**Puchong:** Pengurusan Masjid Kampung Seri Aman di sini terpaksa menanggung beban hutang RM400,000 dengan kontraktor ekoran tidak cukup dana walaupun masjid itu siap dibina pada Mei 2017.

Nazir masjid, Ibrahim Mokhtar, berkata kos pembinaan keseluruhan masjid itu berjumlah RM9.5 juta, hasil sumbangan orang ramai dan penduduk tempatan, yang mula dibina pada awal 2014.

Katanya, sepanjang pembinaan, pihak pengurusan membuat pem-

baruan secara berperingkat kepada pemaju namun mula berdepan masalah apabila dana di peroleh tidak mencukupi bagi menyelesaikan hutang yang ter tunggak.

"Ekoran itu kami masih meneruskan kutipan dana dan pengurusan masjid juga berterima kasih kepada pihak kontraktor yang mendahuluikan wang mereka bagi menyiapkan projek terbabit mengikut tempoh ditetapkan," katanya ketika ditemui BH.

Selain penduduk Kampung Seri

Aman yang dahulunya dikenali sebagai Kampung Pulas, masjid itu turut digunakan penduduk kampung berdekatan iaitu Seri Aman Bistari, Aman Hilir, Aman Berkat serta Aman Tengah, bagi mengadakan solat berjemaah dan kegiatan keagamaan.

Pembinaan masjid itu adalah bagi menggantikan surau Seri Nurul Hidayah yang sudah wujud lebih 50 tahun di kampung berkenaan termasuk digunakan untuk sembahyang Jumaat meskipun tidak dapat menampung jemaah yang

ramai disebabkan pertambahan penduduk.

#### Jemaah ramai

Masjid itu mampu memuatkan lebih 5,000 jemaah dalam satu-satu masa dan turut dilengkapi pejabat masjid, kuarters imam, bilal, dua bilik kuliah, bilik jenazah dan sebuah dewan makan.

Berikutnya kesulitan melunaskan bayaran terbabit, Ibrahim berkata, pihaknya mengadakan kempen mengutip sumbangan derma orang ramai bagi membantu me-

## Jumlah kutipan sampah meningkat 30 peratus sepanjang Ramadan

**SHAH ALAM** - Jumlah kutipan sampah melibatkan 11 kawasan pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT) yang diuruskan KDEB Waste Management Sdn Bhd meningkat sehingga 30 peratus sepanjang Ramadan ini.

Pengarah Urusan KDEB Waste Management, Ramli Mohd Tahir berkata, peningkatan jumlah itu disumbang melalui aktiviti memasak di rumah, premis perniagaan dan juga bazar Ramadan selain membabitkan sampah-pukal pengguna.

Menurutnya, situasi itu sudah dijangka dan pihaknya sentiasa bersedia melaksanakan kutipan sampah seperti yang dijadualkan.

"Ada sebahagian kawasan PBT yang meningkat 20 hingga 30 peratus. Sebagai contoh di Klang, sebelum bulan puasa kita ambil 750 tan sehari tetapi dalam bulan puasa terdapat tambahan 20 peratus lagi. Untuk keseluruhan Selangor, kita kutip 5,200 tan sampah sehari iaitu berlakunya pening-

katan 1,000 tan sampah sehari.

"Peningkatan jumlah sampah ini melibatkan sampah domestik terutamanya dari bazar Ramadan dan juga sampah pukal yang dibuang untuk persiapan hari raya seperti potong pokok, buang perabot lama dan sebagainya," katanya ketika ditemui pada Majlis Iftar KDEB Waste Management 2019 kelma-

rin.

Pada majlis itu, lebih 1,000 tetamu diraikan termasuk kakitangan, anak syarikat dan keluarga, 80 anak-anak yatim dan asnaf serta warga media.

Ramli berkata, pengjuran iftar itu adalah salah satu program tanggungjawab sosial korporat dan tanda penghargaan kepada semua pihak yang bekerjasama melaksanakan ama-

nah dalam menguruskan sisa pepejal di Selangor.

