# Thieves break into PJ market again

## Traders lament lack of security as they face increased losses due to MCO

A FEW traders at Pasar Besar Jalan Othman in Petaling Jaya received a rude shock after finding their stalls ransacked and looted.

This was also the second blow for two traders, whose stalls were previously broken into after the enhanced movement control order (MCO) was enforced in Petaling Jaya Old Town from May 10 to 21.

Tea stall operator Mahendran G. Krishnan, 64, said his stall's stainless steel storage compartment was prised open and his goods stolen when he checked his stall yesterday morning.

He had lodged a police report on May 19 after his stall was ransacked the first time.

He said this time, the thieves stole his gas tank and provisions. "They stole essential things like Milo and sugar.

"I estimate the cost of damage to my stall at more than RM1,000.

"We are not rich people. Who is going to compensate me?" asked Mahendran who has been operating there for 15 years.

Jalan Othman market association



vice-president Raja Ratnam, who was at the site yesterday, said the Petaling Jaya City Council (MBPJ) Hawker Bylaw 2007 stated that traders were not allowed to instal any structure including closed-circuit television cameras at their stalls.

"There are no security guards here. MBPJ has to respond to this issue," said Raja.

He added that thieves had taken advantage of the situation when the market was closed and sealed off during the enhanced MCO.

Brothers Sithique Hassan Liyakath Ali, 24, and Jamil Liyakath Ali, 32, who run a beverage stall at the market, were also victims of a break-in for the second time.

On May 13, Sithique lodged a police report that their refrigerator was smashed and some contents were stolen.

"My brother sent me the photos

and because the area was in lockdown. I could not go to the market to check what happened," he said.

Yesterday, their stainless steel stall was also prised open and contents such as cigarettes and coins were stolen.

Flower seller Caroline Harolhadan, who has been trading at the market for 27 years, said she had not heard of break-in incidents at the market.

MBPJ could not be reached for comments at press time.

Meanwhile, Malaysians who have lost their means of income amid the Covid-19 pandemic, turned up to fill in job application forms to work at the market.

Among them were S. Nageswaran, 35, R. Logeswary, 33, T. Sures, 35, and R. Mallita, 60.

Nageswaran lost his job in the banking sector two months ago, while Logeswary, Sures and Mallita lost their jobs as salesperson, cook and senior citizen caregiver, respectively.

"Times are very hard for us. We have had no income for three months.

"We cannot just sit at home and do nothing, so why not try working

at the market to earn some money?"

"Since they are urging Malaysians to do the job, this is our only option to stay afloat," said Nageswaran.

Sarawakians Reagan Anjang, 37, and Semorata Endan, 47, lost their jobs in the hotel sector and also turned up to apply for jobs at the wet market.

"The salary is better than nothing," said Reagan.

On June 1, *StarMetro* reported that there were 1,000 job vacancies for Malaysians to take up at the wet market with an average salary of around RM2,000 a month.

The daily wage is between RM70 and RM80.

## Few takers for Hari Raya Haji livestock

**PETALING JAYA:** Demand for cattle and goats for ritual sacrifice during the upcoming Hari Raya Haji has dropped drastically, leaving some suppliers in a quandary.

Muhamad Taufiq Abu Bakar, 30, from Masjid Tanah, Melaka, says sales have been very slow this year although he is ready to take orders.

"I usually get orders for between 45 and 50 heads of cattle and no fewer than 25 goats.

"But this year, I got orders for only 10 heads of cattle and not even one goat," he said yesterday.

Muhamad Taufiq, who has a herd of about 400 goats, is now worried about being unable to sell his livestock.

"Though the celebration is allowed under the recovery movement control order, many are still afraid due to a lack of clear guidelines.

"Many will surely want to come if there is a kenduri, but they are scared of the virus and being fined for attending a large gathering," he said.

Supplier Muhammad Hafis Selamat, 37, said cattle and goats could be readily sourced from Perlis and Johor but demand had dropped.

"Last year, I sold about 100 cows and 70 goats. However, I have not gotten even a single order this year," he said.

"Besides fear of contracting Covid-19, some families are being more thrifty.

"They may not want to spend a lot on celebrations this year because they may need money for more important things."

Muhammad Hafis, from Kuala Selangor, is now forced to supply fruits instead of livestock to survive.

