# *Pemalsuan, manipulasi dalam berpoligami bunuh sistem kekeluargaan*

**Kuala Lumpur:** Jabatan Kehakiman Syariah Malaysia (JKSM) tidak akan bertolak-ansur dengan sebarang bentuk penyelewengan kuasa yang boleh menyebabkan penindasan berlaku kepada pasangan berkahwin.

Ketua Pengarahnya, Datuk Seri Dr Na'im Mokhtar berkata, pihaknya juga tidak menolak kemungkinan wujud sindiket berdasarkan maklumat diterima sebelum ini.

"Kita tidak akan berkompromi dengan sebarang bentuk penyalahgunaan kuasa."

"Dalam isu poligami tanpa kebenaran, tidak ada yang boleh terlepas jika melakukan kesalahan berkaitan," katanya kepada Harian Metro.

Sementara itu, orang ramai yang mempunyai maklumat mengenai pemalsuan poligami perlu membuat laporan terus kepada pihak berkuasa untuk tindakan segera.

Ia termasuk aduan kepada Suruhanjaya Pencegahan Rasuah Malaysia (SPRM) bagi membolehkan siasatan dibuat jika wujud unsur pelanggaran integriti di sebalik 'kelulusan' pernikahan khususnya membabitkan golongan tertentu.

Jabatan Agama Islam Selangor (Jais), Datuk Mohd Shahzihan Ahmad berkata, kewujudan sebarang bentuk pemalsuan atau manipulasi di dalam poligami akan membunuh sistem kekeluargaan.

Menurutnya, ini kerana maksud pensyariatan sebenar sudah dilupuskan dengan sengaja untuk tujuan peribadi semata-mata.

Katanya, Enakmen Undang-Undang Keluarga Islam diwujudkan bagi membela serta menjaga hak wanita dan anak dalam sesebuah rumah tangga.

"Kalau berlaku demikian, ia akan gagal, oleh itu akan meninggalkan pengalaman ngeri kepada isteri dan anak apabila sistem komponen serta keadilan Islam ke atas mereka tidak

diurus dengan bertanggungjawab dan berintegriti.

"Jika benar ada 'ulat' yang menjalankan kegiatan ini, mekanisme proses dan kawalan proses baharu perlu dibuat serta dikuatkuasakan agar mereka ini tidak boleh menjalankan aktivitinya.

"Tutup semua ruang yang membolehkan mereka ini mencari makan dan merosakkan sistem," katanya.

Menurutnya, isu berkenaan memberi cabaran masa depan kepada pihak berkuasa agama kerana ia membabitkan masalah perceraian, permusuhan dua keluarga besar dan masalah anak dan isu

remaja.

Katanya, bagi mengatasi isu terhabit, semua komponen sewajarnya dijaga supaya dapat memelihara persekitaran dan sistem sedia ada.

"Isu membabitkan sindiket pernikahan sebegini sebelum ini memang berlaku. Cuma dakwaan turut membabitkan peguam serta hakim adalah isu baharu dan perlu disiasat," katanya.

# Klang council clamps down on illegal scrapyard

AFTER months of operations, an illegal scrapyard that encroached on a children's playground in Taman Wangsa, Klang, was shut down by Klang Municipal Council (MPK).

Its enforcement officers seized three grinders, two compressors, steel cutters, tool boxes, barrows and forklift keys from the premises along Lorong Bendahara 31D.

MPK acting enforcement director Shahru Hazri Abd Majid said illegal businesses were not allowed.

"This is thanks to several residents who brought up the issue of noise pollution caused by workers hammering metal and burning insulated wires thrice a week, from 8am to 10pm.

"It was a nuisance as people living along Lorong Bendahara 31D had to put up with acrid smoke

and noise pollution," he said.

Quality control officer Badaruddin Hamzah, 53, who works in Port Klang, was relieved that MPK took action against the illegal operator.

"We want MPK to demolish the building and remove the metal and plastic scrap.

"Once cleared, no other illegal businesses should occupy the area to ensure the safety of Taman Wangsa residents," he added.

MPK's clampdown at the scrapyard was led by senior enforcement assistant Haslinda Abd Rahman, along with five officers.

Shahrul said MPK needed to investigate who owned the land and ran the business.

On another issue, resident M. Muthu urged MPK to improve the drainage along the back lanes of Lorong Bendahara 31D and the area closer to the flats in Lorong Laksamana 31E, which is prone to flash floods.

"After 30 minutes of heavy rain, the drains overflow and flood water enters the kitchen area," he said.

