# Penduduk hidu bau busuk setiap hari

**KUALA SELANGOR:** Sebuah tapak pembuangan sampah haram di kawasan Kampung Seri Sentosa, Ijok dekat sini seolah-olah kebal apabila terus beroperasi walaupun pernah dikenakan tindakan.

Kewujudan tapak tersebut sejak lima tahun lalu mengganggu penduduk yang menghidu bau busuk sampah dan asap setiap kali berlaku pembakaran terbuka.

Tinjauan *Utusan Malaysia* mendapati setiap hari ada lori memasuki tapak pembuangan berkeluasan empat hektar untuk membuang sampah yang tidak

diketahui isi kandungan.

Seorang penduduk, Hairul Razid Mohamad Seri, 36, berkata, masalah itu sudah beberapa kali diajukan kepada pihak berkuasa namun tidak selesai.

"Pembuangan sampah terutama dibawa lori ke kawasan ini dapat dilihat hampir setiap hari tanpa mengira waktu.

"Selain asap, bau busuk sampah itu juga menyebabkan rumah saya didatangi lalat," katanya di sini semalam.

Katanya, sisa sampah dari tapak tersebut juga adakalanya hanyut ke kawasan kediaman penduduk jika berlaku banjir

kilat.

"Perkara ini dikhuatiri akan mengalir ke Sungai Buloh yang berada berdekatan kawasan tersebut," katanya.

Dalam pada itu, Mohamad Wagiman, 71, meminta pihak berwajib serius menangani pencemaran yang memberi kesan kepada penduduk.

"Masalah tersebut sudah lama dan perlu segera diatasi kerana sampah yang dibuang juga tidak diketahui kandungannya.

"Saya cuma bimbang sekiranya ia mengandungi bahan kimia," katanya.

Sementara itu, Ahli Dewan Undangan Negeri (ADUN) Jeram, Shaid Rosli yang meninjau lokasi tersebut berkata, beliau telah membuat aduan berhubung masalah itu namun ia masih beroperasi.

"Selain Kampung Seri Sentosa, kawasan itu terletak berhampiran Bandar Seri Coalfields, Desa Coalfields dan Kampung Seri Aman.

"Saya meminta terutama Majlis Daerah Kuala Selangor (MDKS) segera mengambil tindakan terhadap individu yang mengendalikannya tapak pembuangan sampah haram tersebut," katanya.

# ***Kedai makan tanpa lesen sedia karaoke diambil tindakan***

**Petaling Jaya:** Bukan hanya menjalankan perniagaan di kaki lima, malah kedai makan yang terletak di PJS8 di sini, turut menyediakan aktiviti karaoke secara haram untuk menarik pelanggan.

Tindakan tidak bertanggungjawab pengusaha kedai makan yang beroperasi tanpa lesen sejak dua tahun itu, bagaimanapun diambil tindakan pihak berkuasa jam 10.30 malam semalam.

Serbuan hasil maklumat awam itu dilakukan sepasukan polis dari Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Petaling Jaya, Majlis Bandaraya Petaling Jaya (MBPJ), Tenaga Nasional Berhad (TNB) dan Pejabat Tanah Daerah (PTD).

Ketua Polis Daerah Petaling Jaya Asisten Komisyoner Nik Ezanee Mohd Faisal berkata, dalam operasi bersepadu itu pihaknya mena-

han pemilik premis iaitu lelaki berusia 47 tahun dan sembilan warga asing berusia antara 20 dan 47 tahun.

“Semua warga asing itu membabitkan seorang lelaki warga Algeria, enam lelaki warga Indonesia dan dua wanita Indonesia yang disyaki peniaga serta pekerja di kedai makan berkenaan. Kami turut merampas set sistem audio yang digunakan untuk hiburan itu.

“Polis juga menahan tujuh warga Indonesia yang bertindak sebagai pelanggan kerana tidak mempunyai dokumen perjalanan sah selain mengeluarkan 21 kompaun kepada pelanggan atas kesalahan ingkar Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan Pemulihan (PKPP) dengan tiada penjarakan fizikal,” katanya.

## Hidup penduduk Kampung Seri Sentosa terganggu

# Lima tahun hidu asap

**KUALA SELANGOR** – Penduduk Kampung Seri Sentosa, Ijok di sini bimbang dengan kewujudan sebuah tapak pembuangan sampah di kawasan itu yang didakwa mengganggu keselesaan mereka sejak lima tahun lalu.

Mereka mendakwa, biarpun telah diambil tindakan oleh pihak berkuasa, tempat tersebut masih beroperasi sehingga mengeluarkan bau busuk dan asap akibat aktiviti pembakaran sampah secara terbuka.

Seorang penduduk, Hairul Razid Mohamad Seri, 36, berkata, permasalahan itu telah kerap diajukan kepada pihak berwajib, namun masih berlarutan sehingga kini.

“Pembuangan sampah teruta-

ma oleh lori di kawasan itu dapat dilihat hampir setiap hari.