Firdaous Fadzil, 32, Pendang, Kedah, said his family would not order a whole cow for the ceremony but instead share the cost for one animal with several other families.

"The ceremony is usually done through the mosque with the community gathering later to portion out the meat," he said.

Shaukani Abbas, 63, from Kampung Lapan, Melaka, also said that families would not be able to afford a whole cow or goat and would likely share the cost with others.

"The ceremony is usually done through the village surau or mosque but so far no guidelines have been given," he said.

Shaukani said many may continue to shun large gatherings such as kenduri due to Covid-19 fears.

**PETALING JAYA:** The Malaysia Budget Hotel Association has seen more than half of its members wiped out by the Covid-19 pandemic, but is optimistic that the recent incentives announced by the government will spur the hotel sector.

Association national deputy president Sri Ganesh Michiel said the government's Short-Term Economic Recovery plan, announced last week, will provide much assistance for both the business operators and the employees in the tourism and hotel industry, which was the first to be affected by the Covid-19 crisis.

"The hotel industry was hit hard with businesses earning zero revenue, as there was still a need for restrictions to be in place to prevent the spread of Covid-19.

"About 60% of our members have closed their doors, with no direction of how and what is the future of the industry," he said in a statement.

Ganesh noted that the hotel and tourism sector has been allocated RM1bil under the Short-Term Economic Recovery plan.

## Govt incentives seen spurring hotel sector

"We were also informed that the request by our association to have a Covid-19 Act is now agreeable by the government and will be tabled in Parliament at its next sitting next month.

"We hope to see the major issues faced by our members being well protected in the future."

Meanwhile, Malaysian Association of Hotels (MAH) chief executive officer Yap Lip Seng said the announcement of the recovery movement control order (RMCO) was significant for the tourism industry, as it signalled the beginning of the recovery of domestic tourism – the lifeline of the industry in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic.

"Tourism stakeholders had long prepared for this day to come, particularly the hotel industry with its very own guidelines to ensure a clean and safe stay for tourists and guests alike," he said in a statement.

Citing a survey, Yap said hoteliers are expecting a "slow but consistent pick-up" of onward demand or hotel bookings in the coming months.

"Overall, hotels responded with demand recorded for quarter three and four of 2020, indicating people's need to travel and that they had taken advantage of promotions and packages hotels had likely introduced in advance.

"Steady demand is also seen for 2021, signalling confidence in recovery and the new norm as part of travel."

Specifically, Yap said Kedah (mainland), Perak, Johor, Pahang and Kelantan are expecting short-term or immediate bookings, while Langkawi and Negri Sembilan are looking at year-end increased interest.

"Terengganu, Selangor, Kuala Lumpur and Sarawak on the other hand saw bookings recorded consistently for quarter three and four later this year, while Penang, Melaka and Sabah are looking at steady demand growth till quarter one of 2021.

"With the announcement of the RMCO, the industry should be expecting a pick-up in not only leisure travel but also business travellers."

According to Yap, although hotels in gener-

al are investing and spending more in compliance with the standard operating procedure (SOP), he said the public will not be expecting increased cost of hotel stays, with many offering attractive packages and promotions for bookings made directly from the hotels' websites.

"With the industry moving into the first stage of recovery (domestic tourism), we need to plan ahead for the next and that is the international inbound market when the borders are opened and eased.

"This will involve concerted efforts to market and promote Malaysia by both the private sector and the government, hand-in-hand," Yap said.

The RMCO is part of the country's "soft landing" approach to an eventual exit strategy, of the movement control order that was imposed on March 18.

Under the RMCO, which takes effect from June 10 until Aug 31, more restrictions will be relaxed to allow the public to carry out their daily activities while complying with the SOP.

## Good things happen when civic consciousness prevails

**RESIDENTS'** associations swung into action when they felt compelled to act on a situation in their area. Such acts of collective responsibility, especially in times of crisis, speak volumes of their civic consciousness and social maturity.

A day before the Jalan Othman wet market in PJ Old Town was scheduled to reopen on June 6, a multi-disciplinary panel of experts from the area took it upon itself to assess

whether it is ready or safe for the market to reopen.

