# Keeping Petaling Jaya ticking

City's businesses slowly recover from Covid-19 pandemic as new mayor takes charge

AS THE YEAR kicked off, Covid-19 cases started rising around the country once again.

However, the announcement on the roll-out of mass vaccinations, which gathered steam mid-year, helped provide a glimmer of hope to Petaling Jaya folk who were tired of a never-ending cycle of movement control orders, and provide a boost for businesses that has been struggling with the pandemic.

Targeted aid from the federal and state governments, as well as temporary permits given out to traders in certain areas in Petaling Jaya, also acted as a stimulus for those affected by the pandemic.

## Immunisation programme

The mass vaccination programme for residents living in areas under enhanced MCO in Selangor was first introduced in Petaling Jaya.

In July, above-18 residents of Mentari Court, regardless of their nationality and status of documentation, were vaccinated.

Mentari Court has more than 17,000 residents in 3,469 units. At the height of the pandemic, there were over 500 positive cases at the apartment blocks.

In the more seasoned areas such as Petaling Jaya Old Town, where many senior care homes were located, there were calls for authorities to vaccinate the elderly and their caretakers.

This was quickly done, and authorities assisted by vaccine support volunteers also visited other care homes and those out-of-the-way areas in the district to ease the vaccination process.

In the meantime, Petaling Jaya City Council (MBPJ) in October rolled out a more compassionate approach towards the city's stakeholders and offered a waiver for assessment tax or a rebate to owners of business premises whose tenants moved out during the pandemic.

Petaling Jaya acting deputy mayor Sharipah Marhaiati Syed Ali said MBPJ would also waive rental due in June and July for businesses operating from council premises, to ease the burden of operators.

The council also offered temporary permits to 802 traders in Petaling Jaya, including 41 operating along Jalan PJS 2D/1 in Taman Medan. The permits are for a three-month period, to be renewed on a monthly basis.

## Not in alignment

News about a proposed plan for an underground Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) 3 Circle Line running through certain parts of Petaling Jaya proved unsettling to residents, business owners and environmental activists.

The stakeholders learned about

the proposed plan after MRT Corp gave them an online presentation in August.

In an April 14 article, *The Star* reported that a third MRT line would play a crucial role in cutting short the distance for those who need to transfer between MRT lines (Kajang and the upcoming Putrajaya line) and LRT lines (Kelana Jaya and Ampang/Sri Petaling) as well as the KTMB Komuter.

Representatives of the Section 5 Residents Association (RAS5P), Section 10 Residents Association (S10RA), Gasing Coalition (comprising 12 residents groups from the Bukit Gasing and Friends of Bukit Gasing (FOBG)) were among those consulted by MRT Corp.

In response to protests by nearby residents, the company reiterated that the alignment had yet to be finalised, with Bukit Gasing assemblyman Rajiv Rishyakaran stating that the proposal had not yet gone through the required public display and government approval processes.

Rajiv also said there were three different proposed MRT3 alignments since 2016.

The first version only passes Jalan Universiti, while the second and third proposals pass through Jalan Gasing and Jalan Universiti using different alignments and coming from different directions

from the Kuala Lumpur side.

## New mayor at the helm

The year saw a new mayor for Petaling Jaya, with Mohamad Azhan Md Amir assuming the role effective Oct 21, taking over from Datuk Mohd Sayuthi Bakar, who left in May to serve as Immigration Department deputy director-general (operations).

Mohamad Azhan previously served as the National Disaster Management Agency's (Nadma) post-disaster management division deputy director-general.

He has 24 years of experience in the civil service at state and ministry levels.

Former MBPJ director of city planning Sharipah Marhaiati Syed Ali was promoted to deputy mayor.

After four long years without a director of health at MBPJ, the council's retired director of health, Dr Chitra Davi N. Vadivelu, was reappointed on a two-year contract, and will report to office next week.

## Dog park closure

Pet owners who frequent the Central Park in Bandar Utama, Petaling Jaya, were upset when they saw a notice for the landowner to remove the structures erect-

ed for the dog park in October.

It said the notice was issued under the Park By-law 2005 (MBPJ 2005).

A council spokesperson said the structures were erected without MBPJ's approval.

