NGO-i diminta berani perbetul tuduhan musuh

» Pertahan agama Islam daripada fahaman menyimpang

Badan Pertubuhan Islam Bukan Kerajaan (NGO-i) yang berdaftar disaraskan bergerak lebih aktif untuk mempertahankan sebarang salah tanggapan yang dilontarkan oleh musuh Islam.

Ia kerana banyak hal berkaitan Islam disalahertikan golongan

berkenaan, namun tiada mana-mana pihak terutama NGO-i yang tampil bagi menyuarakan pendapat serta memberikan penjelasan kepada masyarakat.

Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Penyelepasan NGO-i Majlis Agama Islam Selangor (MAIS), Datuk Mohd Shukri Dahlan berkata, tidak banyak NGO-i yang berani menyatakan pendirian dan membentulkan kenyataan tidak benar berkaitan Islam.

"Jadi, NGO-i harus bangun mempertahankan agama Islam selain bersama-sama membantu kerajaan mempertahankan fahaman yang menyimpang daripada ajaran Ahli Sunah Wal Jamaah.

"Ia perlu kerana sejak kebelakangan ini, umat Islam di negara ini dilihat suka berbalah dan keadaan ini menimbulkan keimbangan kerana ia boleh membawa kepada perpecahan," katanya ke-

tika ditemui selepas merasmikan Majlis Penutup dan Penyerahan Sumbangan Dana NGO-i di Bangunan Mahkamah Syariah Selangor, di sini, semalam.

Gerakan dakwah
Pada majlis berkenaan, sebanyak 75 NGO-i yang berdaftar dengan MAIS bagi memperkasa gerakan dakwah dan membangunkan sahsiah umat Islam, menerima

sumbangan dana antara RM10,000 sehingga RM20,000 untuk tujuan berkenaan.

Mohd Shukri berkata, bantuan itu adalah sumbangan fasa kedua yang membabitkan jumlah keseluruhan dana kira-kira RM1 juta.

Katanya, bantuan untuk fasa pertama sebanyak RM550,000 dengan menggunakan dana Lemba Zakat Selangor (LZS) sudah

diberikan sebelum ini, dengan jumlah keseluruhan sumbangan disalurkan kepada NGO-i berkenaan adalah RM1.5 juta.

Antara NGO-i yang menerima sumbangan adalah Pertubuhan Ahli Sunnah Wal Jamaah Malaysia sebanyak RM10,000, Persatuan Kebangsaan Pelajar Islam Malaysia (RM10,000) dan Persatuan Institusi Tahfiz al-Quran Negeri Selangor (RM15,000).

NGO Islam jangan berpeluk tubuh - Shukri

SHAH ALAM 7 Jan. - Pertubuhan bukan kerajaan (NGO) Islam terutama di negeri ini diminta bangkit mempertahankan kesucian agama apabila timbul sesuatu isu supaya tiada pihak yang tidak bertanggungjawab mengambil kesempatan memperlekehkan Islam.

Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Penyelarasan Pertubuhan NGO Islam, Datuk Mohd. Shukri Dahlan berkata, tidak sepatutnya pertubuhan sedemikian yang menerima dana Majlis Agama Islam Selangor (MAIS) mengambil sikap berpeluk tubuh dan berdiam diri apabila Islam cuba diperkotak-katikkan.

Menurutnya, mereka perlu mencontohi NGO bukan Islam yang

lantang mempertahankan agama masing-masing setiap kali timbul isu.

"Apabila kesucian agama Islam dipersoalkan termasuk dalam isu kalimah Allah, kita mengharapkan NGO Islam memainkan peranan mempertahankannya.

"Selain itu, isu undang-undang khalwat yang dibawa oleh kumpulan bekas penjawat awam, G25 perlu juga dipertahankan oleh kita. Jika bukan kita yang mempertahankan undang-undang tersebut, siapa lagi yang harus melakukannya," soalnya.

Beliau berkata demikian ketika berucap dalam majlis penyampaian dana kepada NGO Islam di sini hari

ini.