Calling itself MyPJ, the panel consists of doctors, lawyers and a criminologist among other professionals in various fields of relevance.

It is without a doubt that the conditions at the wet market were deplorable despite a massive clean-up by the authorities. The 46-year-old wet market doesn't meet current hygiene and safety standards.

Much to the panellists' horror, the severely dilapidated infrastructure

itself prevented an effective cleaning or disinfection as broken tiles and flooring cover over 80% of the wall and floor surface.

They also found that hand-washing sinks and washing facilities were sparse and not strategically placed.

The stalls were too close to each other to enable effective social distancing, giving rise to fear of fresh Covid-19 infections at the market.

While we understand the need for the operators at the market to resume trading, the risk of a recurrence in

infections weighs heavily on the traders earning their keep at that old and unsafe market.

The authorities need to ensure the market is renovated or even rebuilt according to specifications of the Health Department of the Petaling Jaya City Council.

While that is being done, a temporary site with a pre-fabricated structures could be set up for the traders to operate.

As these concerns were raised, the traders themselves ran into another problem as they no longer have the

cheap foreign labour they depended on to assist them.

Jalan Othman Market Association vice-president Raja Ratnam was reported as saying most of their foreign workers were recently detained by the Immigration Department.

This void has opened up 1,000 jobs for Malaysians with a possibility of earning up to RM2,000 a month.

Whether the locals like it or not, the luxury of choice may be a thing of the past if current jobs continue to be cut as businesses try to stay afloat.

It also partners with the state governments of Selangor, Kedah, Perak, Terengganu and Penang in their healthcare initiatives.

Co-founder and managing director Maran Virumandi (*pix*) said that prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, its revenue had been growing at a month-on-month average of 26% from January 2019 until January 2020.

"We were growing fast but our numbers almost tripled over the last few months because there's a huge need to buy medications and consult doctors through the platform during the MCO period. As people use our services, they realise it's a lot more convenient and cheaper," he told *SunBiz* in an interview recently.

Since March 2020, its platform has had a fivefold increase in the number of patients seeking telehealth. He said the platform is seeing "thousands" of transactions daily during the MCO from various health consultations (via private chat, phone or video call), with medication-related issues and purchases being the most popular.



Noting an 80% drop in patient attendance in physical clinics and hospitals as the public avoided the risk of Covid-19 infection, Maran said medication delivery service increased seven times and that the MCO has served as an enabler to telehealth digital adoption.

Post Covid-19, DoctorOnCall expects growth to come from wider market acceptance leading to increased demand, where it will be able to monetise assets, enrich offerings and lower costs.

"As we grow rapidly, the idea is to be a complete end-to-end healthcare

ecosystem. We want to become the MEPS of healthcare," said Maran, referring to the Malaysian Electronic Payment System, an interbank network.

He said DoctorOnCall is the only player providing digital healthcare across insurance, pharmacy and hospitals, both in the private and public sectors. He added that it has the widest range of service and is the clear digital healthcare leader in Malaysia commanding an 89% web traffic share.

DoctorOnCall receives over 5 million monthly web visits, over 3.8 million monthly active visitors, and over 100,000 consultations to date. Its network spans over 100 general practice doctors throughout Malaysia, over 1,500 specialists in private hospitals and over 200 pharmacies.

Maran explained that people above 60 who suffer from chronic conditions such as heart problems, diabetes, hypertension, respiratory issues and knee pain go to clinics often.

"These patients are in need of affordable healthcare so they come to our platform," said Maran, explaining that their children would book the appointment for their parents and buy medications for them via its platform.

Maran said Covid-19 has changed healthcare and DoctorOnCall is now an essential mainstream service. Its staff have been working from the office on a rotation basis, as well as working from home during the MCO.

DoctorOnCall has two models, which are pay-per-use and subscription. The subscription model allows members of insurers, corporates and government to use the platform for free. It currently has 200,000 subscriptions and is aiming for 1 million subscriptions by year-end.

Maran said it currently employs 60 staff, mainly the medical and pharmacy team and technology team based in Kuala Lumpur and Bangalore, India. It plans to double the size of its workforce by the end of the year.



# Hotels ready for guests

► But other players in hospitality industry seeking more govt aid

**PETALING JAYA:** Hoteliers are readying their premises for an expected increase in bookings as restrictions on domestic travel eases.

