# Maklum PKD kes positif dalam tempoh 24 jam

Bantu pemudah cara kawalan, pencegahan dalam komuniti

**Kuala Lumpur:** Semua kes positif COVID-19 perlu dinotifikasi kepada Pejabat Kesihatan Daerah (PKD) berhampiran, dalam tempoh 24 jam bagi memudahkan cara tindakan kawalan dan pencegahan dalam komuniti dilakukan.

Susulan itu, mereka yang positif diminta menyampaikan maklumat berkenaan kepada semua pengamal perubatan di klinik, hospital dan makmal kerajaan serta swasta yang terbabit dalam menjalankan ujian dan pengurusan kes COVID-19 serta lain-lain penyakit berjangkit bagi membolehkan ia disalurkan segera kepada PKD.

Dalam surat edaran dikeluaran Pejabat Timbalan Ketua Penggarah Kesihatan (Kesihatan Awam) Kementerian Kesihatan (KKM), menjelaskan kegagalan mematuhi arahan itu boleh di-

kenakan penalti mengikut peruntukan Seksyen 24 Akta Pencegahan dan Pengawalan Penyakit Berjangkit 1988 (Akta 342) iaitu penjara tidak melebihi dua tahun atau denda atau kedua-duanya.

Katanya, notifikasi itu perlu dibuat pengamal perubatan mengikut Subseksyen 10(2) Akta 342 berkenaan.

"Atas keperluan itu juga, setiap borang permohonan ujian makmal berkenaan perlu dicop dan ditandatangani pengamal perubatan berdaftar bagi tujuan notifikasi," katanya.

Surat arahan bertarikh 28 Di-

sembler lalu itu ditandatangani Timbalan Ketua Penggarah Kesihatan (Kesihatan Awam) KKM, Datuk Dr Chong Chee Kheong.

Sebelum ini, Menteri Besar, Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari, berkata peningkatan mendadak kes COVID-19 di Selangor khususnya yang diumumkan KKM semalam, antara lain disebabkan *backlog cases* atau kes tertunggak.

Kes berkenaan adalah daripada saringan pekerja kilang, penjara dan di klinik serta hospital swasta yang tidak dilaporkan secara terus ataupun *real time*.

Sehubungan itu, Pakar Perun-

ding Perubatan Kesihatan Awam, Timbalan Ketua Penggarah Kesihatan (Kesihatan Awam) KKM, sudah mengeluarkan arahan segera kepada semua PKD di Selangor membuat notifikasi dalam tempoh ditetapkan.

Katanya, mereka perlu membuat notifikasi bagi kes disahkan dan berkemungkinan positif melalui sistem dalam talian e-Notifikasi KKM dalam tempoh 24 jam selepas keputusan sampel *nasopharyngeal swab* diterima.



# Tindakan salahkan klinik, hospital swasta tidak adil

**Kuala Lumpur:** Tindakan hanya menyalahkan klinik dan hospital swasta kerana tidak melaporkan kes positif COVID-19 secara terus pada hari sama melalui Sistem Informasi Makmal Kesihatan Awam (SIMKA), disifatkan sebagai tidak adil.

Presiden Persatuan Perubatan Malaysia (MMA), Prof Datuk Dr Subramaniam Muniandy, berkata Kementerian Kesihatan (KKM) dan Jabatan Kesihatan Negeri Selangor (JKNS) sebaliknya harus menambah baik sistem kesihatan sedia ada terutama membatikan proses pengesahan kes COVID-19.

“MMA turut berkongsi kebimbangan seperti yang dinyatakan Menteri Besar Selangor (Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari), namun kami berasaskan adalah tidak adil menyalahkan klinik dan hospital swasta semata-mata sedangkan sistem sedia ada cacat dan kemudahan kesihatan kerajaan

yang digunakan klinik swasta adalah terhad.

“Malah, makmal yang memproses ujian saringan COVID-19 sudah terlalu penuh. Jadi MMA mendapat dakwaan terhadap klinik dan hospital swasta ini amat membimbangkan,” katanya dalam satu kenyataan, semalam.

Dr Subramaniam berkata, berdasarkan prosedur operasi standard (SOP) KKM, adalah menjadi tanggungjawab individu yang memproses sampel ujian saringan di makmal, melaporkan kes positif COVID-19 menerusi SIMKA.

Justeru, katanya, bagaimana seseorang individu itu boleh mendakwa kelewatan melaporkan kes positif menerusi SIMKA disebabkan kegagalan pengamal perubatan swasta, sedangkan 100 peratus proses saringan menggunakan RT-PCR dibuat di makmal.

“Saya berpendapat lebih adil jika pengamal kesihatan swasta

dimaafkan buat masa ini. Kita seharusnya bekerja secara berkumpulan dan tidak perlu menyalahkan antara satu sama lain.

“Malah, jika benar berlaku kelewatan melaporkan kes positif COVID-19, mengapa tiada tindakan diambil terhadap pihak kesihatan swasta ini. Di manakah penguatkuasaannya?” soalnya.

Amirudin dalam satu kenyataan sebelum ini dilaporkan berkata, peningkatan mendadak kes COVID-19 di Selangor berpunca daripada kes tertinggi kumulatif daripada saringan pekerja kilang, penjara, klinik dan hospital swasta yang tidak dilaporkan secara terus.

Sehubungan itu katanya, bagi mengatasi masalah itu, JKNS akan mengenakan kompaun kepada klinik atau hospital swasta yang tidak melaporkan kes positif secara terus pada hari yang sama melalui SIMKA.

Sultan Selangor mahu bangunan bersejarah dipulihara

**Shah Alam:** Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah menasihatkan dan berharap agar pihak berkuasa berkaitan menjalankan pemuliharaan serta pemeliharaan lebih intensif terhadap bangunan berasal dari sejarah di Kuala Lumpur, khususnya yang ada kaitan dengan Selangor.

Dalam titah perutusan Sultan Selangor yang dikongsi di Facebook Selangor Royal Office semalam, baginda menegaskan, kebanyakan bangunan berkenaan memiliki nilai sejarah tinggi dan menjadi tumpuan pelancong.

