Mampu jana pendapatan lumayan puluhan ribu ringgit sebulan

SELANJUTNYA menjadi seorang YouTuber, Instagram atau streamer permainan video, pengendali laman troll di Facebook juga mampu menjana pendapatan lumayan puluhan ribu ringgit sebulan. KUALA LUMPUR – Selain menjadi salah seorang YouTuber, Instagram atau streamer permainan video, pengendali laman troll di media sosial Facebook juga mampu menjana pendapatan lumayan puluhan ribu ringgit.

Hasil pendapatan bukan sahaja membolehkan Google AdSense di web, malah laman troll yang mempunyai nama pengarah menjadi 'lubuk' duit dan buruan parti-parti politik yang mahu menyebarkan propaganda atau ideology masing-masing.

Pengendali Tentera Troll Kebangsaan Malaysia (TTKM) yang hanya ingin dikenali sebagai Neo berkata, beberapa parti politik sanggup mengeluarkan sejumlah wang yang besar untuk menyebarkan propaganda mereka menerusi laman troll miliknya.

Menurutnya, TTKM ditubuhkan pada tahun 2014 untuk menentang Parti Keadilan Rakyat (PKR) kerana pihaknya tidak bertepatan dengan tinjauan parti itu yang mengingini Menteri Besar Selangor, Tan Sri Khalid Ibrahim ketika itu memervali Langkapi Kajang.

"Secara umumnya, kebanyakan troll kami berlatar politik dan mempunyai profil yang cakra dengan satu-satu politik tertentu, walaupun kadangkala kami selitkan dengan unsur jenaka yang tidak ada kaitan dengan politik, kerana mereka dituntut baru-baru ini. Neo memberitahu, TTKM pernah menerima tawaran dari pada pihak tertentu dari dalam

meningkatkan lumbung kartun. Katanya, laman itu kini mencatatkan 906,907 likes dalam 1.2 juta capaian serta 3.9 juta engagement sebulan.

"Penyana internet yang mengikuti laman itu pasti tidak kelok dengan wajah, bangkai, Solihin, Cemeron dan Mira. Ujar Sham, dia memandatkan populariti laman itu untuk memuat rekaun produk sebagai cara menjana pendapatan.

"Kami boleh menjana pendapatan antara RM5000 hingga RM20,000 sebulan hasil daripada rekaun berbayar produk-produk tertentu.

"Selain itu, kami mengeluarkan buaj dan cenderahati secara bermasa dan barangan itu mendapat sambutan yang mengagumkan," ujarnya.

Bagaimanapun, katanya, ia tidak bermakna wang tersebut menjadi sumber pendapatan utama bagi kebanyakan pengendali laman troll tersebut.

Sham memberitahu, mereka hanyalah pengendali laman itu secara separuh masa dan mempu ketika projek profesional lain.

"Wang itu dibelanjakan untuk apa saja yang membuat rekaun produk. Selain itu, kami menggunakan populariti laman itu bagi membantu amfat tertentu sebuah badan-badan kemanusiaan atau Komuniti Harmoni Kita yang bersungguh di bawah kami."

"Kami juga berbanding untuk mengahkalkan jenama bazar Si Rashid," ujarnya.

Populariti laman itu turut mendorong sebuah parti politik untuk membina pada harga RM200,000, namun ditolak oleh Sham dan rakan-rakan.

Menurutnya, TTKM juga pernah menerima tawaran untuk menjadikan kerjasama dengan sebuah laman troll dari Singapura untuk berkolaborasi kandungan.



Setakat ini, TTKM mempunyai sebanyak 636,029 pengikut di Facebook dengan 21 juta engagement sebulan.



Laman itu kini menghasilkan pendapatan menerusi Google AdSense di laman web Twitter TTKM yang dikendalikan oleh Neo, serta dalam video tertentu.

Pemilik syarikat direman empat hari kemuka laporan palsu

SEREMBAN - Seorang pemilik syarikat pembekalan pasir direman empat hari bagi membantu siasatan berhubung kes mengemukakan laporan palsu pengeluaran pasir yang mengakibatkan kerugian RM100,000.

Perintah reman terhadap lelaki berusia 41 tahun itu dikeluarkan Penolong Pendaftar Kanan, Yusna Khadijah Yusof selepas permohonan dibuat Pegawai Pendakwa Suruhanjaya Pencegahan Rasuah Malaysia (SPRM), Mohd Khairi Abdul Karim di Mahkamah Khas Reman Seremban semalam.

Menurut sumber, pada Mei hingga Ogos 2019, lelaki itu menerusi syarikatnya telah mengemukakan laporan doket palsu pengeluaran pasir laut di Mukim Jimah, Port Dickson kepada Yayasan Negeri

Sembilan.