Meanwhile, thousands of pet lovers and park users signed an online petition to retain the park.

Their area councillor Danny Chan confirmed that as of now the park was still open to pet owners and the matter would be settled amicably between the council and the landowner as many were fond of the park and there were no other dog park in the city.

## Market upgrade

The city council has embarked on a project to improve the conditions at some wet markets in the city.

So far, Pasar Sentosa in Section 17 and Pasar Taman Megah in SS24 have been transformed into modern wet markets that attracted both the young and old.

The Section 17 market had beautiful murals that attracted the young who were always looking for Instagram-worthy places to visit.

The Taman Megah market was extensively renovated and now boast a wet and dry section, with high ceilings, attracting both ven-

dors and customers.

The same could not be said for the Pasar Besar Jalan Othman, better known as the PJ Old Town Market.

It is struggling to attract customers and vendors after the council vetted the business owners there.

As a result of several lockdowns at the market due to the Covid-19 outbreak among the traders and a rodent infestation problem, the council got tough on enforcement.

Business owners who breached MBPJ rules had their licence terminated. Council rental for the lots was also readjusted.

Most business owners at the market were given new lots depending on the type of business and based on the council's new business layout.

At the SS2 market, members of the public, in September, were irked by new standard operating procedures introduced requiring them to pay RM1 (refundable) for laminated card bearing numbers given out to keep track of the number of visitors.

Marketgoers had hygiene concerns as it involved physical contact between them and the person distributing the cards.

Following protests, the system was terminated but reintroduced later.

## 'Fix landslide-prone slope in Taman Zooview'

TAMAN Zooview residents in Hulu Kelang, Selangor say landslides keep occurring at the main access road into their housing estate.

They want the Ampang Jaya Municipal Council (MPAJ) to stop giving the excuse that land surrounding Jalan Lee Won was privately owned.

Resident Zahir Ghazali, 45, said he had lodged several complaints with the council.

"I am worried that further soil movement will affect the structure of my property," said Zahir whose house is located near the affected slope.

He also said Hulu Kelang assemblyman Saari Sungib had agreed to give them funds to carry out repairs to stabilise the slope.

"However, we were unable to get the necessary approvals from the council," he added.

Saari, when contacted, said MPAJ insisted that they submit technical drawings of the proposed works.

"However, this would be very expensive and add to the cost.

"MPAJ should take responsibility as this issue threatens public safety," he said.

On Dec 18, a landslide at the site caused an electric pole to collapse, blocking access into the area, and cutting power supply to the houses.

The matter was resolved after Tenaga Nasional Bhd workers removed the pole at noon the day after.

Muralidheran Shanmugan, 52, who has lived in the area since 2004, expressed concerns over a vacant house above the slope.

"We are worried that it will collapse," he said.

# Perfect storm of conditions

Experts say Klang Valley floods caused by high tides, low-lying regions and swollen rivers

CLAD in mud-spattered shorts and T-shirt, Derismawa Ariso sat on her 42-inch television as she took a break from cleaning her single-storey house that she shared with two housemates at Kampung Tengah in Banting, Selangor.

The relatively new television served as a makeshift chair now after being submerged in floodwaters from Dec 18 to 25.

Surrounding it were sodden curtains, mud-soaked clothes and remnants of furniture that have turned into mush and wood pulp.

"When we got home from work, the water had already entered the house. We could only get some clothes.

"Everything else is gone," she said.

Kampung Tengah is surrounded by oil palm plantations, it does not usually flood there, residents said.

In Taman Sri Muda, Shah Alam, Raynugadewi Subramaniam, said she was blind-sided by the floods although her neighbourhood was prone to slight flooding every time it rained heavily.

On the morning of Dec 18, when she noticed the water rushing in faster than normal, she and her mother left the house and parked their car on a hill.

"We waited for the water to subside so we could walk back but I realised the water level was rising higher so we had to seek dry land further elsewhere.

She returned on Dec 23 to find everything on the first floor destroyed and her neighbourhood looking like a war zone.

Disaster preparedness expert Dr Khamarrul Azahari Razak said the floods were due to the impact of climate change that came within a short space of time.

The floods have been blamed on the amount of rainfall - over 300mm of rain fell in a day, equivalent to the average rainfall of a whole month.