However, other players in the hospitality industry want more assistance from the government to help them get back on their feet.

Malaysian Association of Hotels (MAH) chief executive officer Yap Ling Seng said from as early as May, the stakeholders had already prepared their own guidelines to ensure a clean and safe stay for guests.

The guidelines to help hotels operate in the new normal, completed with all the standard operating procedures (SOPs), was made available on May 1. It is benchmarked against the Health Ministry's requirements.

"We are ready to receive and serve guests," Yap said in a recent statement. "The SOPs have been part and parcel of our operations anyway."

He said a recent survey showed that of the 402 hotels that responded, 96% have adopted the SOPs to ensure safety, health and hygiene in their premises.

He said the survey also showed a "slow but consistent" pick-up in onward demand for hotel bookings in

the coming months.

Yap sees a demand for rooms in the second half of the year, indicating that people are taking advantage of various promotions and packages that hotels have introduced in advance.

"A steady demand is also expected in 2021, signalling confidence that a recovery in the new norm is expected," he added.

Mainland Kedah, Perak, Johor and Kelantan are expecting short-term or immediate bookings while Langkawi and Negri Sembilan see increased interest at year-end, Yap said.

He said there has been consistent advance bookings for the third and fourth quarters in Terengganu, Selangor, Kuala Lumpur and Sarawak while Penang, Malacca and Sabah expect demand to grow until the first quarter of next year.

"With the industry moving into the first stage of the recovery plan, we must plan ahead for the arrival of foreign tourists when borders are opened. This will involve a concerted effort to market and promote Malaysia by the private sector and the government," he added.

Data from the Department of Statistics shows that in 2018, there were 221.3 million domestic tourists who made 302.4 million trips and spent RM92.6 billion.

The money was spent on shopping (37.6%), fuel (14.7%), food and beverage (13.8%), visited households (10.6%), accommodation (8.5%), transport (6.2%), other activities (5.3%) and before the trip, packages, entrance fees and tickets (3.2%).

The main recipients were retailers, petrol stations, food and drink outlets, family members, hotels and private accommodations, airlines, trains, bus and taxi operators including e-hailing drivers, theme parks, tourist attractions and domestic tour operators.

On Sunday, Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin said businesses in the tourism industry, such as travel agencies, hotels and airlines, will be given an extension on the period for deferment of payment of tax instalments.

However, the Malaysian Travel Agency Association (Mata) said banks and government agencies are still reluctant to ease loan restrictions because they fear the travel industry is "risky", despite the stimulus packages offered by the government.

Mata president Datuk Mohd Khalid Harun wants the Tourism, Arts and Culture Ministry to intervene and help tour agencies get back on their feet.

Tour bus owner S. Jayakumar said he has lost more than RM200,000 in revenue in the past four months.

"At the same time, I still have to pay the insurance for my 10 buses, which comes up to RM20,000 a month," he said.

He said he has seen major disasters in his life but this could be the worst. "Even after Sept 11 (in reference to the Sept 11, 2001 terrorist attacks on the United States), we were still able to keep our business running at 80%," he said.

However, he added, there is practically no revenue now.



## 復業保持社交距離 早夜市攤位將減半

(吉隆坡8日訊)雪州大部分早夜市攤位很多，一旦恢復開業料攤位將每日減半甚至三分之二，並以輪流的模式開檔營業，以保持社交距離和保障人的安全，避免重開不久後被令關閉的情況發生！

中央政府已為全國的早夜市小販開綠燈，並允許在本月15日重新開業，而各地方政府也已著手準備標準作業程序，其中吉隆坡市政局也提請雪州內的早夜市小販提早申請，因吉隆坡的早夜市在經過審核後分階段恢復營業。

距離早夜市可恢復營業的日期尚有一周，雪州大臣拿督斯里阿末魯丁將在周二或三，召各地方政府主席，以探討最終的指南宣布州內的早夜市恢復營業。

### 減低傳染風險

掌管雪州地方政府、公共交通和新村發展事務的行政議員黃思謙接受《中國報》記者專訪時指出，州府其實已有和各地方政府召開會議討論早夜市恢復的事宜，各地方政府都在進行初步的調整工作。