Berdasarkan siasatan awal, katanya, terdapat penjualan pasir laut dibuat oleh syarikat berkenaan kepada sebuah syarikat lain yang tidak dimasukkan ke dalam senarai.

"Penipuan itu telah mengakibatkan kerugian sehingga RM100,000 kepada Pejabat Daerah dan Tanah Port Dickson, Yayasan Negeri Sembilan dan Menteri Besar Incorporation (MBI)," kata sumber.

Kes disiasat mengikut Seksyen 18 Akta SPRM 2009 yang memperuntukkan hukuman penjara tidak lebih 20 tahun, denda lima kali nilai suapan atau RM10,000 atau mana-mana lebih tinggi.

Terdahulu, suspek ditahan Selasa lalu dan direman enam hari untuk siasatan lanjut yang sepatutnya berakhir semalam.

Public urged to be on the lookout for pollution

THE Air Selangor River Care programme at Kampung Gombak in Kawang has given residents a chance to air their grievances on the state of Sungai Kuang, which runs through the village.

In the midst of an activity-filled programme which saw a children's colouring competition, a ketupat weaving challenge and an upcycling contest using plastic water bottles, residents revealed that in contrast to its current muddy brown state, the river water once ran clear.

Residents Rizal Kamis, 44, and Saiful Rashid, 39, remember bathing in the river in their primary school years.

"Back in the 1980s, everyone came here to draw water for their homes.

"We had piped water but people still preferred coming to the river.

"The water was fresh and cool and you could see little fishes swimming about," said Rizal.

But things started to change as the padi fields surrounding the village began to make way for houses.

"The water quality began to change when the quarries, sand mines and factories started their activities upstream in 1996.

"Hoisting developments were also coming up along the river and with it, rubbish and sludge," said Saiful.

Some villagers, who were

unhappy with the situation, tried contacting the authorities in the hope that they could rectify the situation, recalled another resident, Abdul Majid Yusoff, 58.

But action was slow to come and as the complainants themselves had other commitments, there was little follow-up.

"Disheartened by the deteriorating state of the water quality and constant presence of rubbish, villagers began to treat the river like a drain.

"Pissing motorcyclists would

chuck their rubbish into the river.

"Eventually, villagers too thought nothing of tossing in used diapers and cigarette butts," said Abdul Majid.

Kampung Gombak village head Rosaidi Mohd Yusoff said he had made no less than 10 complaints from 2016 on varying issues, including pollution and bend repairs, to the penghulu, Gombak Laid and District Office, Drainage and Irrigation Department, Selangor Water Management Authority and Air Selangor.

"More often than not, I'd be told that a particular issue was not under the department's jurisdiction and be referred to another department," said Rosaidi.

For the sake of public security, as water from Sungai Kuang eventually flowed into Sungai Selangor, where Air Selangor's water treatment plants were located, Rosaidi felt strongly there should be better teamwork between government agencies.

"There should be an action committee to look into all complaints regarding rivers," he said.

Resident Mohamad Zaki Mustapha, 65, said he could not understand why authorities had been slow to act against upstream pollution, which had affected the quality of water in Sungai Kuang so drastically.

"Sources of pollution can be traced just by following the river.

"If there is an illegal drain pipe or chemical discharge, these will all lead to the polluters.

"It makes me wonder why they have yet to be stopped," queried Mohamad Zaki, who yearned for the day when Sungai Kuang could

be restored to its original state.

Before joining the villagers in a gotong royong session at the launch of the river care programme, Air Selangor chief executive officer Subahmi Kamarulzaman said with water pollution being a hot issue in the Klang Valley now, the public was urged to take full advantage of the situation.

"If you find that your drains have become smelly, then as an ordinary citizen, you can call the local authority.

"But if you call Air Selangor on our hotline, we will not tell you that's not our job.

"We will take your complaint and channel it because we have a good working relationship with all the agencies," he added.

Subahmi also stressed that while the public had a critical role to play, the polluters must come to the realisation that they must stop their activities.

Rizal recalls bathing in the river in his primary schooling years.

"If they continue to pollute, then I ask the ordinary citizen to be our eyes and ears to report these polluters," said Subahmi.

The programme, which took place under a tent pitched up beside Sungai Kuang, received encouraging response with 150 Kampung Gombak residents and

Squad to monitor three river basins round the clock

A RIVER patrolling unit has been established under a pilot plan to set up active surveillance along rivers and detect illegal activities that can endanger water quality.

Selangor public amenities, agricultural modernisation and agribased industry committee chairman Izham Hashim said the River Action Squad (RAC) was formed to conduct 24-hour surveillance on sensitive water bodies at three river basins – Lembangan Sungai Selangor, Sungai Langat and Sungai Klang.