"Pada majlis ini juga KDEB Waste Management Sdn Bhd turut menyampaikan sumbangan duft raya kepada anak-anak yatim dan asnaf.

# PKNS tunai zakat perniagaan

P erbadanan Kemajuan Negeri Selangor (PKNS) menyampaikan sumbangan zakat perniagaan berjumlah RM200,000 kepada 10 surau dan 13 asnaf di bawah Teraju Ekonomi Asnaf Sdn Bhd (Teras).

Pengurus Komunikasi Korporatnya, Ishak Hashim berkata, ia merupakan usaha PKNS untuk menyumbang kembali kepada masyarakat terutamanya dalam bulan Ramadhan ini.

Menurutnya, selain merupakan pemaju hartanah di Selangor, pada masa sama PKNS juga memainkan peranan penting dalam pembangunan masyarakat termasuk kemajuan komuniti khususnya di bandar-bandar pertumbuhan baharu PKNS.

"Justeru, PKNS meneruskan keseimbangan program amal Ramadhan dan berkontribusi dengan membantu golongan yang memerlukan. Ia bertujuan memberi peluang kepada mereka untuk turut merasai nikmat keberkatan Ramadhan," katanya.

"Sumbangan kepada Teras adalah dalam bentuk latihan dan modal perniagaan berupa pembelian peralatan perkhidmatan cucian fabrik kepada 13 asnaf fakir miskin berjumlah RM150,000," katanya.

Menurutnya, sumbangan itu diharap mampu mengurangkan kekangan kewangan yang dihadapi mereka.

Seramai 13 asnaf fakir miskin dan seorang fakir miskin yang telah berjaya, turut diraikan dalam majlis itu.

## MDKS siasat punca gangguan lalat

**KUALA SELANGOR** - Majlis Daerah Kuala Selangor (MDKS) masih menyiasat punca gangguan lalat di empat kawasan terjejas di Kampung Parit Mahang.

Yang Dipertua MDKS, Rahilah Rahmat berkata, pemantauan masih dilaksanakan di Jalan Berkat, Jalan Makmur, Jalan Kenanga, Jalan Sepakat.

Menurutnya, hasil pemerhatian pada 15 April lalu mendapati, persekitaran kedua ladang ternakan terlibat kurang terurus.

"Seluruh kawasan persekitaran ladang terbabit dipenuhi lalat terutama di tong pelupusan bang-

kai ayam dan najis ayam.

"Kedua pemilik ladang diberikan notis dibawah Akta Kerajaan Tempatan 1976 atas kesalahan menyebabkan kacau ganggu terhadap penduduk berhampiran," katanya.

Bagaimanapun katanya, hasil pemantauan semula pada 8 Mei lalu mendapati, lalat berkekurangan di kawasan reban dan kawasan berhampiran.

"Pihak pengusaha turut dikehendaki memastikan tahap kebersihan kawasan pelupusan bangkai dan najis berada dalam keadaan bersih bagi mengelakkan aduan

berulang.

"Laporan siasatan dimajukan kepada Jabatan Perkhidmatan Veterinar, Pejabat Kesihatan Daerah Kuala Selangor, Pejabat Tanah dan Daerah Kuala Selangor dan Pejabat Penghulu untuk tindakan selanjutnya."

"Kerjasama orang ramai diperlukan untuk menyalurkan maklumat sekiranya perkara ini berulang."

# CRACKS CAUSED BY WATER EROSION

It removed soil under Block F of Taman Keramat Permai flats, says Selangor exco rep

**C**RACKS at Block F of Taman Keramat Permai flats were caused by groundwater erosion near one of the two stairs.

Selangor Housing and Urban Living Committee chairman Haniza Mohd Talha said water erosion, through time, had removed

the soil and created an empty space.