“Selain asap, bau busuk sampah itu menyebabkan rumah saya kadangkala turut dimasuki banyak lalat,” katanya ketika ditemui pemberita di sini semalam.

Ujarnya, sisa sampah dari tapak pembuangan itu juga akan hanyut di kawasan kediaman penduduk jika banjir kilat.

Tinjauan *Kosmo!* mendapati, beberapa lori memasuki tapak pembuangan berkeluasan empat hektar itu dipercayai untuk membuang sampah.

Seorang warga emas, Mohamad Wagiman, 71, meminta pihak berwajib memandang serius perkara tersebut kerana ia melibatkan pencemaran dan kesihatan penduduk setempat.

“Masalah itu berlarutan sejak

sekitan lama dan perlu segera diatasi kerana sampah yang dibuang tidak diketahui kandungannya,” katanya.

Sementara itu, Ahli Dewan Undangan Negeri (ADUN) Jeram, Shaid Rosli berkata, beliau juga telah membuat aduan berhubung masalah itu, namun masih berlarutan.

“Selain Kampung Seri Sentosa, kawasan itu terletak berhampiran Bandar Seri Coalfields, Desa Coalfields dan Kampung Seri Aman.

“Saya meminta pihak berwajib terutama Majlis Daerah Kuala Selangor segera mengambil tindakan tegas terhadap pihak yang bertanggungjawab mengendalikannya tapak pembuangan sampah tersebut agar kehidupan penduduk lebih selesa,” katanya.

## **Baucar pelancongan melalui e-Dompet mulai 1 Oktober ini**

**KUALA TERENGGANU** – Sebanyak 10,000 baucar subsidi pelancongan Selangor boleh didapati menerusi platform perkhidmatan e-Dompet terpilih mulai 1 Oktober ini.

Pengarah Besar Tourism Selangor, Azrul Shah Mohamad berkata, baucar yang bernilai RM200 setiap satu tersebut boleh ditebus untuk kegunaan di hotel dan inap desa berlesen serta taman tema di seluruh negeri Selangor.

“Pemberian baucar berkenaan yang bernilai keseluruhan RM2 juta itu diluluskan kerajaan negeri Selangor baru-baru ini untuk merencanakan semula industri pelancongan yang telah terjejas akibat pandemik Covid-19.

“Ia boleh didapati di platform perkhidmatan e-Dompet terpilih selepas majlis perasmian kempen ‘Pusing Selangor Dulu’ pada 1 Oktober depan,” katanya ketika ditemui pemberita selepas program Jelajah Persona Selangor ke Terengganu di sini semalam.

Azrul Shah memberitahu, Tourism Selangor berharap baucar subsidi tersebut dapat membantu sasaran kedatangan kira-kira enam juta pelan-

cong ke negeri tersebut pada tahun ini.

Menurut beliau, setakat ini 70 peratus atau 4.2 juta daripada sasaran kedatangan pelancong telah berjaya dicapai.

“Tourism Selangor sedang giat mempromosikan segmen eko pelancongan seperti Sky Mirror (Cermin Langit) di Kuala Selangor dan aktiviti rekreasi alam semula jadi yang ditawarkan di daerah Hulu Selangor, Ampang Jaya, Kuala Selangor dan Sepang.

“Selain itu, segmen pelancongan urban yang sudah sedia kukuh seperti taman tema, Sunway Lagoon dan pusat belf-belah, Sunway Pyramid tetap ditonjolkan,” katanya.

Ujarnya, selepas berkunjung ke Terengganu sebagai lokasi sulung, program Jelajah Persona Selangor akan berkunjung pula ke Pulau Pinang untuk mempromosi lokasi-lokasi pelancongan menarik yang terdapat di negeri berkenaan.

“Tourism Selangor juga telah memasang papan iklan di lima kawasan strategik di seluruh negara sebagai inisiatif untuk menarik minat lebih ramai pelancong domestik datang ke negeri itu,” katanya.

# Buruk baik aktiviti konvoi motosikal

**P**ada minggu ini, saya ingin menarik perhatian pembaca tentang sikap penunggang motosikal yang berkonvoi di lebuh raya. Kebetulan minggu lalu saya bertembung dua kemalangan membabitkan motosikal yang berkonvoi beramai-ramai sempena menyambut Hari Malaysia.

Dua nahas yang berlaku di depan mata itu berpunca daripada sikap mereka sendiri yang tidak mengikut peraturan jalan raya.

Akibat menunggang secara rapat dan memotong tanpa tujuan, ada yang terjatuh menyebabkan mereka tidak sempat mengelak atau memberhentikan motosikal.

Baru-baru ini, seorang rakan, Tok Meor merungut di Facebooknya. Katanya, kalau tak mendatangkan kebaikan yang nyata, elok haramkan sahaja aktiviti konvoi motosikal.

Alasan Tok Meor, bila sudah ramai, mereka menggila sehingga merisaukan keluarga di rumah.