Sultan Sharafuddin memberi contoh, Bangunan Sultan Abdul Samad dirasmikan pada 1897, pernah menjadi pusat pentadbiran ketika Kuala Lumpur menjadi ibu negeri Selangor sehingga 1974.

Malah, baginda juga pernah bertugas sebagai penjawat awam bersama kerajaan Selangor di bangunan terbabit pada 1968.

"Baginda bimbang jika bangunan dan monumen seumpamanya tidak dipulihara secepat mungkin dan terbiar dimamah usia, akhirnya ia akan runtuh atau rosak sehingga tidak boleh diselamatkan.

"Jika itu berlaku, kos pemuli-

haraan akan menjadi lebih tinggi dan seterusnya merugikan negara," titah baginda sempena sambutan Hari Wilayah Persekutuan yang disambut hari ini.

Titah baginda, bangunan bersejarah seperti Carcosa Seri Negara, Masjid Jamek Sultan Abdul

Samad, Gereja St Mary, Stesen Keretapi Kuala Lumpur dan Ibu Pejabat Keretapi Tanah Melayu (KTM), Istana Negara lama serta Stadium Merdeka yang sarat dengan kisah sejarah pembentukan negara, kebanyakannya ada kaitan rapat dengan Selangor.

Selain itu, seni bina Moorish dan Moghul yang melatari reka bentuk bangunan bersejarah sekitar Kuala Lumpur juga mempunyai cerita unik tersendiri dan perlu dipulihara untuk dihargai serta dikagumi generasi akan datang.

# Manfaat kreativiti teknologi seni bina tangani impak banjir

**Negara** kita kerap dilanda banjir terutama negeri Pantai Timur. Namun, corak taburan hujan dan kejadian banjir kini semakin sukar diramal.

Persoalannya, apakah cara untuk mengelakkan tragedi banjir daripada terus membelenggu penduduk setempat?

Sebagai kerajaan dan pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT), apa dalam jangka panjang untuk mengawal dan membendung kejadian tidak dingin terus berlaku? Sebagaimana punya, apa boleh dilakukan?

"Banjir bukan musuh kita. Kita boleh 'berkawan' dengan banjir dan atap hijau, laluau atau jubin serap air dan bangunan mesra alam."

Beliau memahangkan, idea 'bandar span' sangat mudah. Berbanding menggunakan konkrit untuk mengalihalkan aliran air hujan, beliau mencadangkan idea kreatif penggunaan alam sekitar untuk menyerap, membersih dan menggunakan air itu semula.

Yu menyatakan, apa yang dilakukan selama ini terutama dari segi perancangan bandar adalah salah, sebaliknya mencadangkan supaya bekerjasama dan memahami alam sekitar, bukan melawan fitrah alam.

Antara boleh diambil kira adalah konsep aliran air semula jadi. Teres mesra alam memberi peluang bumi (tanah) untuk bertemu dengan air secah semula jadi.

Pada musim panas, teres ini berfungsi sebagai taman untuk kegunaan penduduk setempat. Apabila musim hujan, ia bertindak sebagai penebat

banjir atau tanggam pembendung banjir.

Usaha ini sudah pun dibangunkan Jabatan Pengairan dan Saliran (JPS) menerusi projek pembinaan Denai Sungai Nasional seluruh negara. Ia sebagai langkah mengatas masalah penemparan sisa di sungai melalui kaedah pengawalan pencemaran di punca.

Apabila landskap aliran sungai menjadi cantik dan bersih, orang ramai akan lebih menghargai dan menjamin kebersihan sungai itu sendiri, sekali gus bertindak sebagai tebatan banjir semula jadi.

Projek ini sewajarnya dijadikan projek komuniti berkelompok bagi memastikan ia dapat dilaksanakan segera dan berkesan, malah dengan kos rendah.

'Bandar span' pula meliputi dinding dan atap hijau, laluau atau jubin serap air dan bangunan mesra alam.

Kini, terdapat lebih 250 bandar span bekerjasama dengan kumpulan penyelidik ditrajui Yu termasuk Amerika Syarikat (AS), Russia dan Indonesia.

Konsep 'bandar span' akan menjadikan struktur bandar raya lebih berdaya taham.

Jepun, Korea dan Taiwan juga boleh dijadikan model pembangunan landskap sungai berjaya dan terbukti mampu menjadi 'span' semula jadi yang dapat menyerap aliran air berlebihan pada musim monsun dan taufan.

Konsep rumah terapung pula diperkenal sekumpulan arsitek United Kingdom (UK) dan Belanda bagi menjamin keselamatan penduduk di kawasan terdedah banjir ataupun kenaikan paras laut.

Rumah atau kediaman dibina dengan konkrit dan rangka kaca dilekatkan atas tapak diperbuat struktur

ponton terapung.

Dek pelindung di bahagian bawah boleh dijadikan ruang tamu dan dapur, manakala bahagian atas dijadikan bilik tidur.

Apabila berlaku air pasang atau banjir, ponton akan mengikut kenaikan air dan menyelamatkan rumah daripada aliran air. Rumah berbentuk modular ini memudahkan kerja pengeluaran secara besar-besaran dengan komponen lebih berdaya taham dan fleksibel.

Sistem modular juga boleh memberikan kebebasan kepada arkitek untuk mempelbagaikan reka bentuk, sekali gus mengawal kos setiap unit kedaduan dan boleh direka mengikut keperluan serta cita rasa pembeli.

Peta Hazard Banjir juga penting bukan untuk menilai risiko banjir dan mengenal pasti lokasi potensi tebatan banjir, malah turut menyediakan maklumat penting kepada orang awam untuk bertindak segera dan selamat ke-

tika berlakunya bencana.

Peta ini seharusnya diuar-uarkan kepada umum melalui ketua penduduk di sesuatu kawasan, media massa, internet, sekolah dan sebagainya. Program kesedaran penduduk dan kesiapsiagaan penduduk bagi menghadapi banjir dapat mengurangkan kerugian kerosakan harta benda dan yang paling penting nyawa manusia.

Penggunaan inovasi terkini seperti *boxwall* dan *tubewall* ciptaan syarikat Sweden boleh menampung air setinggi 50 sentimeter (SM) dan amat mudah dipasang, ringan serta mudah alih dan boleh dijadikan penebat banjir di sekeliling rumah.

