to McDonald's, and the row of shophouses between Jalan Pasar 1/21 and Jalan 1/10," said Tan.

This means that several places, including the row of businesses on the other side of Jalan Pasar, are running afoul of council by-laws and operating in residential dwellings.

"This issue has been brought up at both the Urban Planning Committee level and also at MBPJ's full board meeting," said Tan.

So far, he had managed to get the council to carry out a survey of all the unlicensed businesses in the section of Old Town under his supervision, to gain a clearer picture of the situation before the council proceeded with legalisation.

MOTORISTS have been warned against haphazardly parking their vehicles and encroaching on footpaths, restricted areas painted with lines or corners.

Petaling Jaya OCPD Asst Comm Mohd Zani Che Din said police had warned motorists against parking in such a way as it endangered other road users or forced pedestrians onto the road.

"Our traffic officers have been told to issue summonses to those who do so," he said.

ACP Mohd Zani added that pedestrian walkways were meant for pedestrians and vehicles must not encroach on such amenities as it could obstruct pedestrians, especially wheelchair-bound users.

He said that after *StarMetro* highlighted indiscriminate parking along the road shoulder in Lorong 4/48A and Jalan 4/47 off Jalan Penchala, Petaling Jaya, traffic police officers had visited the area to issue fines to the vehicle owners.

"Our traffic department is aware of the haphazard parking along these residential roads.

"In 2015, we issued 874 parking summonses while from January to April this year, we have already issued 291 summonses in Section 4, Petaling Jaya, alone," ACP Mohd Zani said.

Rukun Tetangga Section 4A secretary Mithila Devi Nagendiram, 77, and vice-chairman David Savarimuthu had brought up the issue of motorists parking indiscriminately and endangering other road users.

MPAJ discovers forged approvals for home renovations

AMPANG Jaya residents have been advised to be wary of "runners" offering false approvals from the local council for residential building plans.

Ampang Jaya Municipal Council (MPAJ) president Abdul Hamid Abdul Hussain said three cases had been found, involving the falsifying of council documents for home renovations.

"So far, we have come across the cases in Pandan Perdana and Kampung Pandan.

"These conmen forged the signa-

tures of MPAJ department heads on plans, letters and even planning process receipts.

"They lure people by offering significantly lower processing fees, but they do not send the documents to us to be verified," he said during yesterday's full board meeting.

He added that homeowners and the council had made police reports on the matter.

"We urge residents to be cautious when appointing third parties and refer to MPAJ if they have any doubts," Abdul Hamid advised.

Meanwhile, the council is offering homeowners a chance to legal-

ise home renovations that had been carried out without approval, by giving them a chance to submit new building plans.

"This is only applicable to those who have already done the renovation works.

"They can submit the plans to us and we will consider the application, provided that there has been no objections from the public, does not endanger the surrounding and is not a nuisance," said Abdul Hamid.

Homeowners have from today until May 31, 2017, to submit their documents.

On another matter, the council

announced that it had sent letters to 53 schools in Ampang Jaya to implement dengue prevention methods in view of the school holidays.

"They have been reminded to ensure that any water reservoirs are closed or cleaned up," said the council president.

There were 1,499 cases reported from Jan 1 until May 25, with four deaths.

During the same period, 26 dengue hotspots were recorded.

About 92 dengue prevention programmes were also conducted, including *gotong-royong* sessions, talks and exhibitions.

Zooming in on illegal dumping in Shah Alam

ILLEGAL dumping offenders, beware! There will be eyes on you as Shah Alam City Council (MBSA) intends to instal CCTV cameras at numerous hotspots.

MBSA revealed their plans to the councillors during their full board meeting yesterday, to set the project in motion.

The CCTV cameras will be placed at strategic locations to catch the perpetrators in action.

MBSA Corporate Communications head Shahrin Ahmad later told *StarMetro* that the idea was to use the video as evidence to charge the suspects in court.

"The Public Cleansing Department has identified several locations including one in Jalan Bukit Kemuning.

"The locations are hotspots that need constant monitoring," he elaborated.

He said although their contractors cleared the site immediately after a complaint was lodged, the culprits' lorries would make their way there again in the afternoon.

"We cannot station our enforcement officers there indefinitely, so these cameras will enable us to monitor the sites and not waste resources at the same time," he added.