"Ada yang menunggang motosikal pakai selipar. Bila berkonvoi, mereka jadi maharaja di lebuh raya. Kesemua lorong mereka sapu, berlagak macam mereka pun pembayar tol. Yang jadi marshall tu pulak boleh suruh kita ke tepi," katanya.

"Semalam di Lebuh Raya Utara-Selatan dekat Rawang, saya tengok dia orang meniarap atas motor sambil berlumba beramai-ramai. Menakutkanlah. Bayangkan kalau mereka terjatuh," komen seorang rakan pada

status Tok Meor tersebut.

Dari sudut lain, berkonvoi sebenarnya aktiviti yang sihat kerana selain mengisi masa lapang, boleh mengeratkan hubungan silaturahim.

Paling seronok dapat pergi tempat-tempat menarik atau lokasi makan-makan dengan rakan-rakan yang 'sekepala'.

Aktiviti bermotor sebenarnya boleh membantu mempopularkan tempat-tempat makan. Asal ada grup motor yang tular gambar mengenai tempat makan yang mereka kunjungi di media sosial, sudah tentu restoran itu akan popular.

Kalau nak kenal restoran itu tumpuan kaki motor atau tidak, lihat sahaja papan tanda yang disediakan untuk melekatkan sticker.

Contohnya, Mee Udang Lembah Beringin di Hulu Selangor; Nasi Bamboo Sungai Klah di Sungkai, Perak; Kopi Manshor di Paroi, Seremban atau Lemang To'ki di Bentong, Pahang.

Setiap hujung minggu pasti tempat-tempat itu penuh dengan mat motor yang datang dari seluruh pelosok negara untuk menjamu selera.

Sebenarnya banyak lagi tempat menarik yang menjadi tumpuan kaki motor seperti Sate Tulang Senawang di Seremban, Negeri Sembilan; Kari Kambing 40 Hari di Yong Peng, Johor; Ikan Bakar Parameswara dan Asam Pedas Laksamana di Melaka.

Hakikatnya, banyak aktiviti berfaedah dapat dilakukan dengan jentera dua roda itu, bukan setakat merepmit di lebuh raya.

Apabila artikel mengenai Bukit Fraser disiarkan dalam ruangan ini minggu lalu, saya dihubungi sahabat sejak di bangku sekolah, Dr Mohd

Azhar Mohamed Ali yang kini menjadi Yang Dipertua Majlis Daerah Hulu Selangor (MDHS).

Katanya, dia ingin membetulkan sedikit info dalam artikel itu. Menurut Mohd Azhar, Bukit Fraser bukan sepenuhnya di bawah pentadbiran Pahang.

Katanya, ramai yang tidak tahu fakta itu, sebab Bukit Fraser terlalu sinonim dengan Pahang berbanding Selangor.

"Sebahagian daripada pentadbiran Bukit Fraser di bawah pentadbiran MDHS. Laluan basikal yang popular bermula dari Sungai Chiling ke rumah Gap berada di bawah Selangor. Maklumat yang tepat sekurang-kurangnya membantu Selangor dalam mempromosikan pelancongan negeri ini," jelasnya.

Begitu juga Genting Highlands, katanya, ramai yang menyangka pentadbiran bukit peranginan itu sepenuhnya di bawah kerajaan Pahang.

"Sebenarnya, sebahagian di bawah MDHS iaitu sempadan Ria Apartment dan Maxxim Hotel, cuma banyak pembangunan di bawah Pahang. Ralat juga sebab semua orang ingat Pahang, sedangkan sebahagian memang di bawah pentadbiran MDHS," katanya.

Sebagai pegawai yang bertanggungjawab dalam pentadbiran MDHS, sudah tentu beliau mempunyai banyak maklumat terperinci mengenai kawasan pentadbirannya, sedangkan saya mengakui memperoleh maklumat tersebut hanya daripada internet.

Maklumat itu entah sah, entah tidak.

### Penduduk bimbang kejadian berulang

**SEPANG** - Penduduk di sekitar Desa Pinggiran Putra di sini bimbang sekiranya kejadian pokok tumbang akibat angin kuat yang menghempap rumah dan kenderaan milik mereka kelmarin berulang.

Salah seorang penduduk, Mohd Pauzi Mohamad berkata, ia berikutan fasa peralihan monsun yang dijangka bermula hari ini sehingga November depan.

Menurutnya, bagi mengelakkan insiden berkenaan berlaku, Majlis Perbandaran Sepang (MPSepang) perlu lebih kerap memotong dahan pokok yang sudah berusia.

"MPSepang ada buat (potong dahan pokok) tetapi jarang- jarang sekali," katanya ketika ditemui *Sinar Harian* di rumahnya di Desa Pinggiran Putra di sini semalam.

Menceritakan kejadian kelmarin, isteri Mohd Pauzi, Noor Hayati Suib yang juga seorang penjawat awam berkata, beliau mengetahui insiden

berlaku sekitar jam 4.40 petang selepas menerima panggilan daripada jiran memaklumkan kereta yang diparkir di hadapan rumah terangkat akibat terkena akar pokok yang tumbang.

