RM84j baiki jalan di Shah Alam

Shah Alam: Majlis Bandaraya Shah Alam (MBSA) menerusi Sistem Maklumat Jalan Raya Malaysia (MARRIS) memperuntukkan RM84 juta bagi membaiki serta menyelenggara jalan sekitar bandar raya ini.

Datuk Bandar Shah Alam, Datuk Ahmad Zaharin Mohd Saad, (**gambar**) berkata tender projek itu sudah dikeluarkan dan kerja membaiki dan meningkatkan kualiti jalan raya dijangka disiapkan menjelang September tahun ini.

"Tender projek MARRIS sudah dikeluarkan dan kini menunggu masa sesuai bagi memperbetulkan mana-mana jalan yang rosak.

"MBSA menjangkakan aduan jalan rosak yang dilaporkan dapat di-



selesaikan. Menjadi hasrat MBSA memberi penyelesaian kepada pengguna sekitar bandar raya ini," katanya pada Program Ramah Mesra Penduduk Taman Bukit Subang dan Denai Alam di sini.

Ahmad Zaharin berkata, proses membaiki laluan yang dikenal pasti akan dilaksanakan mengikut fasa dengan keutamaan diberi kepada lokasi yang berpotensi dan berisiko kemalangan.

Sebelum ini, Ketua UMNO Bahagian Shah Alam, Datuk Azhari Shaari mendesak MBSA mengambil tindakan segera menyelenggara jalan sekitar bandar raya ini, berikutan keadaannya yang rosak teruk serta mengundang risiko kemalangan.

Pada 2 Disember lalu, seorang pengawal keselamatan, Mohamad Azmi Jamek, 52, maut akibat nahas selepas motosikal ditunggangnya terlanggar lubang di Persiaran Tengku Ampuan, Seksyen 21, di sini.

Ketika kejadian, Mohamad Azmi dalam perjalanan ke tempat kerja di sebuah kilang dekat Seksyen 26 di sini, sebelum tayar motosikalnya termasuk ke dalam lubang, menyebabkannya mangsa di atas jalan raya.

MPKj tegas basmi pembiakan aedes di tapak projek

KAJANG 2 Mac -Majlis Perbandaran Kajang (MPKj) akan mengarahkan pemaju projek menghentikan kerja-kerja di tapak pembinaan sekiranya kawasan itu didapati menjadi tempat pembiakan nyamuk aedes.

Yang Dipertua MPKj, Mohd. Sayuthi Bakar berkata, langkah itu bagi menghalang pertambahan kes denggi di kawasan pentadbiran pihak berkuasa tempatan itu.

Menurutnya, pemaju perlu mematuhi arahan yang ditetapkan termasuk menjalankan kerja-kerja

pembersihan dan tidak meninggalkan bekas yang menyebabkan air bertakung.

"Sejak awal Januari sehingga 7 Februari lalu, Kajang mencatat sebanyak 1,044 kes demam denggi dan lima kematian sekali gus menjadi daerah kedua tertinggi selepas daerah Petaling.

"Jumlah *hot spot* denggi juga turut bertambah kepada 41 lokasi berbanding 11 lokasi sebelum ini melibatkan Kajang dan Cheras," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian dalam sidang akhbar selepas memengerusikan Mesyuarat Bulanan MPKj di Menara MPKj di sini, baru-baru ini.

Menurut Sayuthi, sehubungan itu MPKj akan menjalankan Operasi Bersepadu Denggi bermula 7 Mac ini di beberapa lokasi panas iaitu Seksyen 3, Bandar Baru Bangi dan Seksyen 3, Bandar Seri Putera, Bangi.

"Operasi itu akan turut melibatkan Jabatan Kesihatan Hulu Langat dan Jabatan Kerja Raya. Kita juga mengalu-alukan penyertaan orang ramai dalam operasi tersebut," katanya. 27

Two Thanabalans shot in separate incidents 3

PETALING JAYA: Two drive-by shootings – one in Kajang and another in Sungai Petani – have raised fears of renewed gangland violence, which had been on the wane since *Ops Cantas* was launched in 2013. Ironically, both victims were called Thanabalan.

In Kajang, Hulu Langat MIC deputy youth leader Thanabalan Muniandy, 38, was seriously wounded when he was shot near a traffic light junction along Jalan Reko here at about 12.50pm yesterday. He was on the phone with his nephew at the time.

