PKNS berjaya realisasi misi, visi

Bina lebih 200,000 unit kediaman kondusif untuk rakyat Selangor

Selepas 56 tahun penuhnya, Perbadanan Kemajuan Negeri Selangor (PKNS) berjaya mewujudkan misi dan visinya dalam membina komuniti, memperkasakan kehidupan, mewujudkan impian rakyat Selangor untuk memiliki kediaman serba lengkap.

Kejayaan itu sekali gus membentuk persekitaran kehidupan yang vibrat dan lestari menerusi inovasi berterusan serta perkhidmatan melangkau ekspektasi kepada pelanggan ini.

Ketua Pegawai Eksekutif PKNS, Datuk Mohd Azizi Mohd Zain berkata, sehingga kini PKNS berjaya menyediakan lebih 200,000 unit kediaman yang kondusif kepada rakyat Selangor.

Menurutnya, sejak ditubuhkan pada tahun 1964, PKNS mewujudkan 11 bandar baharu antaranya termasuk Shah Alam, Kota Damansara, Kelana Jaya, Bandar Sultan Sulaiman, Antara Gapi, Bernam Jaya, Kota Puteri, Selangor Cyber Valley, Rasa, Petaling Jaya dan Ampang.

Beliau berkata demikian pada sesi wawancara bersama media sempena sambutan ulang tahun ke-56 PKNS di ibu pejabatnya di sini baru-baru ini.

Hadir sama, Pengurus Besar Pembangunan Wilayah Tengah, Azmi Adnan; Pengurus Kanan Jualan Hartanah Wilayah Tengah, Ishak Hashim dan Pengurus Kanan Jualan Hartanah Wilayah Utara, Azilah Arshad.

Cabar

Mengulas mengenai cabaran yang dilalui sepanjang pernubuhannya sejak 56 tahun lalu, Mohd Azizi mengaku PKNS turut berdepan situasi getir namun berjaya menghadunginya dengan baik.

Malah, katanya, PKNS turut terkesan dengan pandemik Covid-19 yang melanda negara ketika ini apabila penjualan unit-unit kediaman yang sudah siap dibina agak perlahan.

"Untuk menangani masalah itu kita mempelbagaikan permulaan yang sebelum ini menuju rus kepada sektor perumahan dan harta tanah dengan hampir 60 peratus anak-anak syarikat milik PKNS terlibat secara langsung dalam sektor ini.

"Kita ada 11 anak syarikat yang kesemuanya terlibat dalam sektor pembinaan sama ada secara langsung atau sebaliknya. Bagaimanapun, PKNS masih memiliki anak-anak syarikat yang terlibat dalam sektor lain

F PKNS turut membina perumahan mewah untuk memberikan nilai tambah dan pilihan kepada pelanggan walaupun jualannya sedikit perlana berbanding projek perumahan mampu milik dengan harga RM500,000 ke bawah."

seperti penjagaan kesihatan, pengurusan seminar, tenaga dan perhotelan yang mampu menjana pendapatan kepada syarikat," katanya.

Mohd Azizi berkata, untuk perancangan 10 tahun akan datang, PKNS perlu melibatkan diri dengan membina kediaman bagi golongan M40 dan melaksanakan projek pembinaan semula di kawasan yang strategik.

"Walaupun kita masih belum terlibat dalam projek pembinaan semula ini tetapi perhatian perlu diberikan dalam jangka masa 10 tahun akan datang.

"Malah, jika kita mempunyai kemampuan kewangan, kita juga perlu meningkatkan kapasiti landbank yang ketika ini sudah berkurangan. Jadi kita kena cari tanah atau kawasan baharu untuk dimajukan," katanya.

Hospitaliti

Sementara itu, Mohd Azizi berkata, selain fokus kepada perniagaan, PKNS juga tidak lupa melaksanakan tanggungjawab sosial korporat (CSR) kepada masyarakat apabila turut terlibat dalam menyediakan kemudahan hospitaliti kepada frontliner ketika negara berde-

TALK is rife that new chiefs are expected at Ampang Jaya Municipal Council (MPAJ) and Sepang Municipal Council (MPSepang) by next month.