"Hari ini (semalam) saya mengam- bil cuti untuk melihat sendiri kereta dan motosikal terlibat dialihkan oleh MPSepang sebelum dihantar ke bengkel," katanya.

Sementara itu, tinjauan *Sinar Harian* di lokasi mendapati MPSepang sedang giat melakukan kerja-kerja pembersihan dengan mengalihkan pokok tumbang di kawasan tersebut sejak 5 petang kelmarin.

Jabatan Meteorologi Malaysia (MET) dalam kenyataannya berkata, hujan lebat, petir dan angin kencang lazimnya berlaku dalam masa singkat pada fasa peralihan monsun.

Keadaan itu boleh mengakibatkan banjir kilat serta kerosakan struktur tidak kukuh.

## Terpaksa hidu bau busuk

Kira-kira 10,000 penduduk terkesan akibat sampah haram

**K**ira-kira 10,000 penduduk di empat kawasan terpaksa menghidu bau busuk akibat tindakan pihak tidak bertanggungjawab melakukan pembuangan sampah secara haram di Kampung Seri Aman dan Kampung Seri Sentosa sejak lebih tiga tahun lalu.

Ahli Dewan Undangan Negeri (ADUN) Jeram, Mohd Shaid Rosli berkata, bukan sahaja bau busuk, kewujudan kawasan pelupusan sampah haram itu turut menyebabkan penduduk terpaksa berdepan dengan kehadiran ribuan alat serta pembakaran secara terbuka.

Menurutnya, dipercayai ter-

dapat lebih 100 lori keluar masuk ke tapak pembuangan sampah haram terbabit setiap hari.

"Selain dua penempatan kampung terbabit, dua kawasan lagi turut terjejas iaitu di Desa Coalfields dan Bandar Seri Coalfields," katanya pada sidang akhbar selepas melakukan tinjauan di beberapa lokasi sampah haram di kawasan terbabit semalam.

Mohd Shaid berkata, penduduk berhampiran tapak pelupusan terbabit sering mengeluh berikutan kawasan terbabit diancam bau busuk dan kediaman mereka dihurung lalat.

"Kami difahamkan mereka membuang pelbagai sisa sampah domestik, sisa bahan binaan dan makanan di kawasan ini yang menyebabkan bau busuk kepada penduduk berhampiran.

"Sampah itu kemudian dibakar yang menyebabkan pencemaran udara, selain kita juga bimbang sampah yang dibuang

ke dalam sungai itu mengandungi sisa toksik yang boleh mencemarkan sungai berhampiran," katanya.

Mohd Shaid berkata, beliau bimbang jika masalah itu tidak ditangani segera, pelbagai masalah lain boleh berlaku di kawasan terbabit.

Katanya, isu pembuangan sampah haram itu telah dimaklumkan ke Pejabat Daerah dan Tanah Kuala Selangor serta Majlis Daerah Kuala Selangor (MDKS) untuk tindakan lanjut malah Exco Kerajaan Tempatan, Pengangkutan Awam dan Pembangunan Kampung Baru Negeri Selangor, Ng Sze Han turut turun padang melakukan lawatan ke kawasan berkenaan.

"Bagaimanapun, kegiatan ini terus berleluasa dan saya ingin bertanya kepada MDKS, sudah berapa kali tindakan kompaun dan sitaan dikeluarkan terhadap lori yang membara sampah haram ini?"

"Saya inginkan penjelasan lanjut daripada Sze Han dan MDKS berhubung isu ini kerana seolah-olah tiada tindakan diambil bagi menanganinya," katanya.

Sementara itu, seorang penduduk Kampung Seri Sentosa, Hairul Razid Mohamad Seri, 36, berkata, penduduk memberitahu rimas dengan isu pembuangan sampah haram terbabit.

Katanya, lebih mengecewakan sampah-sarap yang dibuang

berhampiran kawasan itu hanyut ke rumah penduduk setiap kali banjir melanda kampung terbabit.

"Kami tertekan kerana kediaman bukan sahaja sering dilanda banjir tetapi timbunan sampah-sarap berselerak bertaburan setiap kali banjir surut.

"Kami berharap ada tindakan sewajarnya dilakukan pihak bertanggungjawab bagi menghilangkan keresahan penduduk," katanya.

## Tempoh pengosongan PKM DUN Gombak Setia dilanjut

**GOMBAK** - Tempoh pengosongan Pusat Khidmat Masyarakat (PKM) Dewan Undangan Negeri (DUN) Gombak Setia di Taman Berjaya yang sepatutnya berakhir Ahad lalu dilanjutkan sehingga 30 September ini.

# New system for PJ high-rises

## City council's portal to streamline administration of strata properties

PETALING Jaya City Council (MBPJ) has launched a new portal called e-COB (Commissioner of Buildings) to streamline the management of matters related to strata properties within its jurisdiction.

