Selangor tops in economic growth last year

PETALING JAYA: Seven states in Malaysia posted gross domestic product (GDP) growth at a faster pace than the national level (4.3%) in 2019, with Selangor topping the list at 6.7%. Federal Territory (WP) Kuala Lumpur stood at 6.0%, followed by Kelantan (5.3%), WP Labuan (5.2%) Negri Sembilan (5.1%), Kedah (4.6%) and Perlis (4.6%).

Meanwhile, seven states registered better growth compared with the previous year. There are Kelantan 5.3% (2018: 2.6%), Negri Sembilan 5.1% (4.2%), Kedah 4.6% (4.0%), Perlis 4.6% (3.3%), Pahang 3.7% (3.0%), Terengganu 3.3% (2.5%) and Sarawak 2.5% (2.2%).

An improvement in the agriculture sector, which was reinforced by an increase in production of oil palm activity, rubber and vegetables, and a better performance in services sector contributed to the growth momentum in several states.

Chief Statistician Malaysia Datuk Seri Dr Mohd Uzir Mahidin said the State Socioeconomic Report 2019 found that the number of graduates in Malaysia increased 6.9% to 5.3 million persons in 2019, from 4.9 million persons in 2018. The graduates labour force participation rate (GLFPR) was 83.5%, a drop from 83.6% in 2018. Selangor and Sabah recorded the highest GLFPR in 2019 at 86.5%, followed by WP Putrajaya 85.9% and Sarawak 85.3%. The lowest GLFPR was posted by Perlis with a rate of 76.1%.

Based on the findings of the Household Income and Basic Amenities Survey, Kuala Lumpur attained the highest median income of RM10,549 followed by Putrajaya (RM9,983), Selangor (RM8,210), Labuan (RM6,726), Johor (RM6,427), Penang (RM6,169) and Malacca (RM6,054).

Meanwhile, a lower rate of unemployment was registered by eight states, among them are Terengganu, Johor, Penang, Sarawak and Putrajaya. Malacca recorded the lowest jobless rate in 2019 at 1.1%.

Sebanyak 37 projek perumahan terbengkalai di Selangor yang berada di bawah pemantauan Jawatankuasa Pemulihan Projek Terbengkalai Pihak Berkuasa Tempatan menjadi perhatian kerajaan negeri untuk dibaik pulih.

Sehingga Julai lalu, 81 daripada 180 projek perumahan terbengkalai di Selangor dipulihkan sejak 2008.

Ia termasuk kejayaan kerajaan negeri melalui Menteri Besar Selangor (Pemberadanan) (MBI Selangor) menyelesaikan penantian 203 pembeli rumah Idaman Warisan di Alam Perdana, Ijok selepas terbengkalai sejak 1999.

Menteri Besar Selangor, Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari berkata, daripada keseluruhan projek terbengkalai itu hanya dua projek menggunakan dana kerajaan negeri untuk dibaik pulih dan ia hanya babitkan infrastruktur.

Katanya, kerajaan negeri bersama pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT) akan memantau status setiap projek dan mengemas kini dari semasa ke semasa.

"Kebanyakan pembaikan atau kerja pemuliharaan ini akan dilakukan kontraktor atau pemaju penyelamat."

"Dalam kes projek Idaman Warisan, ia dibaik pulih konsortium LBS Bina Group Bhd dan Worldwide Holdings Bhd," katanya selepas majlis penyerahan kunci rumah kepada 203 pemilik asal projek Idaman Warisan Shah Alam, semalam.

Dengan hanya bermodalkan RM1,000, seorang lelaki Bangladesh boleh menikahi wanita warga tempatan dengan bantuan 'tok kadi' senagaranya yang menawarkan perkhidmatan itu sejak beberapa bulan lalu.

Tindakan terdesak itu hanya digunakan untuk 'menghalalkan' tindakan mereka menetap lebih lama di negara ini selain memudahkan urusan perniagaan yang bakal menggunakan identiti wanita tempatan dinikahinya.