他說，其中最大的可能性就是雪州的早夜市的營業攤位將會減半或三分之二，每日約會有50%的小販營業。

他坦言，讓早夜市小販重新開業就已表明了會配合“新常態”以新模式營業。

### 人流管控難度大

黃思謙也承認，即使早夜市小販會有新的營業模式，不過挑戰最大的就是人流管控，因此希望到訪早夜市的居民也給予配合和適應“新常態”的模式。

他指出，限制早夜市只能1個出口和1個進口的確是巨大挑戰，尤其是露天模式的市集是難以實行。

他說，即使難度很大，最重要是大家都可給予配合和抱著互相幫忙的心態。

“要知道，早夜市重新開放，除了讓小販們可重新開業，也是方便附近的居民購物，如果大家都不配合，早夜市就會隨時關閉，屆時就會影響小販和居民本身。”

此外，黃思謙也指出，早夜市小販公會和代表也可向當地的地方政府和市民提呈建議，最重要是相關建議是遵守標準作業程序。

“雪州政府主要都是提出基本的標準作業程序，各地方政府也是歡迎小販們提供的建議來做出調整，提出適合各地小販的營業模式”



因此是沒有完美和滿足所有人的解決方案，至少讓已多個月沒有經濟收入的早夜市小販可重返市場。

他強調，早夜市一直以來都是人潮擁擠和熱鬧的現象，不過如此場景是會再發生，攤位數量是必須減少，因為為了減低擁擠度和符合社交距離的標準，這也是保障所有人的安全和減低感染病毒風險。

“雪州大部分的早夜市攤位數量必須減半，甚至是三分之二，但也有一些地區的小販因為數不多就可100%繼續營業，各地方政

府必須根據早夜市的地理環境做出衡量。”

黃思謙指出，一些大型的早夜市因有超過300名小販，減少的攤位數量就是三分之二，因當地的環境不適合容納大量的小販。

### 巴刹或移師至合適地點

黃思謙指出，在初步的討論中，在每日營業的攤位減半的情況，所有小販必須分組以在不同的日期營業，包括一些小販是在二、四和六，另一些小販是在三和五和周日。

他說，一些巴刹也不排除必須移師至合適的地方營業，因一些巴刹是在路旁營業，惟因不適合而會遷入空地營業，一切均需交由地方政府調整。

“這是一些地方政府的建議，若要容納所有小販，只能將小販們安頓在空地，這就可有效控制人流。”

他指出，無論如何，一旦雪州政府宣布了指南讓早夜市小

販如期營業後，各地方政府都會聯繫各區的早夜市小販。

他指出，各地方政府的準備功夫是非常多，尤其一些地方的早夜市數量龐大，其中的加彭市議會管轄範圍內就有超過60個夜市，而沙白安南更有一個夜市是有超過500個攤位，所以需時做出調整。

詢及夜市小販每周只在一個地點營業一次，若也採取輪流的模式營業，是否對他們有欠公平，黃思謙強調，夜市小販是屬於較流動性的小販，他們不可能只待在同一個地點營業，因此必須和相關的地方政府調整。

### 人手不足只能突檢

雪州各地方政府執法組已面對人手不足的困境，因此無法前往所有早夜市站崗駐守，眾人也絕對不能抱著僥倖的心態而試圖不遵守標準作業程序(SOP)！

黃思謙指出，雪州的早夜市是非常多，現有的執法組人員也必須前往各地巡邏執法和監督，完全不可能都調派人手在早夜市駐守。

“我們只能採取突擊檢查，或者調動其他部門的官員協助監督。”

他指出，居民也不能因早夜市沒有執法組人員就抱著僥倖的態度，因這是涉及眾人的安全。

他說，一旦早夜市恢復營業，到訪的人都必須掃描SELangkah系統登記，若有確診案例都可及時通知當天到訪者。詢及小販有反映即使會要求到訪者登記，不過因小販和所聘請的志願警員沒有權利強制要求所有到訪者都必須進行登記，他也坦承小販的難處，因此顧客群必須配合。