Coupled with high tides, low-lying regions, full rivers and over-saturated earth, the combo proved too much for current flood

mitigation measures to cope with.

"To be honest, in my 30-odd years, I have not seen any flood similar to the one in Kuala Langat over the last week. Shah Alam too," said National Water Research Institute director-general Datuk Nor Hisham Mohd Ghazali.

It took a week for the water to subside in Kampung Tengah, Banting.

In Taman Sri Muda, the authorities had to employ mobile pumps to drain the water, allowing residents to return five days later to clean up their homes.

Global Environment Centre (GEC) river care programme manager Dr Kalithasan Kailasam said during the monsoon season, rivers and dams are full, which made it hard for the water to drain and there was a backflow.

Considering the amount of rain that fell on Dec 18 and 19 was almost twice December's average rainfall, future water catchment projects would have to be able to contain 300m-400mm of water at any given time, said Selangor Mentri Besar Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari.

Experts said increasing structural flood mitigation measures, such as the number and capacity of retention ponds, dams, levees and diversion channels, will help the Klang Valley and the rest of Malaysia to face the climate change threat.

As for non-structural solutions, experts and the public said the state and federal governments should improve their disaster response and management plans.

A 2020 report on Disaster Risk Reduction in Malaysia by the UN Office for Disaster Risk Reduction and Asian Disaster Preparedness Center described the country's centralised or top-down disaster management system as inefficient and obsolete.

"It is inevitable that inflexibility (of the top-down disaster management system) renders them obsolete when facing the challenges of the 21st century where "bottom-up" information plays an important role

with the revolution of social media and awareness among the public impacting the government's reputation and goodwill," it said.

Dr Khamarrul, who is also an exco member of Mercy Malaysia, recommended a decentralised system, saying effective disaster management means bringing local and state authorities into the fold.

"If you strengthen the local government, you improve the entire machinery of the disaster management system instead of you just focusing on Nadma (National Disaster Management Agency)," he said.

Experts said other non-structural changes, include banning development on floodplains, ensuring sustainable development, strengthening regulations and implementing stringent requirements.

Nor Hisham, who is also the Drainage and

Irrigation Department former director-general said there should not be any development in floodplains.

But if there is a need to develop, experts said the requirements should anticipate the effects of climate change, such as higher rainfall and extreme weather events.

Environmental management expert Assoc Prof Dr Mohd Khairul Amri Kamaruddin of Universiti Sultan Zainal Abidin said development could work hand in hand with conservation efforts.

"We can develop areas for ecotourism to benefit local communities," he said.

Nor Hisham agreed, saying development, should not interfere with the natural processes of the river.

"In a country that gets so much rain like ours, it's crucial for the future," he said. - Bernama

# Welcome measures for Subang Jaya residents

They include flood mitigation projects, plans for government health clinic and new guidelines for urban community gardens

THE torrential rain that fell over two days from Dec 17 caused massive flooding in several districts in Selangor, and some areas under the Subang Jaya City Council (MBSJ) were not spared.

Kampung Bersatu and Kampung Kenangan Batu 13 Puchong, Kampung Tengah A and B, Kampung Kuala Sungai Baru, Kampung Bukit Lanchong, Taman Kinrara 1 and 2, Taman Batu Tiga, Taman Mutiara Subang, Lagoon Perdana and USJ 1 were inundated, forcing thousands to evacuate.

Flood victims were housed in about 20 temporary relief centres in Puchong, Putra Heights and Subang Jaya.

Most of the centres have since closed after water receded. Six remain operational.

But the year-end flooding, which was blamed on excessive rainfall, was not the only such incident to plague the city.

Parts of Seri Kembangan and Seri Serdang were inundated in flash floods over the past year, leaving residents fearful whenever it rained heavily.

There could be some relief soon, as Selangor infrastructure and public amenities, agriculture modernisation and agro-based industry committee chairman Izhah Hashim has announced that flood mitigation projects are underway.

"The Selangor government, through the Drainage and Irrigation Department (DID) has several immediate and long-term plans to address flood problems at the Sungai Kuyoh basin," he said during the state assembly session in November.

"As an immediate measure, RM5.5mil was approved for river dredging and pool widening works in Seri Serdang and Seri Kembangan, including RM4.2mil for the Bluewater Reservoir.