Ciptaan penghadang banjir pada laju pintu yang mudah dipasang juga lebih efektif berbanding penggunaan beg pasir memerlukan tenaga dan masa yang lama untuk dipasang.

Sewajarnya, inovasi teknologi yang dapat menyekat air banjir daripada masuk ke rumah oleh anak tempatan harus dipacu dengan bertuan penyelesaian jangka pendek.

Hasil penyelidikan seharusnya dikomersialkan bagi memastikan masalah aliran air banjir dapat diselesaikan segera dan selamat.

Dalam pada itu, pelan pembangunan bandar yang berdaya taham adalah kritikal memandangkan intensiti hujan masa kini semakin tinggi akibat perubahan global.

Lokasi pembinaan bangunan dan keadaan faktor penting memastikan keselamatan sesetua projek binaan.

Namun kadangkala, ketidaaman tanah dan pilihan memaksa penduduk merusak niat mereka menetap di sesuatu kawasan. Di sinilah pentingnya peranan kerajaan dan PBT untuk membina sistem aliran dan pengairan tebatan banjir bagi membendung bencana ini dalam jangka masa panjang.

Di kota metropolitan Tokyo contohnya, terowong aliran bawah tanah terbesar di dunia dibina dan mampu menampung sehingga 200 tan air pada satu-satu masa. Di London pula, *Thames Barrier* atau sistem tambat sungai Thames diakui projek sofistikated menelan belanja £461 juta pound.


Di Saint Petersburg, Russia sebuah kompleks fasiliti penebat banjir dibina bagi mengurangkan bencana banjir di bandar itu yang mencatatkan 340 kematian banjir.

Apa pun, usaha pembangunan infrastruktur aliran dan tebatan banjir tidak akan berjaya sekiranya faktor pendorong banjir tidak dibendung dengan sistematis dan efisien, terutama aktiviti pembalakan secara tidak terkawal dan haram.

Realiti harus diterima, hutan adalah pasak bumi yang menjadi 'span' terbaik bagi menyerap aliran air hujan berlebihan.

# Hasil siasatan dibawa ke JAKIM

Isu bersifat nasional kerana ajaran mula menular ke negeri lain

**Kuala Lumpur:** Hasil siasatan ajaran Agama Melayu yang disifatkan bercanggah dengan al-Quran dan hadis akan berlangsung ke jawatankuasa akidah Jabatan Kemajuan Islam Malaysia (JAKIM) dalam tempoh dekat.

Sambil menyuarakan kebimbangan berhubung ajaran sesat itu, Mufti Selangor Datuk Mohd Tamyes Abd Wahid, berkata siasatan menyeluruh pihaknya ketika ini giat dijalankan.

Katanya, isu itu dibawa ke peringkat JAKIM kerana ia bersifat nasional, bukan lagi setempat berikutan kemungkinan ajaran itu turut disebarluaskan di negeri lain.

"Ajaran itu memang sesat. Saya tidak mahu komen panjang dan ia tidak perlu dihebohkan. Cukup saya katakan ia dalam siasatan, justeru biar ia dilaksanakan se-

cara menyeluruh.  
"Kenapa kita bawa ke jawatankuasa akidah pada peringkat JAKIM? Sebab ini ialah isu nasional, bukan setempat dan mungkin berlaku (ajaran agama Melayu) di negeri lain juga.

"Saya yakin dengan mandat yang diberikan kepada pihak jawatankuasa, kajian lengkap berhubung isu ini berupaya dilakukan," katanya ketika dihubungi BH, semalam.

Jumaat lalu, Yang Dipertua Yayan Dakwan Islamiah Malaysia (YADIM), Nasrudin Hassan meninggatkan orang ramai supaya tidak terpengaruh dengan ajaran Islam Melayu yang dikenal pasti mula menular di beberapa negeri, termasuk Melaka dan Selangor.

Menggunakan lafadz syahadah yang pelik dan disambung dengan pengakuan 'aku Melayu' sebaiknya tujuh kali, ajaran berkenaan didapati pernah menjalankan kegiatan di Pulau Besar, Melaka.

(JAIS) yang mengesahkan sudah menerima maklum balas berhubung dakaun ajaran sesat itu turut meneliti isu terbabit, sebelum pihaknya mengambil sebarang tindakan lanjut.

Berdasarkan pemerhatian awal, Mohd Tamyes berkata, ajaran sesat yang dibawa seorang wanita itu banyak bersandarkan benda kburafat.

"Selagi mana dia ingin kembali

lau Besar, Umbai, Jasin, di sini. Pengaruhnya, Datuk Md Azhan Samat, berkata setakat ini pemantauan dilakukan pegawai penguat kuasa jabatan itu di pulau berkenaan belum pernah terjumpa dengan kumpulan terabit.

Beliau percaya kumpulan itu hadir di pulau berkenaan pada wakt tertentu, semata-mata untuk menjalankan aktiviti yang dikatakan terkeluar daripada landasan agama.

"Sehubungan itu, saya minta orang ramai yang mempunyai sebarang maklumat mengenai kehadiran kumpulan ini atau kumpulan lain yang menjalankan aktiviti seumpama itu supaya segera melaporinya kepada JAIS.

"Kerjasama ini amat penting kerana pegawai penguasa kita (JAIS) tidak boleh sentiasa berada di pulau ini," katanya ketika dihubungi, semalam.

Klip video berdurasi lapan minit lima saat itu tular di media sosial Facebook dan aplikasi WhatsApp, dengan memaparkan beberapa individu melakukan upacara paluan gong dipercayai ritual ajaran tertentu di pulau yang didakwa Pulau Besar.

# KL dari kaca mata perantau



**P**ADA 12 Januari lalu, sehari sebelum Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP) kali kedua, saya mengambil peluang menyusuri jalan dan lorong yang menjadi urat nadi Kuala Lumpur. Ini sebahagian daripada cara saya meraikan tarikh 2 Januari sebagai ulang tahun ke-37 perantauan ke Kuala Lumpur. Apabila menapak di jalan-jalan sekitar Bukit Bintang, rasa seperti berada di Hong Kong. Ini Kuala Lumpur atau Hong Kong? Terlupa, ini kawasan Parlimen yang didominasi kaum Cina sejak lama. Ini wilayah kosmopolitan Cina dan Melayu hanya berlepas-lepas sebagai perlanggan.