Police sources said two men on a motorcycle pulled up alongside Thanabalan's Honda Accord. The pillion rider got off the machine, walked to Thanabalan's vehicle and fired six shots. Five bullets hit the driver's window and one struck the front mirror. The two then fled the scene.

Thanabalan was sent to Hospital Kajang for treatment by family members. He was later transferred to Hospital Serdang for surgery.

According to Thanabalan's older brother Kalai Arasu, the nephew alerted Thanabalan's family when he heard the gunshots on his phone.

"Thanabalan was screaming 'they are shooting me! They are shooting me!' and the nephew called for help," said Kalai Arasu.

"Thanabalan had just left our brother's house



in Taman Kajang Utama and was heading towards the Silk Highway. He was stuck in a traffic jam when he was ambushed," he explained.

Kalai Arasu, who is the Hulu Langat MIC chairman, said Thanabalan suffered injuries to his face, chest and right arm but was in stable condition.

"My brother has no enemies. I have no idea who did this to him, but I suspect it could have been out of jealousy."

In Sungai Petani, a 34-year-old car wash owner was shot dead in his car just as he arrived home in Jalan Lecongan Timur, Taman Sri Gedung. S. Thanabalan (pic) was shot seven times at 12.15am.

Kuala Muda OCPD Asst Comm Khalil Ariffin said four men in a white Perodua Myvi had tailed Thanabalan earlier.

"Thanabalan died on the spot."

His body was sent to Sultan Abdul Halim Hospital here for post-mortem.

One of Thanabalan's family members, identified only as Appo, 25, said Thanabalan was returning home after sending his wife and a son to his mother's house in Taman Intan here.

Ops Cantas led to a reduction in crime, especially gangland warfare, when it began two years ago. Thousands were nabbed in that operation which was launched after a spate of gangland activities. Lately, there has been a resurgence of such activity in the country, especially in Klang, where several men have been killed.

'Clean up your act'

Council supervisors told to ensure high standards of service and hygiene

SUPERVISORS in charge of street cleaning and garbage collection in all local authorities will be held responsible to ensure high service standards by contractors.

Selangor Economic Planning Unit - Local Authority Section deputy director Johary Anuar said grass cutting, de-silting of drains and garbage collection must be performed to the highest possible standards.

"Supervisors must ensure the contractual requirements are met and improve their monitoring of contractors," he said.

Under the Total Clean PBT programme, Selangor Menteri Besar Azmin Ali had instructed all local authorities to ensure cleanliness and garbage collection are given top priority.

The state government has allocated RM31.2mil to all local authorities to ensure a cleaner environment. Each assemblyman has been given RM10,000 each month over a three-month period to conduct activities like *gotong-royong*.

Johary added to overcome the problem of illegal dumping of rubbish or bulk waste, supervisors need to engage local residents to come up with a schedule for collection and also ensure that bins are located in the right place.

Petaling Jaya City Council (MBPJ) Solid Waste Management and Public Cleaning Department director Lee Lih-Shyan said supervisors must meet regularly with contractors.

"We do provide operational and follow-up support in case of any failure by contractors.

"Those who consistently fail to meet standards will be given the boot," he

said, adding that individuals must also play their part to keep PJ clean.

"Most of the litter comprises items such as tissue paper and plastic bottles thrown by irresponsible people on the road instead of in the bins provided," he said.

Azmin had expressed disappointment over the state of cleanliness in Port Klang in October 2014.

This resulted in Klang Municipal Council (MPK) president Datuk Mohammad Yacob ordering cleaning supervisors to improve their standard of service.

He said cleanliness, rubbish collection, clogged drains and poor landscaping would be tackled in stages.

"Once the lists of supervisors are confirmed, MPK would give out their contact numbers so that residents can contact them directly.

"All supervisors must settle the problem at the area level and ensure service standards improve," added Mohammad Yacob.

He said his plan to restore the image of Klang and Port Klang can be achieved with support from all stakeholders.

"We are just asking people to be civic-minded and not litter or dump bulk waste on roadsides," he said.

Big plans for Ampang Jaya

New council president working towards providing residents with better facilities and services

NEWLY-appointed Ampang Jaya Municipal Council (MPAJ) president Abdul Hamid Hussain wants to make the area a better place for residents.