Mechanic Wong Mun Choong,

35, also urged MPK's Engineering Department to repair the two flood light poles that were vandalised, and for the council to trim the trees at the children's playground.

# Bersatu open to talks with Umno

Party will continue to highlight teamwork importance between Malay-based parties

**KLANG:** Parti Pribumi Bersatu Malaysia will not give up on its efforts to patch things up with Umno, says a senior leader.

Bersatu information chief Datuk Wan Saiful Wan Jan said the party would continue to highlight the importance of continued collaboration between all Malay-based parties in the country.

He added that the outcome would be disastrous if Malay parties went their separate ways.

"All the Malay parties will face

defeat if our collaboration is discontinued.

"The Opposition will be the big winners," he said after chairing a dialogue with Bersatu leaders and grassroots representatives here yesterday.

He said the political reality now dictated that collaboration between all three Malay parties in Perikatan Nasional must remain.

"If Malay votes are divided, both Perikatan and Barisan Nasional will face difficult challenges to maintain

political power.

"Let's not just talk about the strengths of our individual parties and lose out by not collaborating.

"Our challenge is not just about party A fighting party B, we have several significant groups such as Pakatan Harapan which is indeed influential in the country and is the government in Selangor," he said.

Wan Saiful said that although Bersatu wanted the Perikatan trinity to remain steadfast, he said the

party was prepared to slug it out on its own in the event the inevitable happened.

"Our president has said clearly that if forced into a collision, we are prepared and that we can contest against anyone if we are forced to do so," he added.

He urged all Perikatan partners to think rationally and ask themselves if they wanted to go against each other and open a route for PKR and DAP to return to power.

Wan Saiful also said Bersatu

believed it would be able to wrest Selangor from Pakatan in the next general election.

"Our chances of taking over the Selangor government is very promising and we are certain the various programmes and activities we are conducting in the state will help us win," he added.

## Selangor urged to reconsider ECRL alignment

**MALAYSIA** Rail Link Sdn Bhd (MRL) has requested the Selangor state government to reconsider the decision on the realignment of the East Coast Rail Link (ECRL) project.

In a statement issued on behalf of the MRL chairman, the rail firm said the statement made by Selangor exco Izhar Hashim was "a letdown" as it had made countless engagements with the Selangor government and its related agencies to discuss plans to revert to the original alignment for the ECRL project.

According to MRL, it has also addressed all issues raised by various state agencies in the reversion to the ECRL's original alignment, along with solutions and mitigations involving environmental protection, minimising social impact and improving rail connectivity, among others.

"MRL has presented a definitive solution to the issue of safeguarding the Gombak Quartz Ridge by designing an alignment that traverses through an existing road for ECRL to cross the quartz ridge. Encroachment into the quartz

ridge by ECRL is now a non-issue," MRL stated.

The Malaysian Reserve (TMR) had earlier reported that the Selangor government is still not convinced with the current federal administration's proposal to revert the ECRL to its original planned route

that has been labelled as costly.

The state government agreed to the current planned route that runs through the state after it was modified during the last federal administration to save cost, but the current government wants the route to be reverted to the original

plan, citing investment already made.

Selangor exco in charge of public transport Ng See Han said the state is not fully convinced of the need to revert the alignment to the original route.

He said Selangor and federal

officials met several times last year, but the state government has not agreed to any changes and is not expected to change its mind.

Nevertheless, MRL said its meetings and engagements with various state agencies were still fruitful and that it had presented a better option to establish the most efficient national rail system integrating both ECRL and Keretapi Tanah Melayu Bhd while minimising any environmental and social impacts towards the people.

However, MRL is also of the opinion that the decision by the exco will only further delay the construction of ECRL's Section C (Mentakab-Port Klang) and potentially delay the scheduled overall completion of the project by December 2026.

"MRL would like to reiterate that the construction of the ECRL is of national interest and not for the benefit of any state in particular.

"It is envisioned as a game changer and catalyst for socio-economic growth that narrows the economic inequality between the West Coast and East Coast of Peninsular Malaysia," it added. — TMR

# Unclear direction weighs on Malaysia's FDIs

*Perhaps, we will need a new govt which is elected with a clear economic platform for the future of Malaysia*

**MALAYSIA** needs to chart a clear economic direction and communicate it well to multinational companies to stay ahead of the competition in attracting foreign direct investments (FDIs).

Centre for Market Education CEO Dr Carmelo Ferlito said Malaysia did very well in the past in developing regulations, institutions and infrastructures that stimulated both domestic entrepreneurship and foreign investments.

However, he said graft scandals, the lack of a general economic strategy from the previous government on top of the political instability with the current government, have made the country less attractive.