Mengulas mengenai pemberian dana tersebut, beliau menjelaskan, sumbangan berkenaan perlu dimanfaatkan untuk aktiviti-aktiviti memperkuatkannya perpaduan umat Islam, bukan sebaliknya.

"Hari ini sebanyak 75 NGO menerima sumbangan dana antara RM10,000 hingga RM20,000 untuk menjalankan aktiviti masing-masing.

"Bantuan ini adalah bantuan fasih kedua melibatkan wang zakat sebanyak RM1.03 juta yang mana sebelum ini sebanyak RM550,000 disampaikan bagi memperkasa dan membangunkan sahsiah umat Islam," katanya.

PAN Selangor bertegas mahu 24 wakilnya dilantik ahli majlis PBT

SHAH ALAM 7 Jan. - PAN negeri tetap bertegas dengan pendirian mahukan sekurang-kurangnya 24 wakilnya dilantik sebagai ahli majlis pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT) meskipun kerajaan PKR Selangor memperuntukkan 10 jawatan tersebut kepada parti itu semalam.

Pengerusinya, Izham Hashim berkata, penerimaan keputusan itu tidak menghalang pihaknya untuk menuntut lebih lagi bilangan jawatan sebagaimana yang dibincangkan sebelum ini selain akan terus mengadakan rundingan dengan kerajaan negeri.

"Nak kata kita puas hati (kerajaan negeri peruntukkan 10 jawatan), memanglah kita tidak puas hati. Asalnya memang lapan, namun semalam tambah lagi dua jawatan melibatkan PBT di Kuala Langat dan Sepang.

"Buat masa ini kita terima dahulu keputusan kerajaan negeri itu dan kita akan teruskan rundingan dan perbincangan dengan kerajaan negeri untuk penambahan jawatan," katanya kepada Utusan Malaysia di sini hari ini.

Dalam pada itu, Izham turut mahu kerajaan negeri menimbang pelantikan lebih ramai wakil PAN untuk jawatan Pengurusi Jawatankuasa Kemajuan dan Keselamatan Kampung (JKKK) bagi memberi peluang mereka terlibat bersama dalam pentadbiran negeri.

"Kita tidak mahu tuntut jawatan Exco (Ahli Mesyuarat Kerajaan Negeri) buat masa ini meskipun kita ada dua ADUN (Ahli Dewan Undangan Negeri). Sebaliknya kita kekal den-

gan pelantikan sedia ada, mungkin penggal depan jika ada barulah kita pertimbangkan jawatan itu kepada wakil kita.

"Kita tidak mahu tuntut sekarang kerana kita tidak mahu pecahkan pentadbiran negeri yang sedia ada," jelasnya.

Dalam pada itu, Izham menyatakan, pihaknya tidak peduli pendirian Pas negeri yang tetap enggan mengiktiraf PAN meskipun parti berkenaan mendapat tambahan tiga lagi jawatan ahli majlis PBT menjadikan jumlah keseluruhan 70.

"Kita tidak kisah pandangan mereka (Pas) terhadap kita. Mereka dapat lebih mereka kritik kita, mereka dapat kurang, mereka kritik kita juga. Sebenarnya mereka tidak suka kita," jelasnya.

Semalam, kerajaan negeri mengumumkan lapan kerusi ahli majlis PBT di negeri ini di peruntukan kepada PAN bagi penggal baharu bermula 15 Januari ini sehingga 31 Disember 2017.

Menurut Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Tetap Kerajaan Tempatan, Permutihan Kilang Haram dan Pembangunan Kampung Baru negeri, Ean Yong Hian Wah, Pas, DAP dan PKR telah bersetuju dengan perkara itu semasa mesyuarat Exco yang dipengerusikan Menteri Besar, Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali.

Bagaimanapun, penambahan jawatan ahli majlis PBT menyebabkan DAP dan PKR masing-masing terpaksa mengorbankan sebahagian kuota jawatan tersebut yang sebelum ini diisi oleh wakil-wakil mereka.