The web-based system, expected to go live by the end of next month, will ease the recording, storage and processing of data as well as enhance the COB Unit's role in overseeing the management and maintenance of buildings administered by joint management bodies (JMB) and management corporations (MC).

COB unit director Jayanthi Kuppusamy said as of June 30, there were 1,255 development lots with 163,322 strata components under MBPJ's administration.

These include 247 lots under JMBs and 350 lots under MCs, while the rest are managed by COB-appointed agents or are under the developer.

She said the idea for the portal came about because of common problems faced by JMB/MC, including failure to hold annual general meetings, submit audited annual accounts, committee members holding their positions beyond the stated period, minutes of meeting not in file (either destroyed or missing), handover problems from the previous to new JMB/ MC committee as well as abuse of power.

"With the portal, it would be easier and more efficient to manage strata property issues, particularly in terms of monitoring

"The portal includes features such as letter formats, how to call for meetings and outlines for meeting agenda," added Jayanthi.

Petaling Jaya mayor Datuk Mohd Sayuthi Bakar, who officially launched the portal, said the system was based on the Strata Management Act 2013 (Act 757) and rules under the Act.

"A JMB/MC can now upload documents and submit scheduled paperwork such as minutes of general and committee meetings, audited annual financial reports, owners' registry and other items as required by the Act.

"All related guidelines and latest information on policies, notices and announcements related to strata matters will be posted on the website," he said, adding that

the portal would also facilitate the COB Unit's role in monitoring the functions and activities of JMBs and MCs.

Sayuthi said the e-COB portal was managed by MBPJ. The user-name and password would be issued by MBPJ to JMBs/ MCs registered with the council.

"The portal is designed for the administration and management of strata management matters, not for lodging complaints.

"There are some confidential documents in the system, so I hope web users won't abuse their access," he said.

One of the biggest challenges the city council faced, he said, was managing people and conflict, particularly disputes related to common properties in strata buildings.

"MBPJ can step in on matters related to the neighbourhood, but certain issues such as breach of trust come under the police," he said.

Sayuthi advised people living in strata buildings to be tolerant and cooperative.

"If you can't live together, your whole neighbourhood could end up suffering, such as when there are insufficient funds to maintain the common property," he said.

A series of seminars will be held in October, before the website goes live, to provide exposure and guidance to JMBs/ MCs on how to use the system.

## Klang folk welcome free bulk waste collection

Council's service to be combined with cleanliness campaigns

DISPOSING of illegally dumped bulk waste is costing Klang Municipal Council (MPC) a bomb to clear.

From January to August this year, MPC Environmental Services Department director Zairawal Ahmad Zamri said the council had to fork out RM1.2 million to clear 35.7 tonnes of bulk waste.

The annual financial payment for tipping, workers and for the use of tractors and lorries.

MPC also hopes to reduce small-scale illegal dumping of domestic waste like this along Jalan Mergukung in Taman Tokia Park, Klang.

"In August alone, the council spent RM160,000. I want people to stop this illegal dumping," the task force said.

Zairawal said unscrupulous people dump bulk waste along road stretches on an unclear plot of land.

Some go to the extent of driving out of their neighbourhood to dump bulk waste or bags of rubbish elsewhere.

Klang RBK has no more reason to dump bulk waste at unorganised areas again as MPC now provides a service to remove unwanted items that can be recycled are collected once a week, every Friday.

The collection service is combined with cleanliness awareness campaigns in neighbourhoods.

Zairawal said with Prout, no household should resort to dumping bulk items for free.

"We do not want to see bulk waste on the roadside. If people live in a high rise building, we will still do the collection and the first management body must organise the collection and inform the council," he said.

Zairawal, however, said businesses were not entitled to free bulk waste collection.

"Businesses must hire bins from MPC to dispose of bulk items or industrial waste," he said.

The Klang Prout campaign would focus on five areas offering free collection and strict enforcement namely (a)rah, (b)hatah.

Alimudin (Saudar Sultan Sulaiman), Johan Janggi Chandong (Armadus Putra in Patau Indah), Jalan Jelutau Meris (Meris), Jalan Sentosa and Bandar PPR), Jalan Klang Klang, Jalan Klang and Klang (Klang).

During these cleanliness campaigns, MPC staff would place single-lane 120-litre bins for people to dispose of their trash.

MPC hopes people in other neighbourhoods will get the bins for their areas too.

Zairawal said the campaign would save the council a lot of time and money to collect bulk waste compared to clearing illegal dumps.

Last year, the amount of bulk waste with 88 tonnes and the council spent RM1.7 million to clear it.

"In 2019, we had to fork out RM1.2 million to clear 35.7 tonnes of illegally dumped bulk waste that did not show RM1.2 million to clear."

"It is a sheer waste of taxpayers' money," he added.

**Ratepayers say**

Former spokesman Surber Singh, who lives in Taman Meris, said the best habit of illegal dumping must stop as all Klang residents deserve a clean environment to live in.