"Ikram (the Public Works Institute of Malaysia), in its report, said the groundwater had compromised the (stability of the) stairs on one side of the block, causing cracks to appear on the walls.

"Soil samples were taken from the block for further tests.

"According to the report by Ikram and the consulting firm, which was completed last week, the block was deemed safe to occupy.

"Repair work is being carried out to cover the cracks by a contractor, while Ikram will continue monitoring the building for six months for any sign of movement," she told the *New Straits Times* yesterday.

Haniza said redevelopment

plan for the flats was still on the table, pending the outcome of engagement sessions with stakeholders on the guidelines.

"The stakeholders include mu-

nicipal councils in the state and housing management bodies. We expect the guidelines to be ready in two months and they will be presented to the Selangor Economic Planning Committee.

"Any decision for redevelopment of old private and public housing schemes, including Taman Keramat Permai flats, will depend on the guidelines. We do not wish to make decisions in haste.

"We are gathering data (on old housing schemes) and feedback before deciding on the next course of action."

It was reported that 118 residents from 37 families at the block were evacuated following the discovery of cracks on the fourth and fifth floors of the building.

The victims were relocated to a

temporary shelter set up by the Ampang Jaya Municipal Council. They were allowed to return home on May 4.

Checks at the flats yesterday revealed that repair work to fill up the cracks was ongoing, with scaffolding erected in the affected areas.

Resident Shabnam Shaheen, 37, said she had been feeling uneasy since returning home.

"The consultant had taken samples of the soil here. We will have to wait for the laboratory result to know whether there are possibilities of further movement.

"We are on alert... ready to move out if the incident recurs. We might consider looking for another place to stay if the cracks reappear. I will not risk the safety of my children," said the mother of three.

# 'Back lane most ideal for trash pick-up'

Residents in four neighbourhoods want MPK to continue original route after grace period ends in June

FOUR neighbourhoods in Klang want waste management contractors to continue collecting domestic waste from the back of houses.

For over more than 40 years, residents in Southern Park, Taman Petaling Indah, Taman Chi Liung and Taman Palm Grove have been putting their rubbish in the garbage cubbyhole at the back of their respective terrace houses.

They said the back lanes of old neighbourhoods such as theirs were built wide enough for rubbish trucks.

Their unhappiness over garbage collection arose when Klang Municipal Council (MPK) president Datuk Mohamad Yasid Bidin informed households to put their rubbish in front and directed contractors to collect waste from the front of houses because the back lanes were being damaged by trash compactors.

The four neighbourhoods objected and repeated their request for the collection to return to the back lanes.

Southern Park Residents Association president Patrick Lee Wei Keong said the residents in the four neighbourhoods were against the local council's order to leave the domestic trash at the front of their houses.

"Our neighbourhoods are well-planned and the design accommodates the collection of waste at the back lanes. Domestic waste is mostly food scraps that rot. It is smelly and unsightly, so it should be disposed of in the back lanes and not in the front of our homes," he said.

He added that residents in the four neighbourhoods had voiced their dissatisfaction at the end of March and MPK granted a three-month grace from April to June for the continuation of rubbish collection at the back lanes.

Selangor Government appointed KDEB Waste Management Sdn Bhd to handle domestic waste collection and public cleansing in Klang and numerous other districts.

Taman Palm Grove Rukun Tetangga secretary Subhash Kumaran agreed with Lee that waste posed a threat to public

health as leachate could ooze out from the bags and contaminate the front of the houses.

"I want to emphasise that the wide back lanes are service roads meant for rubbish collection and other utility services.

"Our trash bins are at the back of the houses. Some have even built waste chambers at the back of their houses.

"Residents in all the four neighbourhoods involved have always neatly placed their rubbish bags according to the scheduled collection," he added.

Subhash said residents would hold a signature campaign to get MPK to resume the original collection route.

He said the campaign would also create awareness of proper rubbish disposal to keep the back lanes clean.