The cameras will boost security and safety, to assist the council and the police to reduce crime rates.

MBSA has identified 17 locations to instal the CCTV cameras that will be solar or battery operated.

The footage will be monitored at the CCTV command centre in Wisma MBSA. The cameras will be put up this year.

During the full board meeting, councillor Tan Ah Kow suggested that the council create an easy coding system for trees on main roads to help people complain in the event of a fallen tree.

He said he had noticed that the trees in Kuala Kangsar had been marked by Ipoh City Council to help people identify trees when lodging complaints.

"It is hard to give a landmark for a fallen tree or a broken branch especially if it is a long street with-

out landmarks.

"If we can identify and mark the tree with a simple plastic covering, we will be able to process the complaints quicker," he added.

The idea was commended by Shah Alam mayor Datuk Ahmad Zaharin Mohd Saad, who agreed to look into Tan's suggestion.

Once again this month, the board meeting was not short on complaints regarding garden waste left by contractors.

Councillors highlighted that remnants of fallen trees or branches after a thunderstorm were left to rot where they fell, until a complaint was lodged.

The Public Cleansing Department and the Landscape Department said they would look into the matter.

Selangor govt graft claims will widen rift in PKR

RAFIZI'S REPORT: It will affect Pakatan's chances in by-elections, says analyst

PKR vice-president Rafizi Ramli's graft allegations against the Selangor government will not only weaken the PKR-led administration, but also create a wider rift in the party leadership, political analysts said yesterday.

They said Rafizi's move in lodging a report on alleged graft in the Selangor government to the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) was a telltale sign of an ongoing internal conflict in PKR.

"It is widely known that there is a power struggle between several factions in PKR. Power struggles are common in every party, but can have devastating effects if left unmanaged," said analyst Associate Professor Dr Mohd Azizuddin Mohd Sani from Universiti Utara Malaysia.

He, however, said Rafizi was right to lodge a report as any claim of wrongdoing by the Selangor government, led by menteri besar and PKR deputy president Datuk Seri Azmin Ali, should be verified.

Another analyst, Professor Dr Sivamurugan Pandian from Universiti Sains Malaysia, said there was a move to strengthen PKR president Datuk Seri Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail's influence in the party.

"But, at the same time, Azmin feels it is time to move beyond playing second fiddle. If the internal bickering continues, PKR will be weakened as they have to contend with widespread factionalism."

Tasmania University's Asia Institute director Professor Dr James Chin said Rafizi's allegations against the Selangor government was a sign of the deteriorating relationship between PKR's opposing camps.

"We are seeing disagreements on how to accommodate Pas (in the Selangor administration) and how to strategise for the next general election. Azmin and Rafizi have different ideas on these issues."

He said a weakened PKR could prove advantageous for Barisan Nasional (BN) in the coming Sungai Besar and Kuala Kangsar by-elections.

"(Rafizi's MACC report) is a big distraction as the voters do not want to see a divided opposition. (Former opposition leader) Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim must come out and resolve this issue."

Universiti Putra Malaysia's Professor Dr Zaid Ahmad echoed Chin's sentiments, saying Rafizi's MACC report was a signal that "all is not well in the party".

"This will certainly affect Pakatan Harapan's chances in the coming by-elections. With Anwar in jail, it won't be easy for the opposition to stay united," he said.

In **Shah Alam**, Umno Supreme Council member Datuk Nur Jazlan Mohamed said Pakatan Harapan should forget about forming the Federal Government.

He said this was because Pakatan Harapan could not manage itself as its allies were not able to get along and the situation was compounded by the latest graft allegations against the PKR-led administration.

Nur Jazlan described the graft allegations against the Selangor government by Rafizi as a "fight" between Anwar's family and Azmin.

Nur Jazlan said the crisis showed that Pakatan Harapan was "hopeless" and their infighting could lead to instability in the state govern-

ment.

"Before it was Pakatan Rakyat, now it's Pakatan Harapan. Very soon (it will be) Pakatan *tidak ada harapan* (Pakatan has no hope) or Pakatan *tak boleh harap* (Pakatan cannot be depended on).

"They try to deceive the public by saying they are a *pakatan* (a pact), but in reality, they cannot get along. DAP couldn't get along with Pas. Now, PKR is basically Anwar's family against the rest.