RM10 juta peruntukan tambahan sedia bas percuma di Selangor

AMPANG JAYA 7 Jan. - Kerajaan negeri Selangor akan menyediakan peruntukan tambahan sebanyak RM10 juta bagi memperluaskan perkhidmatan Bas Smart Selangor di kawasan pinggir dan luar bandar seperti di Selayang, Kuala Kubu Bharu dan Sabak Bernam menjelang akhir tahun ini.

Menteri Besarnya, Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali berkata, langkah itu dapat menyepakati seluruh perkhidmatan pengangkutan awam di Selangor secara lebih efektif dan berkesan dengan kadar tambang yang berpatutan.

"Kerajaan negeri mahukan nisbah ini disemak semula dengan nisbah penggunaan pengangkutan awam ditingkatkan kepada 60:40 (pengangkutan awam : kenderaan sendiri) berbanding sebelum ini 40:60.

"Saya berharap bas percuma ini akan memberi manfaat kepada penduduk terutamanya mereka yang memerlukan pengangkutan awam untuk urusan harian sekali gus dapat mengurangkan kos sara hidup," katanya dalam sidang akbar selepas melancarkan Bas Smart Selangor yang menghubungkan antara Jalan Ukay Perdana dan Jalan Melawati di sini.

hidup," katanya dalam sidang akbar selepas melancarkan Bas Smart Selangor yang menghubungkan antara Jalan Ukay Perdana dan Jalan Melawati di sini.

Dalam pada itu, Mohamed Azmin berkata, sebanyak RM2.5 juta telah diperuntukkan untuk

tujuan penyediaan kemudahan tersebut di dua kawasan iaitu di Ampang dan Kajang.

Bagaimanapun menurutnya, jumlah tersebut akan melibatkan peruntukan tambahan lain untuk diperluaskan ke kawasan-kawasan pedalaman berhampiran.

Katanya, perkhidmatan bas yang menghubungkan antara Jalan Ukay Perdana dan Jalan Taman Melawati sejauh 18 kilometer itu melibatkan kekerapan 15 dan 20 minit sehari.

"Bas ini juga akan melalui Jalan Ukay Perdana, Jalan Sungai Sering, Jalan Mulia 1/1 dan Jalan Riana Ukay.

"Turut terlibat Jalan Riana Ukay 1, Jalan Ukay Indah, Lorong Sering 5, Jalan AU 4/2, Jalan AU 5, Persiaran Permata dan Jalan Taman Melawati," ujarnya.

Bas yang beroperasi pada pukul 6 pagi hingga 10 malam setiap hari dengan kapasiti 60 penumpang itu dilengkapi kemudahan WiFi, sistem kamera litar tertutup dan mesra golongan kurang upaya (OKU). Katanya.

Kuala Lumpur: Pertubuhan Islam bukan kerajaan (NGO-i) perlu berani tampil ke depan bersama pertubuhan bukan kerajaan (NGO) lain dalam menyuarakan pandangan berkenaan isu membabitkan agama.

Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Penyelarasan NGO-i Majlis Agama Islam Selangor (MAIS) Datuk Mohd Shukri Dahlan berkata, NGO-i seharusnya terus bangkit dalam memberi pandangan bukan saja membabitkan umat Islam tapi pandangan konservatif dalam isu ter-

tentu seperti G25.

“Ini bagi mengelakkan berlakunya percanggahan pendapat yang boleh menyumbang ke arah perpecahan pendapat dalam kalangan rakyat.

“Sekiranya NGO boleh bersatu dalam menyampaikan maklumat serta bekerjasama dengan baik, ia boleh membentuk masyarakat yang bersatu padu,” katanya ketika ditemui di Jabatan Kehakiman Syariah Selangor sempena Majlis Penutup Perayaan Dana NGO-i MAIS Fasa II, di sini, semalam.

SHAH ALAM- Parti Amanah Negara (Amanah) Selangor sepertinya bersyukur diberikan lapan kerusi untuk ahli majlis pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT).

Naib Pengerusi DAP Selangor, Datuk Teng Chang Khim berkata, jika Amanah berhasrat menambah kuota, mereka dinasihatkan untuk tunggu sehingga penggal depan.

"Amanah haruslah bersyukur kita bahagi lapan ke-

rusi PBT dulu.