"People who want to get rid of unwanted furniture and other large items must use the council's free collection service," he said, adding that they should not complain.

"I hope MPC will install closed-circuit television cameras along Jalan Kelian Nenas in Taman Sentosa as promised," he added.

Klang resident Syed Feroz Syed Mubashir, 32, said the money spent to dispose of illegally dumped waste must be put to better use.

"Residents should utilize the free bulk waste collection fully," he said.

LORONG Tingkat, a street off Jalan Tengku Kelana in Klang's Little India, is choked with traffic during peak hours.

To improve traffic flow at one of the busiest commercial hubs in the royal town, the road will be turned into a one-way street.

Klang Municipal Council (MPK) Engineering Department director Zamri Othman said motorists and businesses in the area wanted a solution to resolve traffic congestion there.

"Our department plans to turn Lorong Tingkat into a one-way street to make it safer for motorists and pedestrians. We need to do this as the volume of vehicles is growing," he said.

Lorong Tingkat is a single carriageway. Along it are a row of shophots, walk-up flats and several houses at the end of it have been converted into limited commercial businesses.

After Zamri visited Little India to observe traffic conditions there, he told *StarMetro* that he would bring the matter to the infrastructure sub-committee meeting to endorse the plan.

"Our plan is to allow vehicles from Jalan Istana to enter Lorong Tingkat and exit to the left towards Jalan Istana which creates a loop for those wanting to re-enter Lorong Tingkat.

"Motorists who want to exit to

Jalan Tengku Kelana would have to turn right as they approach the row of flower stalls," he added.

On the issue of motorists turning left against traffic flow from Jalan Tengku Kelana into Lorong Tingkat (the 60m stretch along the flower shop), he said the council would get help from the police.

"Many drivers go the wrong way down the one-way street," Zamri added.

Shopper Kamalanathan Arumugam, 23, who welcomed the one-way street proposal for Lorong Tingkat said on weekends, the congestion was at its worst as people double-parked reducing the road to a single lane.

Haridaz Kuppam, 32, said MPK's one-way street plan must be sped up as the traffic was in a mess.

"Other than turning Lorong Tingkat into one-way, the council must have road lines painted and instal reflective road strips to guide motorists at night," he said.

# Selangor task force to address worsening baby-dumping issue

A TASK force aimed at tackling the issue of baby dumping in Selangor will soon be formed by the state government.

State health, welfare, women empowerment and family committee will form the task force with related parties, including government departments, non-governmental organisations and activists.

It will focus on finding both short and long-term solutions to the issue of baby dumping.

According to police records, there have been 12 reported cases of baby dumping last year and eight between January and August this year.

From the eight cases this year, three babies were found in Gombak, and one each in Petaling Jaya, North Klang, Shah Alam, Kajang and Kuala Langat.

"This issue of baby dumping is getting worse. Previously we used to see reports in the newspaper about babies left in dumpsters, in the toilet or by the road.

"Now, the babies are killed," said committee chairman Dr Siti Mariah Mahmud during a roundtable discussion with representatives from government departments NGOs at the state secretariat.

"As Selangor recorded the highest number of cases for baby dumping nationwide, we need to focus on the issue to save lives and reduce the number of babies being dumped," she said.

Dr Siti Mariah added that this was not an issue that could be handled by any one party or individual, as such the task would be shared by several parties.

Among the suggestions was to raise awareness among children as young as 11 as data showed that they were already sexually active.



Dr Siti Mariah says Selangor has the highest number of baby-dumping cases in the country.

"We also have to re-look current policies. For example, under Islamic law, girls who have a baby out of wedlock can be charged in court.

"Is this a solution to our problem? We need to question the policy because it all falls on the girl, and if she comes forward, she will be punished and brought to court," she said.

It is also a social taboo where parents of the girl would disown her or send her elsewhere for the duration of the pregnancy and delivery.

Segambut MP Hannah Yeoh, who was former deputy women, family and community development minister, was also present at the roundtable meeting.

"Selangor recorded the highest number of baby dumping cases and out of all the babies dumped, 65% died and only 35% survived so our focus is to save more lives," she said.

Yeoh added that awareness pro-

grammes were organised in the past, including putting up information on baby dumping at doors of toilet cubicles along the North-South Expressway.

This is because babies are mostly dumped in toilets. Other places babies are found are residential areas and dumpsites.

Yeoh suggested that the Selangor government collect detailed data of places where babies were dumped to identify the community living nearby.

"If an area comprises mostly Myanmar people, for example, then brochures should be in the mother tongue of this community," she said, adding that the government had also worked with cinemas to show a short clip on the matter to raise awareness.

She called on the state government to also work with sanitary pad manufacturers and hoped sex education would start for children as young as 12.

Yeoh also urged the child adoption process at the Welfare Department (JKM) to be more straightforward.

Currently, there are over 1,000 parents who have registered and are waiting to adopt a baby but there is a shortage of babies at JKM, said Yeoh.