Bergerak pula ke Brickfields yang tidak jauh dengan stesen Kuala Lumpur Sentral. Di kiri kanan jalan ada deretan bangunan kedadilan lama dan tidak jauh dari situ ada kawasan yang disebut Little India. Memang betul-betul macam di India. Susah hendak mencari orang Melayu di situ kecuali yang hendak ke Kuala Lumpur Sentral.

Menyusuri Jalan Petaling tetapi lebih dikenali sebagai Petaling Street dan jalan-jalan sekitarnya adalah penempatan Cina. Pasar malam Jalan Petaling hampir tidak ada peniaga Melayu, semuanya Cina. Daripada jual buah-buahan hingga barangan jenama palsu, tidak ada penjual daripada kaum lain.

Kawasan majoriti Melayu tertumpu di Jalan Masjid India dan di Chow Kit. Malah, pasar basah Chow Kit lebih terasa kewujudan Melayu berbanding pasar basah Jalan Pudu. Inilah sebenarnya Kuala Lumpur di sebalik jendela kaca yang selalu dibuka kepada kita.

Wajah sebenar Kuala Lumpur terlindung di sebalik percikan cahaya yang amat mempesona. Di sebalik bangunan-bangunan tinggi, moden dan mewah terseburinya wajah sosial Kuala Lumpur yang sebenar.

Kemajuan pesat Kuala Lumpur sebagai pusat ekonomi tidak dinikmati secara bersama. Banyak yang mampu melihat daripada memiliki. Apakah tindakan pentadbir Kuala Lumpur?

#### POLARISASI

Polarisasi kaum terus menjadikan persoalan teras di Kuala Lumpur. Kawasan-kawasan yang beridentiti dan dominasi kaum tertentu terus wujud dan tidak menjanjiakan perubahan walaupun dalam jangka masa 30 tahun akan datang.

Pembangunan penempatan dan kediaman baharu juga kelihatan gagal merentas garis kaum apabila di kawasan yang majoriti Cina terus menjadi tumpuan Cina dan kawasan Melayu menjadi tumpuan Melayu.

Orang Melayu sebenarnya tertumpu di kawasan asal Melayu seperti Keramat, Kampung Baru, Kampung Pandan dan Lembah Pantai. Sementara orang Cina di kawasan-kawasan bandar yang komersial seperti Bukit Bintang, Cheras, Sungai Besi, Jalan Kelang Lama dan Seputeh.

Orang India di Brickfield, Sentul dan Segambut. Walaupun di kawasan-

kawasan lain juga dihuni oleh orang India tetapi kawasan yang disebutkan majoritiannya didiami oleh kaum berkenaan.

Saya melihat segmentasi penempatan kaum di Kuala Lumpur sebagai suatu yang tidak baik pada pembangunan sosiobudaya dan politik wilayah ini. Kita perlu maklum, Kuala Lumpur bukan ibu negeri tetapi sebuah wilayah yang berada dalam tadbir urus Kerajaan Persekutuan.

Barangkali pentadbir Kuala Lumpur, Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) mempunyai perancangan jangka pendek, sederhana dan panjang terhadap sosialisasi

warga Kuala Lumpur. Bagaimanapun sejak saya merantau ke Kuala Lumpur, segmentasi itu terus berlaku dari dulih hingga sekarang.

#### SEGI TIGA EMAS

Apalah ertinya Kuala Lumpur sebagai Wilayah Persekutuan kalau kawasan segi tiga emas di tengah-tengah Kuala Lumpur hanya didominasi oleh satu kaum sahaja? Pentadbir Kuala Lumpur mestii memahami peranan untuk menjadikan pusat bandar Kuala Lumpur milik semua.

Hal-hal seperti ini mestilah dirancang. Jangan membiarkan populasi sesebuah kawasan berlaku secara semula jadi atau organik. Memanglah pemilikan hartanah adalah perlumbaan terbuka, siapa punya diahal yang punya.

Saya fikir pentadbir Kuala Lumpur perlu menghayati dan memahami matlamat di sebalik pengurianan tanah seluas 223 ekar (90 hektar) di Kampung Baru kepada orang Melayu pada 1899 oleh Sultan Selangor, Sultan Alaudin Sulaiman Syah. Bayangkan kalau tidak ada Kampung Baru hari ini, kawasan metropolitan Kuala Lumpur tidak ada orang Melayu.

Kuala Lumpur bermula dengan kawasan lombong bijih timah oleh buruh yang dibawa dari China. Tetapi pada 1860 hingga 1880, berlaku peningkatan mendadak migrasi orang Cina di Kuala Lumpur, sekali gus bertambah ancaman kongsi gelap.

Penganugerahan tanah di Kampung Baru menghalang pergerakan keluar orang Melayu di Kuala Lumpur walaupun kemaraan pelombong-pelombongan China sudah tidak terkawal. Kerana penguasaan Cina juga, sejarah pengasas Kuala Lumpur diberikan kepada Yap Ah Loy sedangkan sebenarnya Sultan Puasa daripada keturunan Mandailing.

Saya pernah tinggal di rumah settingan di Kampung Kerinch. Majoriti masyarakat settingan pada 1980-an adalah Melayu. Mereka bukan golongan berada tetapi bekerja kais pagi makan pagi. Walaupun sudah ada flat tetapi tidak sesuai untuk keluarga yang besar. Tetapi apakah yang berlaku pada kawasan Melayu di Kampung Kerinch?

Memang baguslah memajukan kampung settingan, tetapi yang berlaku ialah Kampung Kerinch bukan lagi kawasan Melayu. Berapa orang yang mampu menyewa atau membeli hartanah di Kampung Kerinch sekarang ini?

Saya fikir kalau bercapak mengenai pembangunan dan kemajuan Kuala Lumpur, jangan tertumpu pada infrastruktur sahaja. Memang benar bangunan pencakar awan tumbuh macam cendawan. Ketika saya mula bekerja dulu, bangunan tertinggi ialah Tabung Haji, kemudian menyusul bangunan Daya Bumi dan seterusnya Menara Maybank pada 1987.