"Keputusan Majlis Mesyuarat Kerajaan Negeri (MMKN) kelmarin itu dia muktamid, tidak akan ada lagi rundingan untuk Amanah tambah kerusi. Kalau tak puas hati, tunggulah penggal akan datang," katanya ketika dijumpai di pejabatnya, semalam.

Beliau yang juga Ahli Jawatankuasa DAP Pusat mengesahkan, kerajaan negeri tidak tergugat dengan gertakan Amanah untuk menolak tawaran sekiranya tidak diberi ikan minimum 24 kuota kerusi.

"Kerajaan negeri tak kisah kalau Amanah tak mahu terima tawaran lapan kerusi PBT berkenaan. Kita akan serah-

kan semula kepada PKR, Pas dan DAP untuk uruskan seperti sebelumnya.

"Kita tak ada masa untuk layan semua ini. Lagipun tak nak timbul gangguan tugas harian peringkat PBT, buat masa ini terimalah dulu lapan kerusi itu. Tapi kita harap Amanah dapat berikan kerjasama yang baik bagi meneruskan kelangsungan Pakatan Harapan," katanya.

Chang Khim yang juga Exco Pelaburan Perindustrian dan Perdagangan, Industri Kecil dan Sederhana (IKS) dan Pengangkutan menyifatkan kenyataan Pas bawah parti Islam itu tidak akan mengiktiraf ahli majlis daripada Amanah sebagai cakap

emosi semata-mata.

"Itu (Pas) hanya cakap emosi kononnya tidak mahu mengiktiraf ahli majlis Amanah.

"Pengiktirafan ahli majlis datang daripada undang-undang kerana kerajaan negeri lebih berkuasa," katanya.

Adun Sungai Pinang itu berkata, Menteri Besar, Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali tidak terdesak dan tidak berdepan dilema dalam kontroversi pembahagian kuota kerusi PBT untuk Amanah.

"Azmin tidak terdesak walaupun memang ada permintaan. Memang ada pihak mendesak, tapi Azmin tidak terdesak," katanya.

SABAK BERNAM - Majlis Daerah Sabak Bernam (MDSB) menerima secara terbuka keputusan kerajaan negeri melantik ahli Parti Amanah Negara (Amanah) menganggotai kerusi Ahli Majlis Pihak Berkuasa Tempatan (PBT) di Sabak Bernam.

Yang Dipertuanya, Azlinda Azman berkata, pelantikan ahli majlis itu adalah di bawah bidang kuasa kerajaan negeri.

"PBT hanya menerima keputusan dasar dari pucuk pimpinan negeri. Kita tunggu senarai nama yang dikeluarkan kerajaan negeri untuk proses angkat sumpah melaksanakan tugas ahli majlis dalam masa terdekat."

Azlinda berkata, parti komponen manapun yang dilantik sebagai ahli majlis, yang penting mereka perlu berkhidmat kepada masyarakat dengan sebaik mungkin disamping tidak meninggalkan kepentingan MDSB.

"Dari parti mana pun ahli majlis ini di-

lantik, kita berharap mereka memberi perkhidmatan terbaik. Kepentingan awam perlu diutamakan dalam melaksanakan tugas sebagai ahli majlis," katanya.

Sebelum ini, sebanyak 25 kerusi Ahli Majlis Daerah Sabak Bernam terdiri daripada Yang Dipertua, Orang Besar Daerah dan komponen parti dari PKR (8), DAP (7), Pas (6) dan pertubuhan bukan kerajaan NGO (2).

Semalam, Pengurus Jawatankuasa Tetap Kerajaan Tempatan, Pemutihan Kilang Haram dan Pembangunan Kampung Baru Negeri, Ean Yong Hian Wah dilaporkan berkata, lapan kerusi Ahli Majlis PBT negeri ini diperuntukkan kepada Amanah bagi penggal baharu bermula 16 Januari ini sehingga penghujung 2017.

Antara kerusi yang diperuntukkan kepada Amanah termasuklah di Sabak Bernam selain di Sepang, Kuala Langat, Kuala Selangor dan Hulu Selangor.