Speculations abound that MPAJ president Datuk Abdul Hamid Hussain could be leaving his current post to head MPsepang with MPSepang president Mohd Fauzi Mohd Yatim taking over the top post in MPAJ in a direct swap.

Multiple sources have indicated that the changes could take place as soon as September.

When asked if there was any truth to this, Abdul Hamid replied that there had not been any official notice but he had heard about the possibility of a change.

"I will be sad to leave Ampang Jaya but I look forward to returning to Sepang," he said.

Abdul Hamid served as the Petaling Jaya City Council assistant secretary from 1992 until 1997, after which he was appointed as the MPsepang secretary from 1997 until 2002.

He was MPAJ's secretary from 2002 to 2014, during which he also served as acting president from

Mohd Fauzi is expected to take the top post in MPAJ.

September 2013 to December 2014.

He was appointed as MPAJ president in 2015.

Abdul Hamid said he focused on developmental issues during his time in Sepang.

"I was involved in large-scale

development projects such as the building of the Kuala Lumpur International Airport, the Sepang International Circuit and Cyberjaya.

"This is unlike Ampang Jaya, which is a more matured area and residents' issues are at the forefront," the 53-year-old said.

It is no secret that Abdul Hamid is a popular council president with residents, staff and councillors.

He is known for a genial attitude and open-mindedness but is also known to come down hard on those who fail to perform.

"Abdul Hamid is an easy-going person and always champions community projects.

"He listens attentively to our issues and tries to resolve them. He will be missed," a residents association chairman said.

Meanwhile, Mohd Fauzi was the Hulu Selangor district officer before he was appointed as MPSepang president in 2018.

HUNDREDS of vehicles were subjected to a multi-agency operation along Shah Alam Expressway (Kesas) in a bid to clamp down on smoke-emitting vehicles.

The operation named Ops Gerak Lembah Klang 2020 was part of a nationwide drive to curb pollution from vehicles following the reopening of the economy under the recovery movement control order (MCO).

A total of 110 officers from Selangor Environment Department (DOE), police, Road Transport Department, Kuala Lumpur City Hall and Kesas were involved in the operation which started at 9am on both directions of the highway.

DOE director-general Norlin Jaafar said vehicles were tested for the allowed limit of pollutants and smoke density, and drivers whose vehicles operated outside of the limits faced action.

"Out of the 415 examined vehicles, 31 vehicles were found in violation of the Environmental Quality (Control of Emission from Diesel Engines) Regulations 1996, Environmental Quality (Control of Emission from Petrol Engines) Regulations 1996 and Environmental Quality (Control of Emission from Motorcycles) Regulations 2003.

"A total of 13 compounds, 14 order notices and four prohibition notices were issued.

"Some were able to settle the compound while others were given a time frame to pay up before we take legal action," she said during a press conference following the operation held at the Awan Besar Rest and Service Area.

Since the monthly nationwide operation started in July, 1,829 vehicles in the Klang

Valley have been examined and 53 compounds were issued to violators.

Norlin said the operation was part of the department's initiative to ensure that motorists and transportation fleet operators abided by the law.

"It is aimed at containing pollution from vehicles so that air quality after the MCO will

remain clean.

"It is also to ensure that vehicle exhaust fumes do not contribute to haze, especially in cities," she said.

Air Selangor: 400km-long old pipelines replaced

SHAH ALAM: Pengurusan Air Selangor Sdn Bhd (Air Selangor) has replaced 400km-long old water pipelines in the state since 2016, said Selangor Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari. He said works to replace the old pipes were carried out in areas which were prone to unstable supply or low water pressure. "Since 2016, Air Selangor has replaced 150km stretch of pipes each year," he told reporters at the Setia Alam Convention Centre here. Also present was Air Selangor chief executive officer Suhaimi Kamalzaman. Amirudin said the pipeline replacement project was Air Selangor's 30-year plan and the agency was committed to continue with it as part of its proactive measures to tackle water disruption issues in the state.