Bangunan tinggi ini bukan tanda aras sebenar kemajuan dan pembangunan sosial, apa lagi jurang ekonomi antara kaum terus melebar. Jurang pemilikan hartanah Melayu dan Cina tetap macam langit dengan bumi.

Inilah persoalan yang lebih mendasar daripada berbangga melulu dengan infrastruktur Kuala Lumpur.

# *Sultan titah perhebat usaha pulihara bangunan bersejarah*

**Shah Alam:** Sultan Selangor Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah mahu usaha memulihara dan memelihara bangunan bersejarah yang mempunyai kaitan dengan negeri itu khususnya di Kuala Lumpur diperhebat.

Menurut kenyataan dimuat naik menerusi Facebook rasmi Selangor Royal Office semalam, Sultan Sharafuddin bimbang jika bangunan dan monumen tersebut tidak dipulihara secepat mungkin serta terbiar, tinggalan sejarah itu runtuh atau rosak sehingga tidak boleh diselamatkan lagi.

"Jika itu berlaku, kos pemuliharaan akan menjadi lebih tinggi dan seterusnya akan rugikan negara.

"Pihak berkaitan seperti Kementerian Wilayah Persekutuan, Jabatan Warisan Negara dan Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) perlu melakukan pemuliharaan serta pemeliharaan intensif terhadap bangunan bersejarah tersebut," titah baginda sempena sambutan Hari Wilayah Persekutuan hari ini.

Titah baginda, kebanyakannya bangunan itu memiliki nilai sejarah yang sangat tinggi serta masih menjadi destinasi pelancongan tumpuan di ibu negara.

Sultan Sharafuddin mem-

beri contoh Bangunan Sultan Abdul Samad yang dirasmikan pada 1897 dan pernah menempatkan pusat pentadbiran kerajaan negeri Selangor semasa Kuala Lumpur menjadi ibu negeri Selangor hingga 1974 sebelum ibu negeri Selangor dipindahkan ke Shah Alam.

Titah Sultan Selangor, baginda juga pernah bertugas sebagai penjawat awam dengan kerajaan negeri Selangor di Bangunan Sultan Abdul Samad pada 1968.

Bangunan bersejarah lain seperti Carcosa Seri Negara, Masjid Jamek Sultan Abdul Samad, Gereja St Mary, Stesen Kereta Api Kuala Lumpur dan Ibu Pejabat Kereta Api Tanah Melayu (KTM) Berhad, Istana Negara lama serta Stadium Merdeka sarat dengan kisah sejarah melibatkan pembentukan negara ini, yang kebanyakannya mempunyai kaitan rapat dengan sejarah awal Selangor, titah baginda.

"Seni binā Moorish dan Moghul yang melatari reka bentuk bangunan-bangunan bersejarah di sekitar Kuala Lumpur mempunyai cerita tersendiri dan seharusnya dipulihara untuk dihargai serta dikagumi oleh generasi akan datang," titah baginda.

Dalam pada itu, Izham berkata, pihaknya juga akan memulakan kembali Pasar Agro Selangor (SAM) yang

dilaksanakan, tahun lalu selepas perbincangan dengan pelbagai pihak berkaitan dalam masa terdekat.

"Kita tidak mau pelaksanaan SAM bercanggah dengan pasar tani kerana produk atau barang yang dibawa menerusi SAM tidak sebanyak pasar tani, iaitu ia memfokuskan kepada barang kegunaan harian diusahakan oleh usahawan agro Selangor," katanya.

Dalam perkembangan lain,

kerajaan negeri bersama penyelidik Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) dalam proses kajian akhir bagi menghasilkan makanan ternakan menggunakan bahan tempatan seperti jerami demi mewaralkan bekalan makanan ternakan yang lebih murah kepada peternak.

## **Do more to conserve historical buildings in KL, says Ruler**

**SHAH ALAM:** Sultan of Selangor Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah has called on the relevant authorities to carry out more intensive efforts of conserving and preserving historical buildings in Kuala Lumpur, especially those related to the state.

Istana Alam Shah, in a posting on the Selangor Royal Office Facebook page, said the Ruler expressed concern that if such efforts were not carried out immediately, the authorities might not be able to save the buildings and monuments from being torn down.

"If that happens, the conservation cost will be higher and this can cause the country to incur losses.

"His Royal Highness hopes that relevant parties such as the Federal Territories Ministry, National Heritage Department and Kuala Lumpur City Hall will carry out more intensive conservation and preservation of these historical buildings," said the statement which was issued in conjunction with the Federal Territory Day's celebrations today.

Sultan Sharafuddin said most of the buildings possessed high historical value and had become tourist attractions in the capital.

His Royal Highness cited as an example the Sultan Abdul Samad Building, which was inaugurated in 1897 and used as the administrative centre of the Selangor state government when Kuala Lumpur was the state capital of Selangor until 1974, before the capital was moved to Shah Alam.

Sultan Sharafuddin also had the experience of working at the Sultan Abdul Samad Building when serving the Selangor state government in 1968.

His Royal Highness said other historical buildings such as Carcosa Seri Negara, Masjid Jamek Sultan Abdul Samad, the St Mary's Cathedral, Kuala Lumpur Railway Station and headquarters of Kereta Api Tanah Melayu (KTM) Berhad, the old Istana Negara and Merdeka Stadium were places rich in history involving the formation of the country where most of it was closely related to the early history of Selangor. — Bernama

## Only 20 adults allowed into Klang crematoriums at a time

ONLY 20 next of kin or close relatives can be present at cremation sites in Klang during the movement control order at any one time, while standing 1m away from each other.

Klang Municipal Council (MPK) Corporate Communications Department director Norfiza Mahfiz said public and private crematoriums must follow the standard operating procedure where only 20 adults were allowed to be present at the crematorium at a time.

"Crematoriums are allowed to operate from 8am to 4pm and people must use face mask at all times. Only 20 are allowed into the crematorium area where people can take turns to pay their last respects.

"Children are prohibited from entering the crematorium grounds," she added.

Norfiza said those who entered the crematorium were advised to wash their hands or sanitise thoroughly before leaving the facility.

# 'ASSESS COVID-19 RISK AT WORKPLACES'

Only workplaces that pass this exercise should be allowed to operate, says expert

WORKPLACES with more than 100 employees present at any time should implement a thorough Covid-19 risk assessment to mitigate the virus' spread.