他指出, 在今日新增的7宗确诊病列中, 2宗是境外输入病列, 5宗是社区感染病列, 涉及

的患者全是大马公民。

### 沒死亡病例

他说, 在上述5宗社区感染病列中, 其中2宗来自雪邦, 患者皆是第8294名确诊患者的密切接触者, 各1宗分别来自武吉加里尔移民局扣留营的移民局官员、8个月大女嬰在里卡士妇幼医院进行手术前的筛查病列以及来自亚庇的社区筛查病列。

他指出, 至今仍在留医的患者有1518人, 而目前有6名患者在加护病房接受治疗, 当中1人需要呼吸辅助器。

诺希山指出, 国内今日没有新增新冠肺炎死亡病列, 累计死亡病列维持117宗, 占总病列1.4%。

## 1月至今4萬8584蚊症

诺希山指出, 今年1月至6月6日期间, 国内共有4万8584宗骨痛热症病例, 相比2019年同期的5万4524宗病例, 下跌了11%。

他说, 骨痛热症病例下跌的情况, 也同样发生在大多数的东协国家。

“然而, 自6个星期前, 国内的骨痛热症病例开始持续呈上升趋势, 每周平均增长8%。”

他指出, 相比2019年同期的83宗骨痛热症的死亡病例, 今年同期则出现84宗死亡病例。

“根据今年这84宗死亡病例的初步调查显示, 11%的病例患者是延误就诊的, 即在开始出现症状后的3天才求医。”

诺希山指出, 根据5年来的骨痛热症病例趋势, 卫生部预计从本月初至9月, 国内将发生骨痛热症病例上升的第二波趋势。

### 更多商業領域重啓

他提醒, 基于复苏期行动管制令从本月10日开始实施, 有更多的经济、社会、教育、宗教和商业领域即将重启, 这大多数地方此前关闭已久且没有人流, 因此有成为蚊子繁殖地方的风险。

“若我们能同意有关标准作业程序, 如当要进行检测时, 是否可在来源国进行检测等, 因此我们需探讨许多事, 需详谈方能落实有关概念。”

他说, 上述“绿色保护罩”概念仅限于符合标准的特定国家, 若两国之间能在落实标准作业程序方面达成共识, 或就能实现有关概念。

“因此, 此事仍处于和特定国家的商讨阶段。”

诺希山指出, 若我国在复苏期行动管制令期间可成功控制疫情, 如单日通报的病列维持在单位数直至8月31日, 那我国就会考虑放宽边境管制。

“我们会鉴定各国的新冠肺炎疫情情况, 并鉴定我们可否和有关国家建立‘绿色保护罩’概念。”

### 陈凌璋: 运动器材使用后消毒

Inspire Fitness Studio业主陈凌璋接受星洲日报电访时说, 他们准备了消毒喷雾, 顾客在使用完运动器材后会进行消毒。

“我们顾客群光顾的时间分为2个主要时段, 早上至中午的时段以及傍晚时

段, 所以中午和关店前我们都会各消毒一次。”

他表示, 健身房也会规定所有顾客必须携带自身的擦汗毛巾还有水瓶。

他说, 他们也会遵守政府所规定的标准作业程序, 包括顾客必须使用MySejahtera 或雪州政府推出的SELangkah 出入记录系统进行扫描, 同时也会为顾客准备消毒搓手液。

他透露, 健身房有两间店面, 空间较大, 不过还是会规定同一时段允许约10至15人在同一个空间活动。

至于健身教练能不能从旁进行指导, 陈凌璋解释, 健身教练一般都是看学员锻炼时的姿势是否正确, 不对的话再示范, 还是会与学员保持距离, 并不会有直接的接触, 因此可以放心。

### 楊忠源: 待政府公布詳細SOP

YTP Sport Arena管理员杨忠源表示, 虽然已陆续收到一些会员的询问, 不过他们不会贸然开放, 仍会待政府公布更详细的标准作业程序后再开放。

他说, 他们室内共有18个羽球场, 若开放会全数开放, 因此会确保遵照政府的

标准作业程序, 处理妥当后才接受预约。

他表示, 羽球场一定会规定所有人做好基本的安全措施, 像是使用消毒搓手液, 休息区的椅子座位必须间隔以及入内运动的人都必须登记姓名及电话。

### 須適應新常態

配合复悠期行管令即将到来，民众是时候踏出户外，以新常态方式进行国内旅游，投入大自然怀抱。

### 黄瑞林：旅游业如「重见曙光」

适禧庄旅游协会会长黄瑞林受访时表示，本地旅游活动获得批准，让旅游相关业者“重见曙光”。

他说，虽然在有条件行管令下，还是有些州内游客到访适禧庄，不过人数不多，直到这3天的连假才出现人潮。

“民众在现阶段还是不被允许出国旅行，但因已待在家里超过3个月，所以会出来透透气，消解郁闷的心情和压力。”