"Work is expected to be completed in March 2022."

As a long-term measure, the Sungai Kuyoh flood mitigation project was approved as Rolling Plan 4 under the 11th Malaysia Plan, with a federal allocation of RM300mil, Izhah added.

"Its main work scope is to deepen and widen Sungai Kuyoh.

"This includes upgrading a 14km stretch of the river, upgrading three existing reservoirs and building a new one, constructing a pump system and rubbish traps as well as utility relocation.

"It is now at the design stage, with physical work expected to start in late 2022 or early 2023," he said, adding that the Sungai Kuyoh flood mitigation project would benefit both Selangor and Kuala Lumpur.

On infrastructure issues at Jalan Besar, Seri Kembangan, Izhah said the Selangor Public Works Department (JKR) had estimated that it would cost RM620,000 for road divider upgrades and RM1.147mil for drainage upgrades and sewerage repair works.

## Government clinic

Subang Jaya residents can finally look forward to having a government health clinic in the township soon.

The RM45mil project is expected to start construction in March 2022 and targeted for completion in March 2025, said Selangor public health, unity, women empowerment and family committee chairman Dr Siti Mariah Mahmud.

The health clinic, to be located in Jalan Subang 3 in USJ 1, is designed to cater to an average of 500 to 800 patients per day.

Services will include outpatient treatment, accidents and emergencies, maternal and paediatric care, dentistry and laboratory services.

The news was much welcomed by Subang Jaya residents, as it would eliminate the need for resi-

dents to travel to other clinics in Petaling Jaya or Puchong to seek medical treatment.

## Outdoor plant restrictions

Meanwhile, residents and gardening enthusiasts were caught off-guard when a local portal reported that MBSJ no longer allowed residents to grow fruit trees and vegetables outside their homes.

MBSJ clarified that although there were laws that disallowed residents to grow or place plants outside their front gate or backyard, the council allowed residents to continue with the practice, provided they did not obstruct or disrupt public health and safety.

"Under MBSJ's Park Bylaw 2005, residents are not allowed to plant anything haphazardly outside their own property or dig land belonging to the municipality," Subang Jaya mayor Noraini Roslan said at its March full board meeting.

"Whether it is designated as a field, playground or green area, a public space has to remain that way."

She added that MBSJ frequently deals with complaints about haphazardly placed plants or pots posing a nuisance or inconvenience, obstructing vehicles in times of emergency.

Other complaints are pots being potential mosquito breeding grounds or blocked drainage maintenance works from being

carried out.

MBSJ can also take action under Section 46 of the Street, Drainage and Building Act 1974 (Act 133) to order the removal of pots, cones, chairs or any structures, whether permanent or temporary, if they are deemed to be obstructing public access.

In addition, MBSJ is preparing its own Guideline on MBSJ Urban Community Garden Provision that will be launched soon.

"This will be different from the Urban Community Farming Policy by the Housing and Local Government Ministry," said MBSJ's Landscape Department in a statement.

"This is because urban community gardens have been established within the municipality since 2013 and there are various things that have already been implemented by MBSJ.

"MBSJ is planning to allow parts of open spaces to be used as community gardens, on condition that these are not actively used for recreation and have the support of the elected representative and councillor."

The department added that the guidelines would explain in detail the application processes and approvals required by a resident group to have a community garden.

The guidelines will be posted on MBSJ's official information channels, with the Landscape Department serving as point of

reference and approval.

To date, there are more than 65 community gardens located on open spaces initiated by resident groups, and approved by MBSJ.

## Anniversary of city status

MBSJ marked the first anniversary of its city status in October with a series of programmes, such as upcycling competition with Residents Representative Council (MPP), recycling corner competition with Joint Management Body (JMB), best JMB for strata communities award ceremony, inter-MPP football tournament and a virtual marathon.

There were also incentives such as exemption on late payment charges for second term assessment payment and monthly parking pass discount at the MBSJ SS15 multi-storey carpark.

## New councillor

November saw the appointment of Syaifqa Zakaria, 26, as MBSJ councillor, replacing Nor Liyana Yahaya, who passed away in late April.