"Malaysia needs then to clarify which direction it wants to go for the future. Being open and

business-friendly or closed and entrapped into a nationalistic dialectic.

"In order to clarify this, political stability is key. Probably, we will need a new government which is elected with a clear economic platform for the future of Malaysia," Ferlito told *The Malaysian Reserve* (TMR).

He said one cannot simply adopt policies that attract skilled workers, but automatically take our foreign workers as integrated production processes may require both of them, particularly when higher salaries are not enough to attract Malaysians toward the 3D jobs — the dirty, dangerous and difficult jobs.

Senior Minister (Economy Cluster) and International Trade and Industries Minister (MITI) Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali recently denied that Malaysia is losing out foreign investments to other countries in the region.

Instead, he said Malaysia is being more selective for quality invest-

ments that can create value for local companies and not too labour-intensive that require foreign workers.

Meanwhile, Williams Business Consultancy Sdn Bhd founder and director Dr Geoffrey Williams said labour-intensive investments add value because at least they provide jobs and incomes which are spent in the local economy.

He said they should not be dismissed so lightly and certainly not because of foreign worker concerns.

He said high technology firms create worker-free businesses; making lots of money, but sending it out of Malaysia instead of having it flow through the domestic economy.

"If the government is concerned about the high use of foreign workers, then, they should enforce existing regulations on decent work and living conditions.

"This would raise standards, protect workers and make it more costly to use foreigners," Williams told TMR.

The economist said Malaysia needs to change its mindset on

foreign investment and be more, not less, open to any form of investment to increase its appeal to foreign investors.

He said the best way for MITI and Malaysia External Trade Development Corp is to engage investors on what they want.

"There is far too much guesswork in current policy and central direction of 'selective' criteria which has no real justification. In the post-Covid-19 world, investors will want new options so the government must research what those will be."

Universiti Utara Malaysia senior lecturer Muhammad Riduan bin Abdullah said Malaysia needs to enhance talent development and innovation efforts similar to how Japan and South Korea did by allocating higher share for research and development.

He said the services sector has no barriers to local high-skilled labour but the circumstances are different from other sectors as manufacturing, construction and plantation, hence a review of the policy

may be required.

He also said value-added activities and products with highly-skilled talents are important for Malaysia to compete with other countries in the region that have also stepped up their game and offerings.

PKR treasurer general Lee Chean Chung said Azmin's excuse of the country being selective cannot hold ground and the fact is neighbouring countries, Singapore as a high-income country, and Vietnam and Indonesia in the medium-income league, continued to receive strong investment.

He said the three countries received more than 80% of FDI inflows in South-East Asia in 2019.

"Azmin and Perikatan Nasional's state-of-denial would not help the government acknowledge our inherent structural weaknesses, as highlighted by the World Bank recently, and to identify new growth opportunities to propel the nation to the next level, he said in a recent statement.

# Will RCEP benefit Malaysia?

*RCEP will also provide opportunities for the country to be more competitive globally, says minister*

IT IS too early to assume that the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) will not benefit the country, as the purpose of agreement is to allow bigger market access to local industry players.

Senior Minister (Economy Cluster) and International Trade and Industry Minister Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali said the RCEP, which is expected to be ratified by year end or by the first quarter of 2020, will also provide opportunities for them to be more globally competitive.

He said based on the deliberations that ran for eight years, the ministry had also engaged many stakeholders — the industries, policymakers and non-governmental organisations to ensure that Malaysia will benefit from the agreement.

"Currently, our market is very small, how do you expect the local players to expand and be more competitive if they just confine themselves to Malaysian market?"

The RCEP's 15 members represent one-third of global GDP. So,

to suggest that our trade performance will decrease, I think it is too early because its purpose is to allow for bigger market access," he said.

Azmin was commenting on *The Malaysian Reserve's* report which stated that Malaysia's goods trade balance would decline by 36% or US\$4 billion (RM16.4 billion) per annum, post-RCEP.

According to a report by the Global Development Policy Centre of Boston University, ASEAN's overall goods trade balance is expected to deteriorate by 6% amounting to US\$8.5 billion per annum, with almost all ASEAN members including Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam seeing a decline.

Azmin was speaking to reporters after attending the Selangor state-level Majlis Rapat Malaysia Prihatin in Shah Alam last Friday.

The event offers opportunities to the economic community in Selangor to get the latest information on initiatives provided by the MITI and its agencies to help boost the state's economy.

Meanwhile, Bank Islam Malaysia Bhd chief economist Dr Mohd Afzanizam Abdul Rashid said the world is now seeing a greater integration.