Major upgrade for Kelana Jaya park

MBPJ open to public feedback and suggestions

TAMAN Bandaran Kelana Jaya will be undergoing major upgrade works this year, with the Petaling Jaya City Council (MBPJ) setting aside a budget of RM1.5mil for the project.

The 42ha park, also known as Kelana Jaya park, was in a deplorable state with several abandoned structures in it.

MBPJ landscape director Zuraidah Sainan said the park would be beau-

tified and youth-related sporting facilities will be installed to attract more visitors.

She said the park, which is next to the council's swimming pool and the Kelana Jaya stadium, would also undergo a "Total Park Project".

This facility will include sporting-related equipment and infrastructure suitable for parkour, which is an extreme sport of running, jumping and climbing through an area while negotiating obstacles by running, jumping, climbing.

However, the council was still open to public feedback and urged those interested to send their ideas via www.facebook.com/TamanBandaranKelanaJaya.

"We want to provide facilities that interest the public. We want to hear

their views and would consider implementing suitable ideas," Zuraidah said.

Besides the recreational facilities, the council hopes the park could become a popular garden wedding spot.

The upgrade works would take place in stages and it is estimated that works could start in May and be completed by December.

The vacant and vandalised restaurant will be converted to an open hall.

"We will break the walls of the structure but retain the roof. It will become a space where you can organise events such as wedding receptions," Zuraidah said.

As for the abandoned fountain,

the structure will be retrofitted into

a stage. The council has been hosting the powerboat challenge competition in the lake for the past few years and a stage would complement such events.

There are also plans to include a half-court basketball venue, an outdoor gym and table tennis facilities.

Zuraidah added that the walkways and footpaths in the park would be widened while the public toilets would be replaced.

Several other abandoned buildings in the park such as the Medan Selari and mini-food kiosks would either be demolished or removed with the help of other MBPJ departments.

According to Zuraidah, the park had been a popular area in the past but by the 1980s, it was mostly abandoned.

In 1991, the area was developed for recreational use by the council and the lakes were converted into retention ponds.

"There is only topsoil here. When it rains, the whole area turned muddy and during the hot season, the soil would harden just like concrete," she said.

Over the years, layers of suitable soil were dumped over the existing topsoil and the park is now home to some 100 species of plants.

Previously, only Acacia trees could survive there.

In the next five years, visitors can look forward to seeing 50 Tecoma trees with flowers in various shades of bloom between August and October.

"We have planted the trees but it takes about five years for them to mature."

"When the trees start flowering, we expect them to be seen from as far as the LDP," Zuraidah said.

Several other abandoned buildings in the park such as the Medan Selari and mini-food kiosks would either be demolished or removed with the help of other MBPJ departments.

According to Zuraidah, the park had been a popular area in the past but by the 1980s, it was mostly abandoned.

Neglected pond causing floods in SS4 Kelana Jaya

AN UNMAINTAINED retention pond in Jalan SS4C/1, Kelana Jaya, has been causing misery for nearby residents as muddy water spills over into their houses whenever there is a downpour.

About 30 houses located in Jalan SS4D/10 are affected and the water can be knee-deep on bad days.

SS4D Flash Flood Committee coordinator Kanisan Karuppiah, a retiree, said he feared to leave his home when it rained heavily as the water might rise and destroy his belongings.

"On Jan 5, the flood water once again entered my house.

"Last year, it happened about three times.

"Many residents have even built their own walls to prevent flood waters from entering their houses.

"I hope the authorities would come up with a permanent solution," he said.

Yesterday, residents had a meeting with Damansara Utama assemblyman Yeo Bee Yin and Petaling Jaya City Council (MPBJ) officials at Golden City Community Hall to discuss solutions to the flood woes.

Yeo said the retention pond was filled with undergrowth and silt

and not properly maintained.

"I have instructed MBPJ to clear up the silt immediately.

"It should be done by the end of this month and cost about RM37,000," she said.

MBPJ Solid Waste Management and Public Cleaning Department director Lee Lih Shyan said the contract for the area's cleaning contractor would end in March.