Universiti Selangor visiting professor of Environmental Health Professor Dr Jamal Hisham Hashim said depending on the nature of these workplaces, each should either have a safety and health officer or committee, or both, to oversee this task.

He was commenting on the increasing number of new workplace clusters.

The authorities, he said, should look into the work station settings, and body temperature and symptom screenings at workplaces.

Jamal said compliance with the standard operating procedures (SOP), toilet, canteen and rest facilities, indoor ventilation sys-

tem, as well as on-site and off-site workers' housing facilities, should be assessed as well.

"Only workplaces that pass these strict risk assessments should be allowed to operate.

"The others should be temporarily closed and asked to upgrade accordingly before they are given the green light to re-open," he told the *New Straits Times*.

Malaysia logged the highest number of Covid-19 cases at 5,728 on Saturday, with Selangor, Johor

and Kuala Lumpur recording the bulk of these new cases.

The Health Ministry reported 16 new clusters, 13 of which were workplace-related and three others community clusters.

Six of the workplace clusters were detected in Johor: Jalan Suasa, Jalan Riang, Jalan Lombong, Bintang Utama, Bayu Tam-poi and Bukit Batu Grisek.

Others were identified in Selangor (Jalan Trompet and Kam-pung Hala), Kuala Lumpur (Lingkaran Maluri and Desa Tun), Pahang (Tanah Putih and Jalan Ketengah), and Sabah


(Jalan Labuk).

On Friday, the ministry recorded 5,725 cases and 12 new clusters, where 10, or 83 per cent, were workplace clusters.

Out of these 10 workplace clusters, nine were in Selangor, Kuala Lumpur and Johor, the same areas that recorded the highest number of new cases.

Jamal said the authorities must look further into Malaysia's Covid-19 data to analyse and identify from which type of clusters the new cases were originating from.

"If they are coming from work-



place clusters, we need to know from which type of workplace clusters, whether they are from construction companies, manufacturing plants or electronic companies.

"Are workers contracting the virus at their workplaces, homes or hostels?

"Are they spreading it among themselves or also cross-infecting with the public?

"Unless we know these facts, I am afraid that we may just be groping in the dark with our Covid-19 prevention strategies.

"We need to zero in on new daily cases as well as anticipate where the next outbreak would be.

"In other words, we need to get ahead of the virus.

"The Movement Control Order can only provide us with the opportunity to do this, but it cannot do it for us," he added.

Prof Zailina Hashim, a former environmental and occupational health professor at Universiti Putra Malaysia, reiterated the need to empower employers and employees in managing Covid-19-proof workplaces.

She said this was crucial to complement the good control effort underway by the government.

"References can be made to the many resources and guidelines on Covid-19 control in workplaces published by the American Industrial Hygiene Association.

"Most Covid-19 transmissions happen indoors, especially in poorly ventilated workplaces and overcrowded workers' housing."

# 'WHY BLAME PRIVATE CLINICS?'

Don't make claims about late reporting of infections without providing facts, says MMA

**T**HE Malaysian Medical Association (MMA) has said it is unfair to blame private clinics and private hospitals in Selangor for late reporting of Covid-19 cases.

Its president, Professor Datuk Dr Subramaniam Muniandy, said while the association shared the same concerns with Selangor residents as expressed by Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari on Saturday, it was unfair to target private clinics and private hospitals when the system was flawed and the government healthcare facilities that the private clinics work with were stretched to the limit.

"As cases rise, even the laboratories processing test results are stretched."

"MMA finds the accusation troubling," read the statement.

Amirudin had said compounds would be issued to clinics or pri-

vate hospitals in Selangor if they failed to report daily Covid-19 cases through the Public Health Laboratory Information System (Simka).

Dr Subramaniam said for clarity, the Health Ministry's standard operating procedures (SOP) dictated that it was the duty of the person conducting the laboratory processing of the sample to report the result via Simka.

"MMA would like to make it clear that all Reverse Transcriptase-Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) tests are processed in laboratories, unlike Rapid Test Kit Antigen tests, which may be processed at private facilities themselves."

"Therefore, how can anyone claim that the delay in reporting confirmed cases via Simka is due to the failure of reporting by private practitioners when in reality, 100 per cent of RT-PCR processing is done in laboratories."

"I think it is only fair for private practitioners to be given an apology. We are all in this together."

He said MMA implored all parties to stop the blame game, should the Health Ministry and the Selangor Health Department

(JKNS) particularly, believe in working as a team and in wanting to boost public-private partnership.

He said under the Health Ministry's SOP and guidelines, private clinics must immediately report any patient found positive with Covid-19 to the nearest district Health office (PKD).

"Under Act 342 (Prevention and Control of Infectious Diseases Act 1988), if the private healthcare facility fails to report the Covid-19 case to a PKD within 24 hours, action can be taken against it."

"If indeed, there have been unreported or delayed reporting of Covid-19 cases, considering the urgency, why has action not been taken against these private healthcare facilities?"

He said before JKNS hurled more allegations at private clinics and private hospitals, the department should provide the following information:

**STATISTICS** on the number of cases reported by private healthcare facilities each month;

**THE** number of cases that have been found to be unreported by private clinics or private hospitals;

**WHAT** action has JKNS taken against these facilities?; and,

**WHEN** will the notification SOP be revised and streamlined to prevent confusion among private practitioners?

He said it was only right for private practitioners to demand answers to these questions.

"JKNS cannot be given a free hand in making accusations without providing facts."

He added that MMA supported enforcement against any private healthcare facility that failed to report confirmed cases within the stipulated time frame in accordance with guidelines and SOP.

"However, it must be supported with evidence."

He raised an issue regarding private laboratories conducting Covid-19 screening, even when it is not allowed by the ministry.

"We also wish to highlight again that even private laboratories are conducting drive-through and onsite RT-PCR screening tests when they are not allowed to by the Health Ministry."

"According to the ministry, Covid-19 tests by the private sector can be carried out only at a private medical clinic, ambulatory care centre or a private hospital."

"Private laboratories are not classified as a healthcare facility. However, the ministry has closed one eye."