## Pioneer vaccination centre

When the National Covid-19 Immunisation Programme kicked off in March, Sunway Pyramid Convention Centre was designated as the first private large-scale vaccination centre (PPV) for the Petaling district in Selangor.

The programme started with frontline workers, followed by senior citizens and high-risk groups, followed by adults aged 18 years old and above.

Staffers from several local councils in Selangor served as volunteers at the PPV. Meanwhile, Dewan Serbaguna MBSJ in Puchong Indah and Dewan Serbaguna MBSJ in Bandar Puchong Jaya were used as small-scale PPV to administer Covid-19 vaccines and booster shots respectively.

The initiative was done through a strategic collaboration with the National Covid-19 Immunisation Task Force, which handled the PPV's operations, while MBSJ provided the venue and logistics.

KUALA LUMPUR (Dec 30): Construction services company Tuju Setia Bhd has secured a RM311.7 million contract to undertake main contractor works for Sunway d’Hill Residences high-rise development in Kota Damansara, Selangor. 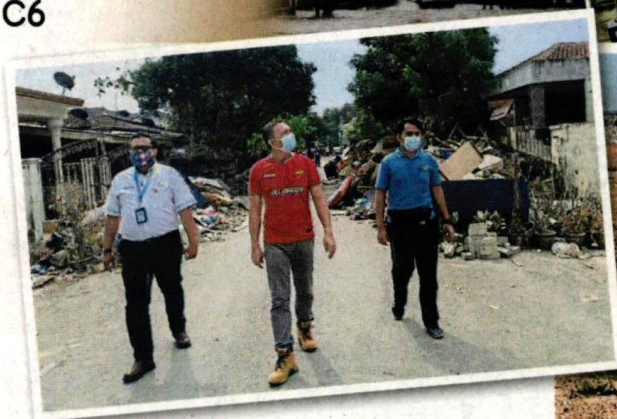

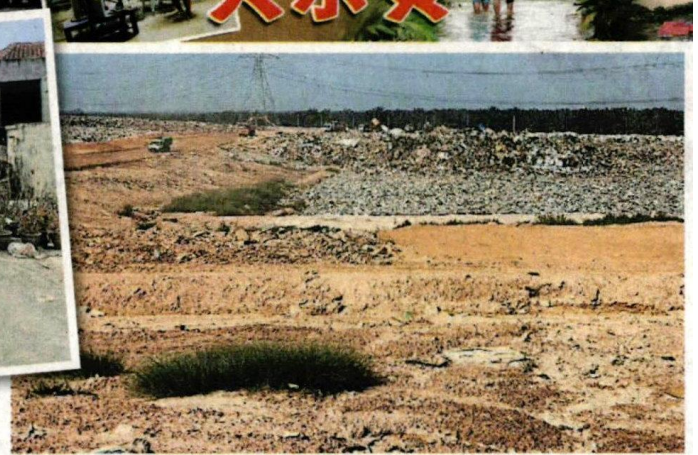

# 90垃圾車清理尚需1週

(莎阿南30日讯)雪州政府通过达鲁益山集团废料管理公司(KDEBWM),派出90辆垃圾车前往莎阿南太子园进行灾后清理工作,不过因灾区范围大,预计仍需一周才能完全清理。

雪州行政议员黄思汉说,KDEB昨日开始全面进入太子园清理灾后垃圾,不过当地有9071住宅单位、179工厂单位受影响,垃圾量非常庞大。

他指出,太子园是他们目前高度关注的灾区;早前因积水未退,因此无法第一时间去清理,直到周日垃圾车才能进入。

“KDEB收集垃圾后,会暂时集中在保留地上,再安排另一辆更大的罗厘,把垃圾载去临时转运站,以更快地处理灾区垃圾。”