Taman Petaling Indah Residents Association president T. Ganesan said residents had been taking their rubbish out to the back of their houses for the past four decades.

"All households here have been placing neatly tied rubbish bags in

the designated bins for collection. Making people put the rubbish at the front is going to clutter the road and it is unsuitable," he said.

Lee said the rubbish compactors should use the back lanes because the front roads were busy with traffic, parked cars and other delivery services.

"We have an ageing population who go out for walks in the mornings, there are school buses plying these roads and people driving in and out of their gates, so we cannot have rubbish compactors going on the front roads too," he said.

Taman Chi Liung Rukun Tetangga president Barrie Ganeson said MPK's unilateral decision to force residents to place the rubbish in the front of the houses was unreasonable.

"We want MPK to cancel the move as all the residents are against the decision.

"On our side, our associations have informed the people not to obstruct the back lanes to ensure the trash compactors can pass through smoothly. All have followed that advice," he added.

# Stalled project turned into eyesore

Taman Palm Grove folk also find reptilian intruders coming from site

TAMAN Palm Grove residents in Klang want the developer of a stalled mega project to clean up the abandoned site that is filled with weeds, creepers and fallen metal hoardings.

The six-hectare site was where the Gateway Klang (formerly known as One Gateway Klang) mixed development project was supposed to be built.

Instead, the area is now filled with debris and rusted steel rods protruding from concrete piles. The site has been abandoned for more than six years.

Pandamaran assemblyman Tony Leong Tuck Chee said he had received complaints about the unkempt area of the abandoned project.

"Under the Street, Drainage and Building Act 1974, the landowner or in this case the developer must keep the land of the stalled project clean and not allow it to become a nuisance to the surrounding neighbourhood.

"I will inform Klang Municipal Council (MPK) to act on this immediately," said Leong.

"MPK must issue an immediate notice to the developer to rectify the situation.

"If the developer fails to get it done within 14 days, MPK has the right to get a contractor

to do the job and bill the developer for it," he added.

Taman Palm Grove Rukun Tetangga secretary Subhash Kumaran said the council should warn the developer to keep the site clean.

"Our neighbours are stressed out because huge monitor lizards and pythons have appeared in this residential area.

"It has turned into a breeding ground for reptiles," he said.

Suleka Madhvan, 69, whose house faces the project site, said her neighbours spotted green iguanas in the drains and even a Malayan weasel in people's backyards.

Lakshmi Samy Nair, 69, said the dilapidated metal hoardings around the project site had attracted scrap metal thieves who had been ripping out loose hoardings.

"Creepers are growing over the hoardings, and we want the developer to clean up the place," she said.

## MPK gives hefty discounts for parking fines, valid till June 2

KLANG Municipal Council (MPK) is offering discounts for parking compound notices from as far back as eight years ago.

Offenders with compound notices issued between 2011 and 2015 need only pay RM5 for each ticket, while those with notices issued between 2016 and 2019 have to pay RM15 per ticket.

The discounts are valid until June 2.

Council president Datuk Mohamad Yasid Bidin said MPK was offering the discounts in conjunction with the 129th Council Day.

"We have lowered the amount to RM5 and RM15 because we want people to pay up.

"We hope motorists take this chance to settle their long overdue fines," he said.

Mohamad Yasid, however, stressed that the discount was not offered to offenders who parked in bays designated for

disabled persons.

Matilda Gomez, 63, said she received a letter from MPK informing her of the discount.

She has 24 compound notices, which added up to a hefty sum.

"I am glad for the discount, and I will pay the fines," she added.

Father of 10, Mat Pilus Jawi, 55, said he would be able to settle his five MPK traffic offences with the discounted fine of RM5.

The local council had sent out hundreds of letters to defaulters of parking fines, stating the original amount and the new total after discount.

Payments can be made at the council's office counters, temporary booths at selected malls, MPK kiosks and vans or via MPK's SmartParking App and online banking. — By EDWARD RAJENDRA