"The current contract did not include maintenance of the retention pond.

"When we appoint a new contractor for the job, maintaining and cleaning the retention pond will be included to ensure it is kept clean at all times," he said.

Group claims highway project cannot proceed as its EIA report has expired

THE Sungai Besi Ulu Kelang Expressway (SUKE) should not proceed because the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) report is no longer valid, says the Say No To SUKE (SNTS) group.

SNTS committee chairman Muhammad Agos Abul Hasan Ashari said the EIA report, which has a validity of two years, is one of the studies used to justify the highway development project.

"If expired, legally, this project

should not proceed without an extension.

"But even with an extension, it's very late in the day so they should conduct a new EIA study."

"The EIA report for SUKE was valid from March 20, 2013 to March 20, 2015," he said during a press conference after handing a memorandum to the Malaysian Human Rights Commission (Suhakam) on Wednesday.

According to the Department of Environment (DOE), he said, there was no request to renew the validity period of the EIA.

He added that the EIA has to be valid until the project starts.

"The project has not even started but the EIA has already expired.

"The report may not be valid

anymore because many developments had taken place since 2013," he said.

He added that some 100 residents in Ampang and Cheras have been served with land acquisition notices, which he deemed unlawful as the EIA had expired.

Agos said the residents were planning to file a judicial review this month against the "approving authorities" and not highway concessionaire Projek Lintasan Kota Holdings Sdn Bhd (Prolintas).

Earlier, he briefed Suhakam commissioner Prof Datuk Dr Aishah Bidin about the residents

being kept in the dark on the project and not properly consulted or informed.

He said the group would submit memorandum to object to the project and get the relevant authorities to talk to them and listen to their grouses.

"Please come talk to us and find a win-win situation because ultimately, we want progress for Selangor and the way for that is not through highways."

"Developed countries are judged by the forms of public transportation available and not by the highways," he said.

Recently, Selangor Mentri Besar Datuk Seri Azmin Ali reportedly said that although preliminary approval has been given to a few highways including SUKE, the state government was still open to listening to objections.

SUKE is an elevated 24.4km three-lane, dual-carriageway starting from Sri Petaling, passing through Sungai Besi, Alam Damai, Cheras-Kajang, Taman Bukit Permai, Taman Putra, Taman Permai Jaya, Taman Dagang Permai, Taman Kosas, Ampang and Taman Hillview before exiting in Ulu Kelang.

Real-time monitoring of mangrove forests starts in Selangor

SUBANG: Conservation of endangered mangrove forests has been given a boost with the start of the first real-time monitoring project in Sabak Bernam, Selangor.

The monitoring would enable the local community, researchers and authorities to observe soil conditions, humidity, water levels, temperature and air conditions of the mangrove area via an automated online cloud computing system developed by Ericsson.

Ericsson Solutions CU Malaysia and Sri Lanka vice-president Sebastian Barros said the mangrove trees were directly connected to its system via sensors and high speed mobile broadband.

"Mangroves are the crossroads between the oceans and land."

"They are one of the most complex ecosystems in the planet."

"Mangrove forests act as 'bodyguards' for the coast to defend villages from natural disasters such as tsunami or flooding."

"Unfortunately, they are under various threats and we would like to conserve it," he said yesterday.

Barros said it was estimated that almost 50% of the mangroves in Malaysia had been destroyed due to illegal logging, threats from pollution and other factors, such as fire, over the past three decades.

"It is a sad reality that in some places the coastal areas are completely naked of mangrove and open to threats such as floods

and tsunami," he said.

Besides replanting mangrove trees, the company has also successfully tracked the growth of specific trees.

"We were told by the villagers that the life expectancy rate of mangrove trees is low."

"They estimate that seven out of 10 mangrove trees planted will reach adult stage."

He said the company would use the data derived from the monitoring for future conservation and the protection of the ecosystem.

"We are looking at expanding this to other areas such as in Terengganu and Pahang," he said, adding that the company was also looking for sustainable ways to fund the pilot project.

Barros said that the technology could also be expanded to other agricultural sectors including the palm oil and rubber industries.