Meanwhile, a survey by the Selangor Women's Empowerment Institute (IWB) found 84.8% of respondents said that sex education was vital to reduce baby dumping and unwanted pregnancies.

IWB chief executive Siti Kamariah said this showed that many people were aware of the importance of sex education and wanted their children to be taught.

"In the survey we also found that 98.2% said that the mother, who is a child, was solely responsible," she said and urged society to change this perception.

# S'gor traders in limbo over workers

'Ban on foreign workers should be lifted due to problems in hiring locals'

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Three months after Selangor banned foreign workers from working in wet markets, traders are renewing calls to lift the ban as plans to replace foreign labour with local workers have not been successful.

Worse, traders from Ampang to Petaling Jaya said the ban was making it hard for them to recover from the Covid-19 economic slowdown.

A sore point for many is that they are required to keep paying their laid-off foreign workers as their work permits are still valid, or risk getting into trouble should their workers be caught working illegally.

Malaysian workers have mostly not shown up. If they did, they do not last long at wet markets.

Traders have many horror stories about employing locals. Some don't even last an hour, as chicken seller Lim Ah Suan testified.

"He went to the toilet after an hour and we never saw his face again," she said of one of the many locals she hired to work at her stall

at the PJ Old Town wet market.

The Selangor state executive committee decided to ban foreign workers at wet markets on June 19, following the examples of PJ City Council (MBPJ) and Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) after dozens of Covid-19 cases were traced back to traders and foreign workers at wet markets.

The ban only applies to small traders, including those operating at wet markets, while wholesale market and supermarket traders were exempted.

"What we're saying now is all the hawkers must use local workers," said Ng Sze Han, who chairs the Selangor Local Government, Public Transportation and New Village Development Committee.

He said the ban was also done to restore public confidence in wet markets.

To stay in business, some have had to reduce the number of days they operate a week while others try to reduce the amount of goods they sell.

Sim King Pak, a vegetable seller at the Ampang morning market, said his business was lagging because he could no longer cart and stock as much produce from the KL Wholesale Market to Ampang.

He said he had tried many times to hire locals but they always quit eventually.

Chong Tek Keong, president of the Federation of Vegetable Sellers Association Malaysia, said traders at the KL Wholesale Market, who were exempted from a similar ban, were also facing a high turnover rate.

Nevertheless, he said Malaysians could do the work at markets as long as they were offered incentives and benefits.

Malaysian Employers Federation executive director Datuk Shamsuddin Bardan said local governments should have given traders time to phase out their foreign workers.

"This is affecting traders badly and it is unfair to them," he said.

One local council seems to agree. Unlike other Selangor municipalities in the Klang Valley, Klang has not implemented a ban on foreigners at wet markets under its jurisdiction, much to the relief of local traders.

Klang Municipal Council president Dr Ahmad Fadzli Ahmad Tajuddin said the ban should not be implemented at one go but in stages, with the process laid out with input from relevant authorities such as the Immigration Department.

"If the government says, 'No, we don't want foreigners', it's okay. Give us some time and tell us where the priorities are. Let us discuss each point. Then insist on doing that. Don't cancel after a few months," he said.

He added that the municipality continued to enforce by-laws against foreigners sub-letting licences and operating at local night markets, however.

Ng, instead, said the Immigration Department should never have issued work permits to foreign work-

ers registered under small traders. Immigration Department director-general Datuk Khairul Dzaimae Daud said the decision to ban foreign workers with valid work permits from wet markets was up to local authorities.

Over the last few months, the Federal Government has started easing restrictions by allowing laid-off foreign workers to change employers, provided they are in the same sector and if efforts by employers to recruit local workers have failed.

However, this is unlikely to apply to small traders employing foreign workers as long as local governments refuse to lift the ban on foreigners.

"There is no harmonisation of policies between the levels of government," said Shamsuddin.

He advised traders to modernise, including going online.

"Covid-19 will not disappear anytime soon," he said. "Traders need to adapt, adopt and be agile." — Bernama

# Factories near rivers must go

OVER 1.2 million consumers in Selangor and Kuala Lumpur had to suffer an unnecessary water cut for days in early September because of pollution from an illegal factory. The state authorities later admitted that the factory had been operating without a licence since 2014.

A few days ago, the Selangor Water Management Authority (LUAS) warned about discoloration of raw water in Sungai Gong, which was where the earlier pollution had caused the widespread water supply cut.

This time, instead of finding the true culprit, LUAS simply accused Indah Water Konsortium (IWK) of being the polluter. It later turned

out that IWK was also a victim of the illegally dumped waste, but luckily Klang Valley residents didn't have to suffer another major water supply cut.

All this points to lack of proper management of raw water resources by the Selangor state authorities, as water supply cuts triggered by LUAS seem to be happening more frequently these days, and more than in any other state in Malaysia.

This is really disappointing as Selangor had promised better piped water management to Klang Valley residents when it bought out privately run firms Puncak Niaga, Syabas, Abass and Splash for billions of ringgit.