Modus operandi licik itu dikesan dilakukan dua lelaki Bangladesh dikenali sebagai Farouk dan Ali dengan menjadikan sebuah rumah di pangsapuri di Seksyen 25 di sini, sebagai markas.

Difahamkan lokasi itu menjadi tumpuan sindiket beroperasi berikutan kawasan itu didiami ramai warga asing khususnya Bangladesh, Myanmar dan Nepal sejak beberapa tahun lalu.

Berperanan sebagai tok kadi, dua lelaki terbabit menawarkan perkhidmatan mereka kepada rakan senegara yang mahu bernikah dengan wanita tempatan tanpa perlu melalui prosedur ditetapkan pihak berkuasa agama negeri.

tan walaupun tanpa sebarang dokumen pengesahan dikeluarkan Jabatan Agama Islam Selangor (Jais)," katanya kepada Harian Metro.

Katanya, wanita warga tempatan diberi nafkah bulanan kerana membenarkan identiti mereka digunakan dalam permohonan lesen.

"Sebarang masalah berkaitan pihak berkuasa tempatan diuruskan si isteri," katanya.

Tambahnya, lelaki warga asing itu menggunakan alasan kedai diusahakan adalah milik isteri sekiranya pemeriksaan lanjut dijalankan.

"Kegiatan nikah pantas ini dikesan giat berlaku selepas pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT) menyita perniagaan diusahakan warga asing termasuk individu yang menyalahgunakan permit kerja di negara ini," katanya.

Nazilah berkata, tindakan sedemikian perlu dikekang secara menyeluruh kerana ia dikhuatiri akan memesonkan akidah umat Islam kerana pernikahan dijalankan tidak menepati syarat sah seperti ditetapkan.

IT HAS been eight years since the River of Life Public Outreach Programme (RoL-POP) was launched to address pollution of two Klang Valley waterways, by getting the community involved in their preservation.

RoL-POP is one of the main pillars under the RM4.4bil River of Life project to protect Sungai Klang and Sungai Gombak.

RoL-POP, which is due to end by this year, is spearheaded by the Drainage and Irrigation Department (DID) with the aim of empowering the public to carry out river care efforts.

Currently, some 10 groups of communities that were created under the programme are actively continuing their river care activities.

Positive impact

Global Environment Centre (GEC) river care programme coordinator Dr K. Kalithasan described the community groups as one of the positive outcomes of RoL-POP and similar programmes.

"We have been involved in river care efforts for the past 20 years and there has definitely been some changes for the better."

"In the past, community involvement was mostly reactive, meaning they would report to authorities if they saw any wrongdoing."

"But now it is changing from reactive to proactive, with communities coming together, either under RoL-POP or as individuals, to encourage others to actively participate in river care through various efforts."

"We are slowly but surely seeing this positive change in the mindset of the public," he said.

The RoL project is divided into three components – river cleaning, river beautification and land development.

Under the river cleaning component, the public outreach programme was initiated in 2012 to foster partnerships, improve attitudes and behaviours of target groups as well as initiate long-term and sustainable change in behaviours towards protecting the river.

Target groups identified included the general public, local communities, educational institutions, industries, corporations and developers as well as food establishments, wet markets and workshops – with different programmes planned for each target group.

RoL-POP was carried out in phases beginning with Phase 1, involving the upper Sungai Klang basin, proceeding to Phase 2 for

the Sungai Bunas basin while Phases 3A, 3B, 4 and 5 were carried out concurrently from 2017.

GEC was appointed the consultant for Phase 3 which covers 98.49sq km of catchment areas including Sungai Gombak, Sungai Batu, Sungai Irtijang and Sungai Keroh that flows into Sungai Klang.

Reasons to care

Kalithasan said any sustainable environmental programme required an economic model.

"We need to show the community that environment management can lead to something tangible."

"This can include the setting up of a community garden, where they are able to harvest their produce either for themselves or for sale," he explained.