The company partnered with a non-governmental organisation and a local company to undertake the conservation project.





Aedes and construction sites

IT was reported recently that there was a 50% increase in deaths caused by dengue and an 11.2% increase in dengue cases in 2015 compared to 2014. This is surely cause for alarm but other than talking about possible actions, no significant measures are being taken by the relevant authorities to curb the outbreak of dengue.

The Health Ministry's head of Disease Control has actually placed the blame on poor community behaviour whereas the president of the Malaysian Medical Association said that the main breeding areas for Aedes mosquitoes were construction sites and places with lots of debris and litter.

I agree with the latter, having been a recent victim of dengue myself. A pioneer resident in Bukit Jelutong, I moved into this area in 1999. It was the first housing estate with drains that were all concealed, which meant there was no stagnant water anywhere and the area was totally free of mosquitoes.

Six months ago, a major integrated construction project started opposite the Guthrie Pavilion.

There has been a total of 30

cases of dengue with almost all victims requiring hospitalisation in the last 100 days.

I believe the construction site is the singular factor for the spread of dengue in my neighbourhood.

Has any government authority bothered to conduct a site inspection to check for breeding grounds of Aedes mosquitoes there? The Shah Alam City Council (MBSA) makes an effort to fog the area on a regular basis but not anywhere near this site.

I suggest that a stop-work order be issued and an independent body comprising officers from the local council, Health Ministry and even the Works Ministry be engaged to conduct a full investigation on the construction site to see whether it complies with the minimum safety and preventive measures. There is no need to blame the community as the situation speaks for itself.

I also wish to highlight what I personally went through as a dengue patient. I had high fever on Dec 24 and visited a local clinic twice only to be diagnosed with viral fever or lung infection even though I kept saying it might be

dengue. Finally, on Dec 28, I dragged myself to a medical centre where it was confirmed that I had dengue and a very low platelet level which required admittance in the ICU. Platelets transfusion was done only after 24 hours, however.

The Health Ministry must also seriously look into the ethical practices of private medical centres. In my case, an amount was supposedly blocked on my credit card, with a top-up required after four days. The final bill was 47% lower than the amount charged in the credit card but no refunds could be made because it was Jan 1 and a public holiday. There was no effort to contact me about the refund and it wasn't until my post-blood tests that I was able to get it.

Furthermore, the Health Ministry must embark on a dengue education campaign, specifically on what steps to take when you suspect you have dengue.

This can range from where to go for a dengue test to medical care SOP.

KUALA LUMPUR — Parti Amanah Negara (Amanah) has yet to accept the Selangor government's offer of eight local council seats, insisting on further discussions.

Selangor Amanah is apparently dissatisfied with the number of seats allocated to them as it fell short of their requested 24 seats, while also expressing disappointment over being given seats in rural areas.

"Selangor Amanah is thankful to the Selangor Pakatan Harapan government for giving room for the party to play a role at the local council level.

"But the mandate we have been given is to negotiate matters with the state government. We thank them but whether we have accepted (the eight seats) or not is another issue altogether," Selangor Amanah chairman Izham Hashim said.

"The number of seats is one issue, another issue is which local council we are being given ... they seem to be in rural areas.

"We would like representation in urban areas. They (Selangor) have to be fair to us. We have our dignity, we

are not just out to fulfill a quota, we want to make our presence felt," he said.

Yesterday, the Selangor government agreed to allocate eight local council seats to Amanah in a bid to end a deadlock over the issue before the new term for local government councils starts on Jan 16.



KUALA LUMPUR — The Batu Caves temple management claims the Selangor Municipal Council has dashed its plan to refurbish the grounds for the comfort of devotees and visitors during Thaipusam on Jan 24.

Nadarajah said about 2,000 police officers would be on duty during the festival.

"They will accompany the chariot, *paal kodam* and kavadi processions. Trouble-makers will be stopped during the festival, especially on temple grounds," he said.

He said Selangor Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Azmin Ali had been invited as the guest of honour on the eve of Thaipusam, and Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak was expected to be present at the festival.