也是雪州议员的黄瑞林欢迎外州旅客考虑前来适禧庄，适禧庄主打“鱼米之乡”观光号召，旅游景点都以户外为主，只要民众做好防疫措施并保持社交距离，就能降低感染病毒的风险。

**諾希山：防黑斑蚊滋生 復工前須清理環境**

（布城8日訊）衛生總監拿督諾希山要求各領域行業在復工前，務必清理關閉多時的場合，尤其得封鎖所有可能讓黑斑蚊滋生的環境，以免這些場合在重新開放後，成為散播骨痛熱症的地方。

他今日在衛生部召開的新聞發布會上說，今年截至6月6日，國內便發生4萬8884宗骨痛熱症，比去年同期的5萬4524宗減少11%。然而，過去6周的病例却有持續增加趨勢，每周平均增加8%。

他指出，今年至今已有84人因感染骨痛熱症而死亡，去年同期只有83宗病例。

他表示，根據84宗病例調查，衛生部發現其中有11%病患在出現症狀的3天後才接受治療，因延誤治療而死。

**新常態措施防蚊 每週一次展開清潔工作**

諾希山指出，公眾必須根據新常態採取預防措施，防止骨痛熱症在社區內蔓延，其中包括業主必須每周进行一次室内和室外的清洁工作，长期没有人使用的房间，必须在使用的第一天喷上气溶胶（aerosol）。

其它措施包括必须在水箱、水缸、马桶以及任何积水的地方喷洒杀虫剂，在进行此类清洁活动时，必须保持社交距离和个人卫生意识。

他表示，公众必须穿上覆盖全身的服装，避免被蚊子叮咬。

“任何人若出现疑似骨痛热症状，必须立即到附近的诊所寻求治疗，无论是否有条件行管令或是复工期行管令，都不应该成为转院接受治疗的理由。”

他指出，所有政府和私人医疗机构必须保持高度警惕，一旦确诊骨痛热症病例，都必须立即进行治疗或转诊进一步就医。

**1分鐘 70萬人搶下載MySejahtera**

**1公尺社距是最好疫苗**

諾希山說，在疫苗尚未面世前，人与人之间维持至少1公尺社交距离，就是最好的疫苗。

“如果以维持2公尺的距离，那是最好吧！”

他再三提醒民众务必时时刻刻都遵守各项SOP，包括勤洗手、戴口罩等，就可以阻断传染链。

**救治资源充足**

諾希山說，随着疫情趋缓，全国医院都有充足的救治资源，目前在医院接受治疗的确诊患者只占全国各医院的13%病床，以今日只有6人在加护病房里治疗，只有1人需要呼吸辅助器。

“我们有1504架呼吸辅助器，也有足够的病床，医院随时都做好准备，但在病例逐渐减少的趋势下，也依然需紧密观察疫情，检讨并监督社群的免疫能力。”

**醫院決定是否讓夫陪妻入產房**

諾希山說，衛生部交由各醫院決定是否讓丈夫陪同孕婦進入產房。

他說，在發生8個月大女嬰感染新冠病毒，衛生部決定讓所有政府醫院自行決定，是否讓丈夫陪同孕婦進入產房，以各醫院的感染SOP、產房設施與面積大小等做為考慮因素。

他說，目前仍在調查女嬰感染新冠病毒的源头。

“各醫院可以自行決定是否讓丈夫陪同，取決于醫院的環境大小與應付能力等，若空間足夠，就可以允許，若空間不足，或因疫情所致而不允許丈夫陪同進入產房，也可以坦白報告。”

他重申，由于病情一如預期有所減少，因此各診所將會陸續有不同服務時段，即早上及傍晚，并以預約方式讓病人上門，以遵守社交距離，減少群聚。

他說，其他問診方式如線上看病，上門看病等，都是正在研究的方案。