As such, he is making improved infrastructure and cleanliness a top priority.

"This year, we are enforcing the ruling that all landed properties must provide a covered dustbin on their premises.

"Those who fail to do so will receive a warning notice and if they still do not comply, we can penalise them with a maximum compound notice of RM1,000.

"For flats and low-cost housing, we have ordered 600 dustbins with a 500l capacity.

"We will also provide dumpsters at commercial districts around Ampang Jaya to ensure cleanliness in the vicinity is maintained," he said, adding that action will be taken against those who dump illegally.

New infrastructure projects are also in the pipeline in addition to improving current facilities.

"We received an RM38mil allocation from the state government for road resurfacing work to begin by early March.

"We also plan to upgrade the old drainage systems.

"We will also construct a 3km jogging track and a special bicycle lane at Taman Tun Abdul Razak with a RM2mil allocation for residents to carry out recreational activities.

"Multipurpose halls at Ukay

Perdana costing RM700,000, Lembah Jaya (RM500,000) and Cheras Hartamas (RM1.1mil) are all already under construction and should be ready by mid-year.

"The Cheras Hartamas hall will be the size of three badminton courts to provide residents more space for their community activities."

"We will also begin construction of a stadium at Pandan Perdana at Jalan 6/2 Pandan Perdana.

"The total project is estimated to cost RM10mil, but the initial phase will start by June this year."

Pandan Indah will also see a new hawker centre as Abdul Hamid plans to relocate the numerous hawker stalls around Ampang Jaya. "We are working to relocate the hawker stalls into a proper centre with better facilities in Pandan Indah.

"There will be space for about 30 units and the centre is expected to cost RM5mil.

"With an additional allocation of RM600,000 from the state government, we are also planning to build another hawker centre at Taman Dagang near the Maluri LRT station, which should be able to accommodate 15 stalls," said

Abdul Hamid.

Having served as the Petaling Jaya City Council assistant secretary for five years, Sepang Municipal Council secretary for five years and as MPAJ secretary prior to being appointed, the 48-year-old said he aims to improve the administration system.

"Our current pay-and-display parking system under Suasana Efektif has been giving problems as the ticket dispensing machines have not been well maintained and we may change to a coupon system.

"Due to the large volume of enquiries on the status of applications as well as complaints, we will be implementing a call centre to efficiently handle queries from Ampang Jaya residents.

"Thanks to the RM100,000 allocation from the Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government Ministry, we will be able to improve our administrative efficiency," he said, adding that the call centre should be in place by April this year.

Abdul Hamid hopes to increase the council's engagement with Ampang Jaya residents through various programmes and activities.

"I hope that the residents will

look after the infrastructure we have provided for them.

"Vandalism is rampant and I hope with the residents' cooperation, we can reduce the cost of maintaining facilities such as children's playgrounds and parks.

"Since we have created comfortable spaces for the community, they should also play their part by looking after these facilities."

Eateries ordered closed

Klang council acts against establishments for flouting food safety regulations

SEVERAL eateries have been ordered closed by the Klang Municipal Council (MPK) in an ongoing operation to check food safety and hygiene.

"Action was taken for violations such as cockroach infestation, rat droppings, not maintaining food temperature, preparing food in back lanes and dirty toilets," said MPK Corporate Communications director Norfiza Mahfiz.

She added that the operation began in December last year and 21 food establishments were ordered closed that month.

"Eleven other eateries saw their hygiene grading lowered while others were issued with compound notices for various food safety violations.

"We will continue with our operations to ensure that all eateries conform to food safety standards.

"Spot checks are needed to prevent

water-borne diseases such as cholera and typhoid," she added.

Health Department officers checked to see how food was prepared, cooked, reheated and stored.

The cleanliness of the premises, lighting, ventilation and utensils were also scrutinised, she said.

Norfiza added that the majority of complaints about the state of cleanliness in eateries were received over the phone.

She added that many pointed out that workers in restaurants in Bandar Bukit Tinggi used the back lanes to prepare food and this had led to a worsening rodent problem.

"Health inspectors are worried that such unhygienic practices will lead to food poisoning as contamination risks are high," she said, adding that MPK would ensure that pest control activities were heightened in areas in Bandar Bukit Tinggi that were closer to restaurants.

"Eateries must also implement their own pest control treatment.

"MPK will also check if foreigners working as food handlers have been vaccinated," she added.