MMA president Dr. Salimahera Mursalin has demanded that the Health Ministry put its house in order in terms of reporting COVID-19 positive cases. He believes that the late reporting of cases is due to the failure of private practitioners from clinics and hospitals to report their cases to the state health department. MMA also claims that the private clinics work well, and are stretched to its limits. MMA president Dr. Salimahera Mursalin said that the state health department has been issuing fine to private clinics and private hospitals for the late reporting of COVID-19 cases.

"We share the same concern over laboratories as expressed by the MMA, but at the same time, the MMA feels the accusation made by the state health department is not true," he said.

Health Minister Subramanian and the Health Ministry intended carrying out a review of the laboratory system to improve it. This includes the laboratory processing of the sample to report the result via Brink's. MMA president Dr. Salimahera Mursalin said that all PCR samples are processed at laboratory surface and are given to the state health department for the private facilities themselves.

"Therefore, how can anyone claim that the delay in reporting and treat cases via PCR samples is due to the failure of private practitioners when in reality, 70 percent of RT-PCR processing is done in laboratories?" he added.

Subramanian said before the state health department bulls more allegations against private clinics and private hospitals, MMA would like to ask him to provide the following:

1. Statistics on the number of cases reported by private healthcare facilities each month.
2. The number of cases that have been found to be unreported by private healthcare facilities.
3. What action has the department taken against those facilities?
4. When will the notifications be issued and circulated in order to prevent such cases from happening again?

"We believe that it is only fair for the private practitioners to demand the answers to the questions above. The state health department cannot be given the benefit of doubt when it comes to the issue of瞒报 (falsifying reports)."

He added that the MMA would highlight again to the private healthcare facilities that they are required to undergo RT-PCR screening tests when they are referred to by the Health Ministry.

"According to the Health Ministry, Covid-19 tests by the private sector can only detect 70% of private individuals. Therefore, we suspect, it is a private hospital."

Private laboratories are not classified as healthcare facility however, the ministry can't control and we are at the end."

KUALA LUMPUR: The Malaysian Medical Association (MMA) has said it is unfair to blame private clinics and private hospitals in Selangor for late reporting of Covid-19 cases.

Its president, Prof Dato' Dr Subramanian Maniandy, said while the association shared the same concern with Selangorians as expressed by Minister Besar Dato' Sri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi on Saturday, it is unfair to blame private clinics and hospitals in Selangor for failing to report cases to the relevant Government healthcare facilities that the private clinics were with or attached to them.

"As cases rise, even the laboratories processing test results are stretched. The MMA finds the accusation deeply troubling," read a statement.

Annulment had said consumers could complain to either a private hospital in Selangor if they fail to report their Covid-19 cases through the Public Health Laboratory Information System (PHLIS).

Dr Subramanian said to clarify, the Health Ministry's standard operating procedures (SOP) dictate that it is the duty of the person conducting laboratory processing of samples to report the results via PHILIS.

"The MMA would like to make it clear that all Reverse Transcriptase-Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) tests are processed in laboratories, unlike RT-Antigen (RT-AG) tests which may be processed at the private facilities themselves."

"Therefore, how can anyone claim that the delay in reporting confirmed cases via PHILIS is due to the failure of reporting by private practitioners when in reality, 100 per cent of RT-PCR processing is done in laboratories?"

"There is only one for private practitioners to be issued an apology. We are all in this together."

Dr Subramanian said the MMA believes all parties to play the blame game, including the Health Ministry and the Selangor Health Department (JNHS), if they truly believe in working as a team and want to enhance public-private partnership.

He said under the Health Ministry's SOP and guidelines, private clinics must immediately report any patient found positive with Covid-19 to the nearest district health office (DHO).

"Under Act 10 (Provision and Control of Infectious Diseases Act 1988), if the private healthcare facility fails to do so, the relevant DHO can take legal action against the facility and the individuals involved will be taken against them."

"If indeed, there have been complaints or delayed reporting of Covid-19 systems, considering the urgency why has action not been taken against these private healthcare facilities?"

Dr Subramanian said before JNHS hired more allegations against private clinics and private hospitals, the department should provide the following information:

1) Statistics on number of cases reported by private healthcare facilities each month.

2) The number of cases that have been tested by the unreported by private clinics or private hospitals.

3) What action has JNHS taken against these facilities?

4) When will the notification SOP be revised and announced in order to stop the confusion among private practitioners?

Dr Subramanian said it is only right for private practitioners to demand answers to the questions above.

"The JNHS cannot be given a free hand to making accusations without providing facts."

He added the MMA fully supports enforcement on any private healthcare facility that fails to report confirmed cases within the stipulated time frame in accordance with guidelines and SOP from the health ministry.

**Selangor exco says 22 farmers' markets in state to reopen in phases**

SHAH ALAM, Jan 31 — Farmers' markets in the state will be reopened in phases to ensure that the standard operating procedure (SOP) can be implemented and followed by all parties throughout the duration of the movement control order (MCO).

Selangor Infrastructure and Public Utilities, Modernisation of Agriculture and Agro-based Industry Committee chairman Umar Hashim said at the time being, 22 farmers' markets out of the 48 registered in the state will be reopened to the public.

"The reopening will begin with Shah Alam Stadium Farmers' market today, Insyaklah, we will publicise the reopening frequently to help our traders market their agricultural produce and other fresh products such as meat," he said.

"We will reopen in phases depending on the current Covid-19 situation," he said after inspecting the compliance of SOP at the Shah Alam Stadium farmers' market.

Umar said farmers' markets in the state were not allowed to operate in the past two weeks as they were holding on greater SOP.

In other developments, RM10 million and RM500,000 was allocated to purchasing food baskets under the Kita Selangor package announced by Selangor Menteri Besar, Dato' Seri Amirudin Sharif, on Jan 20.

"The remaining RM1.5 million allocated for Kita Selangor package will be channelled in the form of stimulus packages where fishermen will be given pet oil vouchers, farmers will receive aid in the form of fertilisers while livestock breeders will receive animal feed," he said.

A total of RM2 million have been allocated to aid 10,150 farmers, fishermen and livestock breeders through the recently announced Kita Selangor package.

Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) researchers are at the final stages of research to produce animal feed using local ingredients including hay in efforts to supply cheaper animal feed.