He said it is extremely challenging if a country tries to exist without the help of its neighbours, espe-

cially in areas relating to investment and trade.

"Yes, trade and investment liberalisation could lead to imbalances, such as surplus in one country and deficits in another country.

"What matters is the liberalisation in a manner that would allow capacity building via transfers of technology and knowledge alongside the integration of the domestic economy and its trade partners."

Mohd Afzanizam believes such endeavour is an ongoing affair to ensure multilateral trade and investment pact would be a success.

Commenting on the Business Travellers Centre (BTC) at the Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA), Azmin said through the one-stop centre, the government has given approval to more than 8,000 investors among executive and technical expatriates for short- and long-term stays.

"Since the day we opened the BTC until the launching day, more than 40 individuals have been approved. In fact, on the day that I launched it, there were two travellers from Amsterdam enjoying the benefits and facilities at BTC.

"I spoke to many foreign chambers of commerce — American Malaysian Chamber of Commerce and Korean Chamber of Commerce in Malaysia — they were extremely happy for this BTC to facilitate the

movement of investors," he added.

Earlier in his speech, Azmin said more than 662,000 workers and 78,000 employers had been rescued through the Wage Subsidy Programme amounting to RM3.28 billion in Selangor alone.

He said 1.8 million Selangor residents from the bottom 40% and middle 40% disposable income groups had also received the National Prihatin Assistance worth RM2.8 billion.

The government also championed almost 180,000 small and medium enterprises in Selangor through the Special Prihatin Grant amounting to RM532 million.

Meanwhile, almost 9,000 small traders in Selangor were empowered with loans disbursed by the National Entrepreneurial Group Economic Fund and Bank Simpanan Nasional amounting to RM136 million. This is a 'Prihatin' (caring) government. This is the government that really cares about the people."

Although the country was hit by the pandemic in early 2020, the manufacturing sector in Selangor has remained competitive and sustainable throughout 2020.

For the 2015-2020 period, Selangor has managed to attract 1,548 projects with a total investment of RM75.9 billion which has created 100,205 new job opportunities.

加影市议会主席已致函房地部和内政部，以将双溪龙镇警察局和消防局保留地转换为公共巴刹用途。

(加影28日讯) 加影区州议员许来贤说，加影市议会主席已于3月15日致函房屋及地方政府部和内政部，以将双溪龙镇各占地0.67英亩的警察局和消防拯救局保留地（现为双溪龙社区大市场）转换为公共巴刹用途。

### 寻房地内政部同意

他指出，将上述两块保留地转换为巴刹用途需寻求房地部和内政部的同意。一旦获得批准，市议会就需进行土地转换用途的工作。

他说，土地转换用途需两三个月时间来处理，市议会也需依照程序把有关申请事宜，提呈到雪州策划委员会（SPC）。

他今早在双溪龙早市进行的加影州选区冠疫苗接种和雪州乐龄亲善基金登记活动后，向《大都会》社区报如斯指出：

### 4月3皇冠城中环巴刹办接种登记

许来贤说，加影州选区首站在双溪龙早市进行的冠病疫苗接种和雪州乐龄亲善基金登记活动，获得民众热烈响应。

他说，该服务中心与乌冷卫生局配合展开上述活动，第二站是于4月3日（星期六），在皇冠城中环巴刹进行。

“第三站在4月10日（星期六），在加影组都花园早市进行；第四站是于4月18日（星期日），在加影巴刹进

行；有关活动的时间均从早上8时30分至10时30分。”

他指出，疫苗登记是为了协助无手机和无智能手机的年长者；卫生局会在登记后联络他们接种疫苗的时间。

他说，雪州乐龄亲善基金的申请者需携带本身和受益人的大马卡副本。

他表示，在该计划下，申请者将获得每年100令吉的购物礼券，以及申请者往生后，其家人将获得500令吉的忧恤金。

到场者包括加影市议员林金瑛和王声宾。

许来贤说，与双溪龙相隔2公里的皇冠城也有警察局和消防局的保留地，皇冠城的四幅保留地比双溪龙的保留地大两三倍。

### 2保留地20年没兴建工程

他说，虽然双溪龙和皇冠城都有警察局和消防局的保留地，但过去20年，有关机构都设计计划展开兴建工程。

他表示，从2008年起，只要联邦政府未在政府保留地上展开兴建计划，该地段还是属于州政府的，若要展开土木工程才给予批准。

“早前曾发生有人滥用权利，把没用到的保留地卖掉作为发展项目，让中间人从中牟利。”

他希望房地部和内政部尽速批准上述的申请，一旦获得批准才能进行土地转换用途。