All set for dry days ahead

Selangor Fire and Rescue Department takes proactive approach to tackle bushfires

THE Selangor Fire and Rescue Department is taking a more proactive strategy this year in combating fire outbreaks, bearing in mind last year's peat fires and the predictions for March to be an especially dry month.

State director Othman Abdullah said there would be Fire and Rescue teams roving with personnel from other state bodies and agencies, such as local government authorities as well as the Forestry Department.

"Currently, the only place with anything approaching a large-scale forest fire is about 10 to 12 hectares in Kuala Langat, which has been controlled with help from the State Secretariat and the Kuala Langat District council," said Othman.

Other proactive steps include constructing firebreaks (large trenches to stop bushfires from spreading) in other potential bushfire areas such as Kuala Selangor.

However, Othman also appealed to the public to check where they disposed combus-

tible materials, as well as farm owners who often started fires to clear their land for the new crop.

"If they need to, they can ask us for technical help so that we can ensure the fires do not rage out of control," Othman added.

However, if Fire and Rescue personnel were called back to an address more than once to extinguish the bushfire, the landowner would also be "involved" in the firefighting efforts.

Compared with the same period last year, there have been fewer bush/peat fire cases so far, due to the late rains tamping down on potentially combustible vegetation.

If need be, the state director said Selangor firefighters also have new inventions to help combat peat fires in Selangor, such as a "punch nozzle" which can help dampen underground peat layers.

"The new nozzlehead can be go straight into the ground, and it has several small holes to help disperse water efficiently," said Othman.

Ten units were put on trial during last year's peat fire season and currently, the state has more than 100 of the punch nozzles for future use.

Earlier, Othman awarded 116 Excellent Service Awards to Selangor firefighters from

all ranks in the Silver Jubilee Hall in the State Secretariat complex in Shah Alam.

The award recipients had been chosen for their 2014 service performance and efforts outside the service, such as three-time winner firefighter Mohd Amran Abdul Ghani, 38, who has represented the Selangor department in sporting events.

Similarly, it was a double blessing for Noor Fazida Tina, 33 who was also tapped for promotion shortly before receiving her

first award.

Former Hulu Selangor fire chief Mohd Haikal Mohd Kasni was both elated at receiving an award while also looking forward to his new posting in the national headquarters' Operations Division in Putrajaya.

"I enjoyed my time serving in Hulu Selangor for four years and now that I am in National Operations, I only hope to continue and add to the department's quality and service," said Haikal.

KALUMPANG - Penantian penduduk di Kampung KI Tin Mine sejak 40 tahun lalu bagi mendapatkan hak pemilikan tanah, berakhir apabila mereka menerima Borang 5A atas keprihatinan Kerajaan Negeri Selangor.

Menurut seorang penduduk, M Muthukrishnan, 68, dia berasa amat bersyukur dengan inisiatif yang diambil itu memandangkan selama ini pihaknya menyangka masalah itu tidak akan dapat diselesaikan.

"Terima kasih kepada kerajaan negeri kerana membantu merealisasi-

kan impian kami yang telah menetap di sini sejak 40 tahun lalu," katanya.

Menurut Muthukrishnan, sebelum ini, beberapa permohonan telah dibuat bagi mendapatkan hak pemilikan tanah tersebut, namun ia tidak menunjukkan sebarang perkembangan memberangsangkan.

Kesal tanaman kelapa sawit

Pekebun dakwa alami kerugian kira-kira RM5,000 selepas hasil tanaman disabotaj

SUNGAITINGGI - Seorang pekebun berasa resah apabila tanah miliknya di petak 13(PT1085) di sini sering diceroboh pihak tidak bertanggungjawab dan bertindak merosakkan tanaman kelapa sawit yang diusahakan sejak beberapa tahun lalu.

Pekebun, Wong Swee Ming, 68, berkata, tanah yang diusahakan itu adalah milik anaknya dan ia telah diberikan Lesen Pendudukan Sementara (Tol) oleh Pejabat Daerah Hulu Selangor (PDTHS) sejak tahun 2004 lagi.

Namun, Swee Ming mendakwa ada pihak tidak berpuas hati dan beberapa kali bertindak meracun semua tanaman kelapa sawit miliknya.

"Sebelum ini, saya telah beberapa kali berdepan masalah ini dan kejadian terbaru adalah pada 15 Februari lalu," katanya kepada *Sinar Harian*.