"So, how can they *pakat* (work together)?" said Nur Jazlan after launching the Security Services Association of Malaysia's 24th annual general meeting here yesterday.

Nur Jazlan, who is also deputy home minister, said he hoped the infighting between Pakatan Harapan parties would let the rakyat rethink if they really wanted the pact as their state or Federal Government representatives.

"The opposition's split has given this perfect opportunity. I hope people can see the alternative they were talking about, which cannot even form a government, not even in Selangor. Forget about forming a government at the national level," Nur Jazlan said.

Nur Jazlan said BN would take advantage of Pakatan Harapan's weak stand in Selangor and strengthen themselves with the help of component parties in the state.

"This is the breather that we need to basically strengthen BN.

"We have to help our component parties, like MIC, MCA and Gerakan, get back on their feet and contribute in a way that they used to," he said.



KL emerge champs in second leg

KUALA Lumpur beat Johor in a penalty shoot-out to emerge champions in the second leg of the MBSA-NSC five-a-side blind football national circuit recently.

Held at the Cruyff Court in Brickfields, Kuala Lumpur, the event was organised by the National Sports Council and Malaysian Blind Sports Association and supported by Columbia Asia.

Eight teams — Sabah, Kelantan, Penang, Selangor, Kuala Lumpur (represented by Gurney Training Centre), Selangor (represented by SM Pendidikan Khas Setapak) and two teams from Johor — competed.

Each team combined two national team players with new players with the seniors guiding their young counterparts in the two-day event.

Kuala Lumpur received RM1,000 for emerging champions while Johor earned RM750. Sabah went home with RM500 for finishing third.

“The teams’ performances were evenly matched,” said Sunny Salesh, head coach of the national blind football team.

“Based on the matches, six new players were selected and will start training with the national squad.”

All the local blind football circuits have the support of Columbia Asia.

The national team’s mission is to retain their gold medal from last year’s Asean Para Games in Singapore. The next Asean Para Games will be held in Malaysia in 2017. “Besides that, we are aiming to qualify for the Blind Football World Cup in 2018,” said Sunny.

Private healthcare company Columbia Asia has been involved in the development of national blind football since 2013.

Its mission is to identify new talents and create opportunities for the players to take their game to the next level.

适耕庄31日讯 | 以「鱼米之乡」著称的适耕庄看似发展缓慢的小镇，惟随著近年来旅游业的大力推动，加上当地严缺发展土地，屋价已高涨至与莎阿南和巴生同一水平，如双层排屋市价高达40至50万令吉！

适耕庄州议员黄瑞林接受《东方日报》访问时指出，适耕庄如今堪称寸地黄金，3层的店屋要价百万令吉、双层排屋40至50万之间，就连海口渔村的房屋也能卖到数十万令吉。

他补充，就连河岸旁的海口渔村土地也能卖到数十万令吉，因为许多人以靠近海口的地理优势，用以兴建独立式度假屋或民宿。该地区的地段，也适合兴建这类的房产。

「新村人口外移是全国趋势，过去适耕庄也面对同样问题，但最近5年适耕庄的生态旅游做得越来越好，因此很多年轻人回流创业，从酒店、民宿、餐馆到土产店，进一步带动当地产业发展。」

他笑言，适耕庄的蓬勃发展也看在国外连锁快餐店「汉堡王」的眼里，并于2个月前在适耕庄开设分店，这可是从巴生加埔

巴生31日讯 | 巴生市议会致力打击无牌售酒活动，今年截至5月共检举10间售酒商店，充公共计1124瓶各类烈酒。

巴生市议会主席拿督莫哈末雅希表示，市议会日前展开取缔行动，由执法组率队突击被列为「酒鬼」聚集的焦点区域。他说，市议会在该项行动中，共取缔武吉丁宜2间商店和迷你商店，首间商店充公159瓶烈酒，第2间迷你商店则充公80瓶。「该间迷你商店拥有市议会批发的营业执照，但没有售酒牌。」

他说，市议会向2家业者发出罚单及一个月申请酒牌的期限，以使能赎回被充公的烈酒。他并指，根据地方政府条例，抵触条例者将面对被罚款1000令吉，一旦罪成，最高罚款不超过2000令吉。