Under Phase 5, three successful community gardens have been established. They are AUI Community Garden, Seri Terengganu Community Garden and Muriam Magna Community Garden.

Asia-Pacific Environmental Consultants (Aspec) director Dr Jamie Chong said there had been increased willingness to participate in RoL-POP activities and learn more about caring for the river

including its preservation and protection.

"The targeted communities now see river care and protection as their responsibility and most are concerned about the state of the river."

"This was especially noticeable among educational institutions," she said.

DID appointed Aspec to spearhead the initiatives under Phases 3B and 4 and collaborate with target groups to tackle river pollution and improve water quality.

Phases 3B and 4 involves working with communities around the Ampang Jaya and Selangor municipalities.

Chong said a recent social survey among 2,000 respondents in a catchment area showed that the programme had succeeded in raising awareness as well as changing public attitudes and behaviour towards river care, including advocating for its protection.

"As a public outreach programme, it has managed to reduce river pollution and improve water quality," she said, adding that the

targeted communities also possessed in-depth knowledge about the importance of river care and preservation.

Stricter enforcement

However, Kalithasan pointed out that community efforts must be complemented by enforcement such as hefty fines to prevent people from littering or throwing rubbish into the river.

"Empowering and educating by action is good but this must be backed up with enforcement by the various agencies and authorities."

"If any river-related complaints are reported, there must be swift action. Otherwise community engagement would be a failure."

"This is not to say there has been zero enforcement, but there is a lot of room for improvement," he said, adding that the relevant agencies should work in tandem and not in silos when addressing river-related issues.

On the response from target groups, Kalithasan said their biggest challenge was development projects.

"Even with environmental management plans, we still find many cases of pollution."

"Activities like illegal sand washing and land clearing are also not being addressed fast enough."

Despite the challenges, he was confident that river care efforts in the country were moving in the right direction.

"Efforts by local communities are very encouraging and will continue with or without programmes like RoL-POP."

"Even within government agen-

cies, many of the officers genuinely care about these issues but are often hampered by bureaucracy," he added.

More to be done

With the deadline looming for the end of the programme, DID river basin management division director Md Khairi Selamat said the department had proposed to Federal Territories Ministry to extend the programme.

"We had suggested focusing on the community target groups because there are rapid development and population increase upstream of the Sungai Klang basin, which can increase waste-water and sewage."

"These community programmes should be continued," he told StarMetro.

He noted that many communities had responded positively to RoL-POP since it was implemented three years ago.

"From there, they have set up community groups such as Friends of Sungai Klang, Friends of Sungai Batu and Friends of Sungai Ampang."

"These groups are among the RoL-POP initiatives to prepare the community to take care of the rivers themselves," he elaborated.

Md Khairi highlighted that community gardens, murals and riverside cleaning programmes were some of the projects that had been carried out.

"The only way to ensure that these initiatives will be sustained is if the communities and the government work together to make sure our rivers are clean and cut down pollution," he said.

BEHIND a brightly painted cabin in Taman Melawati, Ampang, flows a pristine Sungai Klang.

This stretch of the river is surrounded by trails, parks, gardens and farms.

The impetus to transform the riverbank was provided by the River of Life Public Outreach Programme (RoL-POP).

After the programme was initiated here in 2012, the community set to work turning the dirty and overlooked riverbank into a thriving site.

Friends of Sungai Klang Taman Melawati River Three (FoSK TMR3) founder Kennedy Michael said rehabilitating rivers was a long-term project.

"Simply organising ad-hoc *gotong-royong* to clean up rivers will not work in the long run. There must also be strong commitment," he said.

Michael is also Society of Greater Eco Melawati (SGEM) deputy chairman. They were one of the first groups of residents to participate in RoL-POP Phase 1 in 2012.

Since then, several core members of the group formed FoSK TMR3 to further transform the riverbank.