Dalam kejadian yang berlaku baru-baru ini, Swee Ming memaklumkan bahawa kira-

kira 30 batang pokok kelapa sawit yang ditanamnya mati akibat diracun.

Swee Ming mendakwa, pihaknya mempercayai kegiatan itu dilakukan pada waktu malam dengan tujuan untuk mensabotaj semua tanaman yang diusahakan itu.

"Anak saya meminta saya untuk mengusahakan tanah ini daripada dibiarkan terbiar.

"Namun, ada pihak yang tidak berpuas hati dan beranggapan bahawa lot berkenaan adalah bukan milik kami. Malah, mereka juga telah beberapa kali meracun tanaman kelapa sawit yang ditanam dan memberi kerugian buat kami," katanya.

Swee Ming berkata, pihaknya mempunyai segala dokumen lengkap bagi mengesahkan lot berkenaan adalah milik anaknya berdasarkan pembayaran lesen Tol di PDTHS sebelum ini.

Menurutnya, pihaknya turut mengalami kerugian se-

banyak kira-kira RM5,000 disebabkan oleh tindakan pihak tidak bertanggungjawab yang merosakkan tanaman miliknya sebelum ini.

"Kami sekeluarga pun tak tahu kenapa tanah ini di-

ceroboh sedangkan ia memang milik kami.

"Saya tidak mengesyaki mana-mana pihak dalam hal ini memandangkan tidak pernah berdendam dengan sesiapa sebelum ini," katanya.

Bimbang dengan keadaan itu, Swee Ming memaklumkan bahawa pihaknya telah membuat laporan di Balai Polis Bukit Sentosa bagi mengelakkan kejadian sedemikian berulang pada masa depan.

Roboh jika masih degil

MPK ambil tindakan terhadap premis yang pasang struktur binaan tanpa kebenaran

KLANG - Majlis Perbandaran Klang (MPK) akan meneruskan tindakan perobohan struktur binaan tanpa kebenaran menerusi operasi bersepadu seperti mana yang dilaksanakan tahun lepas.

Yang Dipertua MPK, Datuk Mohammad Yacob berkata, sebanyak 23 struktur binaan tanpa kebenaran dirobohkan pada 2014 melibatkan kedai makan, premis mencuci kenderaan, bengkel, papan iklan, tanjakan dan stor simpanan kayu sekitar kawasan ini.

Katanya, tahun ini sebanyak enam struktur binaan haram sudah dirobohkan.

"Ia melibatkan gerai, premis mencuci kenderaan, khemah dan pelbagai struktur lain bermula Januari lalu.

"MPK akan terus mengadakan operasi seperti itu terhadap mana-mana struktur yang dibina tanpa

kebenaran majlis bagi memastikan peruntukan undang-undang mengikut Akta Parit, Jalan dan Bangunan (Akta 133) dipatuhi oleh semua pihak," katanya.

Menurutnya, operasi yang diadakan itu juga lebih kepada memberi peringatan kepada warga Klang agar menghormati perundangan yang ditetapkan berkaitan struktur yang didirikan terutamanya di kawasan ini.

"Kita juga akan melaksanakan beberapa siri operasi dan juga tindakan penguatkuasaan perobohan ke atas salah satu bangunan dalam masa terdekat dan premis tersebut sudah dikenal pasti.

"Operasi yang dijalankan ini juga berdasarkan aduan awam terutamanya daripada penduduk setempat yang membantah kewujudan premis haram di kawasan itu dan meminta tindakan tegas terhadap pihak yang terlibat dilakukan," katanya. 37

Kos bersih tapak Thaipusam tinggi

SELAYANG - Jumlah RM80,000 hasil kutipan sewa tapak gerai untuk sambutan Thaipusam awal bulan lalu tidak cukup untuk menampung kos pembersihan sepanjang sambutan.

Yang Dipertua Majlis Perbandaran Selayang (MPS), Mohd Azizi Mohd Zain berkata, sebanyak RM130,000 dibelanjakan untuk tujuan itu dengan kuantiti mencecah 400 tan menyamai kutipan harian seluruh Selayang.

Menurutnya, sepanjang tempoh sambutan juga, sekurang-kurangnya 400 unit penjaja dikesan menjalankan perniagaan tanpa kebenaran melibatkan nilai kutipan RM5,000.