"We will try to complete the research as soon as possible and hopefully it will be commercialised in the first quarter of this year," he said. — Bernama

**KUALA LUMPUR**, Jan 31 (Bernama): Malaysia's external trade for 2021 is expected to be modest with exports projected to rebound by 2.7 per cent, the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) said.

Trade minister Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali said the outlook for 2021 is expected to be better as the World Bank and International Monetary Fund (IMF) forecast that global growth will rebound by 4.0 per cent and 5.5 per cent, respectively.

"For world merchandise trade volume, the World Trade Organisation (WTO) projected a 7.2 per cent growth in 2021."

"In tandem with improvement in global growth and international trade, Malaysia's gross domestic product (GDP) is expected to rebound by 6.5 per cent to 7.5 per cent, higher than the forecast growth for ASEAN-5, which is 5.2 per cent," he said in a statement today.

Mohamed Azmin noted that Malaysia's exports had been showing signs of recovery since September 2020 with positive year-on-year growth.

Joint demand for semiconductors and commodity-based products is anticipated to drive exports and real economic activity to recover. The trade surplus recorded in 2020 marks the fourth consecutive year of double-digit growth, with an expansion of 26.7 per cent to RM184.79 billion compared to 2019.

It was also the largest trade surplus thus far, representing Malaysia's achievement in sustaining trade surplus for 23 consecutive years since 1998.

Total trade in 2020 amounted to RM1.777 trillion, contracting by 3.6 per cent compared to 2019 while imports totalled RM749.637 billion, a decline of 6.3 per cent.

Malaysia's exports in 2020, valued at RM980.99 billion, declined marginally by 1.4 per cent compared to the preceding year, in tandem with the unfavourable external environment due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Exports rebounded in the second half of the COVID-2020, increasing by 4.8 per cent, a significant improvement from a 7.9 per cent contraction in the first half of 2020 as the economy progressively reopened and external demand gradually recovered.

Lower exports were recorded to Thailand, India, Bangladesh, Vietnam, and Japan while higher exports was registered to China, the US, Singapore, and Hong Kong.

"Malaysia's trade performance was in tandem with countries in the region, notably Indonesia, Singapore, South Korea and Thailand.

"While trade with existing Free-Trade Agreement (FTA) partners in 2020 stood at RM1.185 trillion, registering a decrease of 3.7 per cent and accounting for 66.7 per cent of Malaysia's total trade," he said.

Mohamed Azmin said the recent signing of the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP), the world's largest FTA in history, will provide Malaysian companies and businesses access to more than 1.6 billion consumers in the world's largest market, attract foreign direct investment, and be a boon to Malaysia's export growth.

"Going forward, investor confidence has been bolstered by Moody's latest affirmation of Malaysia's local and foreign currency long-term issuer ratings at A3, with a stable strong credit standing," he said.

"This is a testament to the government's strong fiscal discipline and robust medium-term growth prospects and demonstrates Moody's confidence in Malaysia as having strong credit standing," he said.

While these are challenging times, the government's priority is to place the nation firmly on the path of economic recovery particularly with the 12th Malaysian Plan as the blueprint for sustainable growth founded on sound economic fundamentals and decisive policy measures - Bernama

**Urgent need to rectify Covid-19 reporting system, says MMA**

PETALING JAYA: Accusations against private medical practices are uncalled for when the system set up by the state government in reporting Covid-19 cases is flawed, says the Malaysian Medical Association (MMA).

"Selangor state authorities should not target private clinics and private hospitals for late reporting of Covid-19 cases," he said in a statement on Sunday (Jan 31).

Dr Subramaniam also called on Selangor Menteri Besar Dato' Seri Amirudin Sharif and the state Health Department to clarify matters and work together before threatening to issue fines to private clinics and private hospitals in the state for late reporting of Covid-19 cases.

"The Health Ministry must get its house in order on the reporting system of Covid-19 positive cases."

"MMA notes the warning issued by the Selangor Menteri Besar that the state Health Department will begin issuing fines to private clinics and private hospitals in the state for late reporting of Covid-19 cases."

"MMA finds the accusation made in the said report deeply troubling."

"Apparently one of the reasons for the delay in reporting of confirmed cases is due to the failure of private practitioners from clinics and hospitals to key in information into the Simka system."

"For clarity, the Health Ministry dictates that it is the duty of the person who conducts the laboratory processing of the sample to report the result via Simka," he said.

On Saturday (Jan 30), Amirudin had said the sudden surge of Covid-19 cases in Selangor announced by the Health Ministry on Friday (Jan 29) was due to the backlog of cases from screenings at factories, prisons, clinics and private hospitals that were not reported in real time.

Adding that the backlog of cases was over the past 10 days, Amirudin had warned that the state Health Department would begin issuing fines to clinics and private hospitals in the state for late reporting of Covid-19 cases.

He had added healthcare facilities must report positive cases through Simka on the same day they are detected.

Dr Subramaniam further said that all RT-PCR tests were processed in laboratories, unlike Rapid Antigen tests which may be processed at the private facilities themselves.

"Therefore, how can anyone claim that the delay in reporting confirmed cases via Simka is due to the failure of reporting by private practitioners when in reality, 100% of RT-PCR processing is done in laboratories?"

"I think it is only fair for private practitioners to be given an apology. We are all in this together," said Dr Subramaniam.

He alleged that the system set up for reporting was flawed and government healthcare facilities, which the private clinics have to work with, are stretched to its limits.

"As the number of cases rises, even laboratories processing test results are stretched."

"If the Selangor Health Department truly believes in working as a team and want to enhance public-private partnership, MMA implores all parties to stop the blame game," said Dr Subramaniam.

He explained that under the SOP and guidelines from the Health Ministry, private clinics must immediately report any patient found positive with Covid-19 to the Health District Office.

"Under Act 342, if the private healthcare facility fails to report the Covid-19 positive case to the health district office within 24 hours, action can be taken against them."

"As speed will be vital in reporting cases of Covid-19, MMA proposes that both the e-notification to the health district offices and Simka reporting be integrated into one system to cut down on the repetitive administrative processes."

"If five minutes can be saved on administrative work per patient, an hour can be saved on 12 patients allowing more patients to be seen and tested," said Dr Subramaniam.