Think of how that humongous

amount of money could have been used by the state to improve the water supply system instead of just making some people very rich!

And blaming IWK makes it clear that Selangor is running out of ideas on how to better manage our precious water resource and ensure it keeps flowing to our taps.

Stop the blame game, Selangor, and start looking at ways to prevent the raw water pollution first.

The biggest joke came from Selangor Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari, who is now giving illegal factories "one last chance" to be licensed. And he has the audacity to say some of the factories have been operating illegally since 2008!

He should simply take a boat

ride along the main rivers feeding the Air Selangor water treatment plants and find out exactly how many factories are operating next to these rivers.

It doesn't matter if these factories are licensed or not – all of them should go to make sure the rivers don't get polluted again.

Both the Yang di-Pertuan Agong and Sultan of Selangor have called on Selangor to clean up its act and enforce laws already in place to kick out these polluters. The only question left is why the Selangor state government remains so hesitant. Is there something to hide?

## Wet market traders want foreign worker ban lifted

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Three months after Selangor banned foreigners from working in wet markets, traders are renewing calls to lift the ban as the plans to replace foreign labour with local workers has not worked out.

Traders from Ampang to Petaling Jaya said the ban has made it difficult for them to recover from the economic slowdown. They have to keep paying their laid-off foreign workers, whose work permits are still valid, or risk getting into trouble should their workers be caught working illegally.

Malaysian workers, thought to be the solution, have shunned such work. Those who took up such jobs do not stay long.

The Selangor state executive council banned foreign workers at wet markets on

June 19, following the examples of Petaling Jaya City Council and Kuala Lumpur City Hall after dozens of Covid-19 cases were traced to traders and foreign workers at wet markets.

The ban applies to small traders, including those operating at wet markets, while wholesale market and supermarket traders are exempted.

"All the hawkers must use local workers," said Ng Sze Han, who is the State Local Government, Public Transport and New Village Development Committee chairman.

Federation of Vegetable Sellers Association of Malaysia president Chong Tek Keong said traders at the Kuala Lumpur Wholesale Market are facing the same problem.

"We are facing high turnover (rate). After

two or three months, when we want to sign a contract with them, they say, 'Sorry, boss. I have to go back to my old job,'" he said.

To overcome the high turnover rate, Malaysian Employers Federation executive director Datuk Shamsuddin Bardan said local governments should have given traders time to phase out their foreign workers.

This includes allowing some foreign workers to work until their permits expire.

"The suddenness is hitting (traders) badly and it is unfair to them," he said.

Klang Municipal Council president Dr Ahmad Fadzli Ahmad Tajuddin said the ban should have been implemented in stages, with input from relevant authorities, such as the Immigration Department. - Bernama

## Tuan Ibrahim: None of PAS MPs supporting Anwar

PAS has confirmed that none of its MPs will be supporting PKR president Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim in forming a new government.

PAS deputy president Datuk Tuan Ibrahim Tuan Man said the party is fully behind Perikatan Nasional (PN) and will not be crossing over to support another coalition.

Tuan Ibrahim also challenged Anwar to reveal the names the latter claimed to have given him support.

"We have discussed this at a glance, and it is not a big issue. So far, the party secretary has issued a statement and that is enough.

"In this democratic system, they have a right to form a new coalition, but for us, we are responsible in ensuring MPs are committed to PN," Tuan Ibrahim told reporters yesterday.

possess a "strong, convincing and formidable" support from MPs to form a government.

Tuan Ibrahim spoke to reporters at the World Ozone Day 2020 and pre-launch of National Environment Day 2020 yesterday in Putrajaya.

World Ozone Day, which falls on Sept 16 yearly, is also being celebrated by 197 participating

countries of the Montreal Protocol on the Control of Layer Destructive Materials Ozone.

He said the next target is to eliminate usage of HCFC by 2040 in stages. To date, Malaysia has succeeded in eliminating the use of HCFC by 59% since the implementation of HPMP.

"The National Environment Day 2020 is officially celebrated on Oct

21 every year, but the celebration this year will be held on Oct 24 at Universiti Sains Malaysia Kubang Kerian, Kelantan.

"The main message of the National Environment Day 2020 celebration will focus on three main activities namely electrical and electronics waste disposal methods, disposable plastic reduction and greening of the earth," he added.

Various activities have been laid out to make the National Environment Day 2020 celebration a success.

In line with the theme "Environment of Shared Responsibility", Tuan Ibrahim urged the public to play an important role in preserving the environment for the benefit of the current and future generations.

On the Sungai Gong pollution, Tuan Ibrahim said an investigation has been done and a sample has been sent to the Department of Chemistry.

"We will get the results of the analysis," he said.

Four board members and a manager of a heavy machinery repair company charged in connection with the dumping of hazardous materials into Sungai Gong in Rawang were released on a RM400,000 bail each with one surety by the Shah Alam High Court on Tuesday.