"Meskipun kuantiti sampah menurun tapi kos urus sampah masih tinggi dan terpaksa keluar kos tambahan untuk pembersihan.

"Bil caj permit sebanyak RM5,000 yang dikenakan terhadap kuil juga masih tidak dijelaskan kini memasuki tahun keempat," katanya kepada *Sinar Harian*.

Bagaimanapun katanya, kempen penggunaan pinggan cawan kertas membantu pengurangan sampah.

"Sedikit sebanyak program itu membantu, jika dikuatkuasakan jumlahnya mampu dikurangkan. Terdapat aduan tong sampah tidak cukup tapi pemeriksaan mendapati kemudahan itu disalahgunakan dan ada antara peniagagunakannya untuk letak barang," katanya.

Asap tebal mengganggu penglihatan pemanduan, penduduk bimbang kebakaran berterusan

PULAU CAREY - Kebakaran melibatkan sisa pepejal bahan plastik di sebuah kilang petang kelmarin mencetuskan kebimbangan penduduk apabila kepulan asap tebal masih kelihatan hingga pagi semalam.

Ketua Balai Bomba Banting, Mohd Jaslizad Jalil ketika dihubungi mengesahkan sehingga jam 8 pagi semalam kepulan asap masih dapat dilihat di beberapa kawasan sekitar dan kerja-kerja pemadaman masih dilakukan.

Menurutnya, kejadian berlaku kira-kira jam 2.45 petang itu apabila kebakaran melibatkan sisa pepejal sebuah kilang dengan jarak 50 kaki dari bangunan kilang tersebut.

"Pada awalnya saya menerima maklumat daripada orang awam memaklumkan terdapat kepulan asap tebal di udara sehingga menyebabkan

keadaan lalu lintas di sekitar Pulau Carey menjadi kabur.

"Kebakaran yang mulanya dianggap tidak serius itu menjadi kerisauan penduduk. Dipercayai kebakaran melibatkan kawasan sisa pepejal bahan plastik seluas 150 x 450

kaki persegi," katanya.

Jaslizad berkata, sehingga semalam, kerja-kerja pemadaman masih dilakukan bagi mengelakkan ianya merebak kerana bahan plastik mudah terbakar.

Katanya, proses pe-

madaman melibatkan empat buah jentera dengan kekuatan 23 anggota bomba termasuk dari Balai Bomba Banting, Pelabuhan Klang dan Andalas dikerahkan ke lokasi. Enam pancutan nozel digunakan dengan jarak keseluruhan

1500 kaki dari sumber air terbuka di Sungai Langat.

"Bagaimanapun, kita harap orang awam terutama pemandu jalan raya tidak menyebarkan berita palsu sehingga menyebabkan kekeliruan dalam masyarakat.

"Pelbagai maklumat diterima mengenai insiden kebakaran yang berlaku kelmarin sehingga penduduk bimbang kebakaran itu boleh menyebabkan berlakunya kebakaran yang lebih besar," katanya. 38

Penduduk gesa bina bonggol

BUKIT SENTOSA - Walaupun sudah dua tahun Jalan Seroja dibuka, terdapat lebih empat kes kemalangan pernah dicatatkan berlaku di sini sebelum ini.

Difahamkan, keadaan tersebut berlaku berkemungkinan disebabkan ketiadaan bonggol dan memberi kesempatan buat pengguna lalu lintas memandu secara laju.

Pengerusi Persatuan Penduduk Taman Seroja 3, Noor Azam Halal berkata, sebelum ini, pihaknya pernah memohon kepada Majlis Daerah Hulu Selangor (MDHS) untuk membina bonggol namun sehingga kini masih belum tiada sebarang tindakan diambil.

"Jalan ini sepanjang kira-kira lebih 300 meter dan tidak ada sebarang bonggol jalan dibina.

"Disebabkan jalan lurus, jadi bila motor lalu mereka sering menunggang dengan laju dan mengundang bahaya kepada pengguna lain," katanya.

Menurut Azam, kali terakhir kes kemalangan berlaku adalah melibatkan penunggang motosikal dengan sebuah lori dan mangsa mengalami putus jari kanan dalam kejadian itu.

Justeru, Azam menggesa pihak berkaitan memandang serius perkara ini dan menyegerakan pembinaan bonggol di laluan itu. 42