The group has set up its own Melawati River Care and Environment Centre by the banks of Sungai Klang, which runs through Taman Melawati, and partnered with several schools to carry out river monitoring activities.

"There were several initiatives at the beginning under RoL-POP, but it began to falter after a while.

"Our aim now with FoSK TMR3 is to transform the riverbank of Sungai Klang into a 'river park,'" said Michael.

He explained that the building of trails, parks, gardens and farms at the banks of these rivers would help change the public's perception that rivers and their banks were a waste-dumping point.

"By making them accessible, we create opportunities to educate and inform the public on the important role that rivers play, allow for pub-

lic participation and create a sense of ownership to care for the rivers," he added.

Since 2018, FoSK TMR3 has carried out the longest continuous community *gotong-royong* in Malaysia, currently at 107 weeks and counting.

Each Saturday, members and participants show up at the riverbank to carry out any task needed.

The group has created a Pollinator Garden to attract bees, butterflies and other wildlife, besides a vegetable garden and other ongoing projects.

"It has come to a point where we have people coming in at different times of the week without being

prompted," said Michael.

The programme has been replicated at the riverbank between Mid Valley City and Pangsapuri Abdullah Hukum in Kuala Lumpur.

Here, the FoSKL Mid Valley River Three group has had a harder time encouraging the local community to participate in the clean-up.

Syuen Toh, a core member of the group, said it took more than a year before some of the flats' dwellers joined in.

"After we cleared several tonnes of rubbish by the riverbank, several residents started planting a vegetable garden on their own initiative," she said.

Tujuh negeri mencatatkan pertumbuhan Keluaran Dalam Negara Kasar (KDNK) melepasi paras nasional tahun lalu pada 4.3 peratus, dengan Selangor mencapai pertumbuhan tertinggi sebanyak 6.7 peratus diikuti Wilayah Persekutuan Kuala Lumpur pada 6 peratus.

Lima negeri lain yang mencatatkan pertumbuhan ekonomi melebihi paras nasional pada 2019 adalah Kelantan (5.3 peratus), Wilayah Persekutuan Labuan (5.2 peratus) Negeri Sem-

bilan (5.1 peratus), Kedah (4.6 peratus) dan Perlis (4.6 peratus).

"Pada masa sama, kajian penyusunan profil KDNK mengikut daerah sedang dibangunkan oleh Jabatan Banci Penduduk dan Perumahan Malaysia 2020 (Banci 2020) bakal menyediakan penanda aras untuk membekalkan statistik sosioekonomi terpenting antaranya demografi penduduk, aktiviti ekonomi serta pekerjaan pada peringkat ter-

kecil seperti daerah dan mukim.

"Ketepatan data yang diperoleh daripada Banci 2020 akan memberikan input signifikan kepada penyusunan KDNK daerah.

"Justeru, amat penting bagi semua pihak agar dapat bersama menjayakan Banci 2020 bagi menjamin kualiti maklumat yang akan digunakan dalam penyusunan KDNK daerah dan statistik sosioekonomi berasaskan kawasan geografi," katanya dalam satu kenyataan.

Usaha memulihkan projek terbengkalai yang dahulunya dikenali sebagai Taman Arcadia itu dimulakan pada September 2016 apabila MBI Selangor menandatangani perjanjian Pemulihan Projek Alam Perdana bersama konsortium di antara LBS Bina Group dan Worldwide Holdings.

Mengulas lanjut Amirudin berkata, penyerahan kunci itu membuktikan komitmen kerajaan negeri dalam memastikan rakyat menerima pulangan yang baik hasil perkongsian strategik serta

tadbir urus korporat yang cekap. "Dalam perjanjian pemulihan asal, rumah ini pada mulanya akan diserahkan tanpa perabot dan kelengkapan elektrik sama seperti projek perumahan lain.

"Namun pada tahun lalu, saya mengumumkan pemberian perabot dan kelengkapan elektrik sebagai insentif kepada pemilik yang menunggu sekian lama mendapatkan rumah mereka," katanya.