"The state government wanted to empower the enforcement on water sources and Selangor State Executive Council decided to have Luas (Selangor Water Management Authority) form a river patrolling unit to carry out surveillance at river watersheds, basins and streams," he said.

Izham, who attended the state-level World Rivers Day 2020 celebrations at Jalan Industry USJ 1/2 organised by Subang Jaya Municipal Council (MPSJ), said RAC was much needed to monitor illegal activities along streams and rivers that may risk polluting the water source and force the water treatment plant to shut down.

"RAC strengthens the Selangor government's initiative to empower Ops Sumber Air that began in March last year, involving various government agencies," he noted.

"With Ops Sumber Air, seven river pollution incidents that had the potential to cause the water treatment plant to shut down were contained.

"With the new squad, river surveillance will be tightened," he said.

He added that the RAC patrolled on land and used a drone with high definition cameras to monitor areas along the river.

"Drone-based aerial photography

solutions enable efficient and versatile aerial imaging that gives squad members a better understanding of the river and activities that go on along the stretches of water basins," he said.

Izham added that the water quality in river basins of Sungai Selangor and Sungai Langat was affected by pollution from industries, development projects, agriculture, animal breeding and building of highways.

"Projects and activities that fail to follow guidelines make a huge impact on streams and rivers.

"Worse still when unscrupulous people choose the easy way out by dumping waste into drains, river banks and manholes.

"People must take responsibility for their actions," he said.

MPSJ president Noraini Roslan said people must keep the environment clean and love the rivers.

"We must move towards effective and sustainable management of rivers that meets the needs of the people now without compromising on future generations to come.

"Our children's children must enjoy clean rivers as their water source," she said after planting a weeping willow at the Sungai Klang riverbank.

Noraini added that a clean river started with a clean township and Subang Jaya harboured the dream of becoming a green township by 2030 and numerous initiatives had started, including recycling.

Izham said the state decided to amend the current Luas Enactment 1999, which states that the fine imposed for river pollution was no more than RM100,000.

Luas will be increasing that figure to a minimum of RM200,000 or not more than RM1mil with jail term of up to three years.

"Changes to the Luas Enactment will be tabled at the upcoming Selangor state assembly sitting," he added.

MORE than a dozen mostly Indian small traders and stall operators in Klang, Selangor, who had been relocated by the Klang Municipal Council (MPK) have lost most of their business, *Makkal Osai* reported.

The traders who depended on their stalls for income were already badly affected due to the movement control order MCO and business was only slowly picking up before the relocation.

MP: Set up river protection agency

KUALA LUMPUR: The government has been urged to set up the National River Protection Authority (NRPA), which should be made part of the National Security Council.

While welcoming the federal and Selangor government's initiative to increase fines and involve the public in cleaning up polluted rivers on World Rivers Day, Klang member of parliament Charles Santiago said this was not enough.

"We need to think beyond the Friends of the River campaign because our rivers continue to be polluted despite clean river initiatives over one and a half decades now.

"Today, a river is treated as a dumpsite by industries and communities.

"River pollution includes plas-

tic waste, surgical face masks, e-waste, chemicals, heavy metals and industrial waste, pharmaceutical waste, sewage and effluents from livestock farms.

"River pollution is threatening our existence. Rivers provide our drinking water and water for agriculture and industries.

"It provides a habitat for marine and plant species, including fish," he said yesterday.

The former National Water Service Commission chairman said in 2016, 200 tonnes of rubbish or municipal solid waste were dumped into rivers, drains and waterways in the country on a monthly basis.

The 2017 Malaysia Environmental Quality Report suggested that the percentage of polluted rivers had increased and none of the monitored rivers had been

categorised as clean, he said.

The growing instances of river pollution had impacted water supply in Selangor, Johor and Penang, he said.

He said water treatment plants had been forced to shut down due to river pollution, resulting in huge losses in economic activity and social inconvenience.

"Rivers are under threat and need protection. An increase in fines is necessary but not sufficient.

"It's time the government considers setting up a National River Protection Authority as a single authority in managing and coordinating river protection."

He said the agency could, as a first step, bring together the federal agencies involved in river management under one roof.

And the NRPA could provide a

platform for improved coordination between federal and state agencies for river management, he added.

Santiago said at the heart of the NRPA was the creation of a buffer on both sides of the river, and together with the river, should be classified as security zones monitored by enforcement agencies

on a 24/7 basis.

"The aim of creating such a security space is to ensure that there is no encroachment on rivers.

"It's time to look at the pollution of our rivers as a national security issue.

"And what better day to start than on World Rivers Day?"