他估计,按照目前的进度,约还需一周才能清完太子园的垃圾。

他说,目前也有私人界履行企业社会责任,到灾区协助清理垃圾。他今日宣布雪州新村新届村长名单后,受询时如是指出。

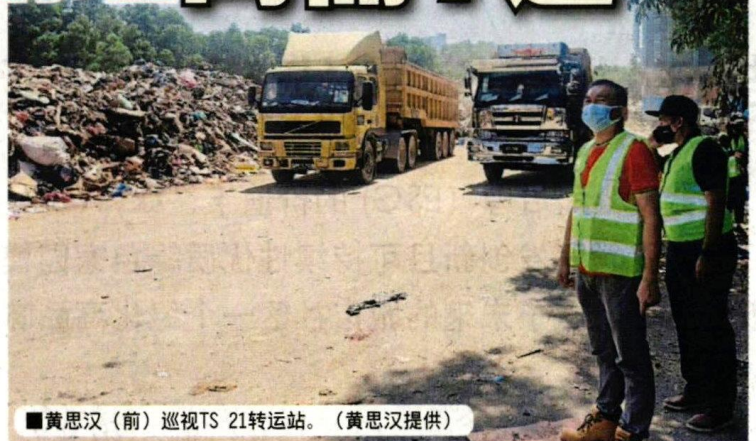
### 人多路窄加剧清理

他说,除了太子园,巴当哇也是其中一个重灾区,当地人口密集、道路狭窄难以进入,加剧了清理工作难度。

黄思汉指出,清理甘榜垃圾的难度较高,因为路窄有的地点垃圾车难以进入,需要人手把垃圾搬出来,加重了工作负担。

“有的居民并非第一时间丢弃淹过水的物品,而是尝试修复或观察晒干后能否继续使用,因此即使第一轮垃圾清理后,后续也还是会有垃圾堆积,在未来一两周也会持续地清理这些水灾垃圾。”

他说,如今雪州各灾区都在进行清理,他希望未来一周至少可以清理好第一轮垃圾,不要出现垃圾堆积在路旁的现象。

## 而榄土埋场劃分水災垃圾專區

黄思汉指出,目前而榄土埋场特别划分出处理水灾垃圾专区,方便垃圾车倾倒,也避免形成垃圾车排长龙现象。

“我感谢其他到来协助的垃圾承包商,并希望他们可以把垃圾送到临时转运站,或直接送到而榄土埋场,做妥善的处理。”

他说,目前土埋场对倾倒水灾垃圾都没有收费。

他指出,截至周三(29日)为止,KDEB所清理的水灾垃圾量高达2万2000吨,尚未

包括其他组织的数据。

他说,土埋场每天接收1500吨的水灾垃圾,这情况已持续一周。

此外,他指出,州政府已指示各地方政府,在灾区附近寻找合适地点,安顿淹水的汽车。

“我们在清理垃圾时,会遇到汽车挡路的问题,因此需要拖走。”

他说,水灾发生后,KDEB有47辆垃圾车无法出动,他们也需要紧急维修。

# 巴生市會承包商出動大批人手 水災垃圾已清約60%

（巴生30日讯）巴生早前发生历来最严重的水灾后，灾民陆续回家清理，并丢出许多被淹坏的物品。巴生市议会和达鲁益山垃圾承包商为此调动大批人手，包括出动内部员工和外聘垃圾承包商，协助清走灾区的垃圾。经过数日来的努力，50%至60%的灾后垃圾已被处理。

巴生市议员柯鹏飞披露，市议会和KDEB承包商从灾后的21日到25日，5天内便已清理了1600吨垃圾。

“截至目前，巴生市议会和各造已平均清理大约60%的灾区垃圾，只不过重灾区的巴生卫星市和圣淘沙需清理的垃圾最多，所以目前还未达到一半，大约40%。”

他披露，由于武吉拉惹镇的发展史也有派出自身的承包商协助清理垃圾，所以当地的80%垃圾堆已获处理。

“垃圾承包商这几天都在努力清理垃圾，从清晨8点就开工，直到下午五六点。”

### 清理垃圾不会收费

他表示，巴生卫星市还有很多垃圾堆需要清理，因此巴生市议会将于本周末联合巴生卫星市居民协会和慈济，发动大型大扫除活动，以号召更多人协助清理灾区。

他透露，市议会最近接获不少投诉，指垃圾承包商清理垃圾时向居民收费，费用大约50令吉至100令吉不等。

他提醒，巴生市议会承包商清理垃圾，绝对不会向市民征收任何费用，所以如果居民遇到索费的垃圾承包商，可坚决拒付。居民若掌握证据，包括视频等，也可向市议会或市议员投报。（BPK）
