

# Gangguan bekalan air berjadual di Sabak Bernam hari ini

SABAK BERNAM - Sebanyak sembilan kawasan di daerah Sabak Bernam akan mengalami gangguan bekalan air berjadual berikutan kerja-kerja pencucian paip agihan.

Aplikasi Air Selangor dalam satu kenyataan memaklumkan, penutupan bekalan air sementara dari jam 9.30 pagi hingga jam 5.30 petang itu mengikut jadual kawasan terjejas bermula hari ini sehingga Jumaat ini.

Katanya, sebanyak dua kawasan di Teluk Rhu dijangka terjejas berikutan perlaksanaan kerja-kerja pencucian paip agihan bermula hari ini.

"Penutupan sementara bekalan air membabitkan pengguna di Jalan Karim Utara dan Jalan Permatang," katanya menerusi satu kenyataan di sini semalam.

Menurutnya, gangguan sama berlaku di dua kawasan iaitu di Lorong Angkasa dan Jalan Haji Said pada Selasa berikutan kerja-kerja pencucian paip agihan di Kampung Teluk Pulai dan Tebuk Jawa.

Katanya, lima kawasan lagi akan mengalami gangguan pada Rabu, Khamis dan Jumaat ini.

"Dua kawasan terjejas mengalami penutupan bekalan air sementara pada Rabu ialah di Jalan Haji Anuar dan Jalan Wan Mood, manakala pada Khamis pula membabitkan Jalan Lorong Cempaka dan Jalan Karimun.

"Jalan Tepi Kunci Air JPS, Sungai Panjang pula mengalami gangguan bekalan air pada hari Jumaat," katanya.





# LRA Sungai Linggi beroperasi semula

Selepas lima hari terhenti susulan kerja-kerja pembaikan tebing Sungai Linggi yang runtuh

oji Rawatan Air (LRA) Sungai Linggi beroperasi semula semalam selepas lima hari terhenti susulan kerja-kerja pembaikan tebing Sungai Linggi yang runtuh.

Ketua Bahagian Perhubungan Awam Syarikat Air Negeri Sembilan (Sains), Norzita Ismail berkata, kerja-kerja menambak tebing oleh Jabatan Pengairan dan Saliran (JPS) telah berjaya dilaksanakan.

"Hari ini (semalam), Sains mula menerima aliran air sungai memasuki muka sauk untuk loji menjalankan proses pengepaman air mentah dan seterusnya membekalkan air terawat ke premis pengguna di daerah Seremban terlebih dahulu.

"Ia sehingga loji dapat bekalan air mentah yang mencukupi untuk menjalankan operasi pengepaman secara keseluruhan ke daerah Port Dickson," katanya dalam satu kenyataan semalam.

Menurutnya, Sains akan memastikan seluruh kawasan gangguan di Port Dickson dan Seremban akan mendapat bekalan air terawat selewat-lewatnya Rabu ini secara berperingkat bergantung kepada kerja-

kerja di tapak oleh pihak JPS.

Beliau berkata, Sains memahami setiap kesulitan pengguna yang menghadapi gangguan bekalan air melebihi tempoh 24 jam.

"Pelbagai usaha telah dilaksanakan oleh Sains untuk memastikan kawasan gangguan dapat dikecilkan dengan memanjangkan bekalan air daripada sumber air yang berdekatan seperti Bukit Kunyit, Seremban Barat dan Spring Hill untuk daerah Port Dickson.

"Kita juga telah mengambil bekalan air dari LRA Sungai Terip untuk daerah Seremban selain membeli air dari Selangor untuk kawasan Tanah Merah Site A, Port Dickson," katanya.

Norzita berkata, kerjasama berterusan daripada pihak operator air lain seperti Pengurusan Air Selangor (Air Selangor), Ranhill Syarikat Air Johor (RanhillSAJ), Syari-

kat Air Melaka Berhad (SAMB), Pengurusan Air Pahang (Paip), Lembaga Air Perak (LAP) dan Syarikat Air Terengganu (Satu) dengan menghantar lori tangki dan kakitangan mereka amat membantu Sains.

Menurutnya, penglibatan bomba juga banyak membantu dalam kerjakerja pengagihan air di sekitar kawasan terlibat gangguan serta pihak Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM) yang banyak membantu melicinkan pergerakan lori tangki Sains sepanjang usaha pengagihan bekalan air dilakukan.

"Sains akan terus memberi maklumat terkini melalui laman web rasmi www.sainswater.com atau di Facebook Pusat Khidmat Pelanggan Sains serta Apps iSAINS. Para pelanggan yang memerlukan maklumat lanjut dan terkini boleh juga menghubungi Sains di talian bebas tol 1-800-88-6982," katanya.





## Haphazard parking raises residents' ire

They say project workers causing obstruction along several roads in SS21 neighbourhood

RESIDENTS in parts of SS21, Petaling Jaya are blaming workers at an infrastructure project nearby, for traffic and cleanliness prob-lems in the neighbourhood.

The residents alleged that the workers at the LRT3 project site office in the area are causing traffic

obstruction.
Savinderjeet Singh, who lives in Jalan SS21/6, said the residents claimed that their cars and houses were blocked by vehicles belonging to the workers at a building former-ly occupied by a home furniture

company. He said most of the workers accessed the office via Jalan SS21/2 and Jalan SS21/3, and parked along Jalan SS21/2, Jalan SS21/13 and other available space in the resi-

'The workers' vehicles are often parked haphazardly or obstruct back lanes and our view at road

"Residents also have problems exiting their homes

"In addition, the workers drive at high speeds within the neighbour-hood," he said.

Savinderjeet said this was a daily problem and mostly affected those living along Jalan SS21/2, Jalan SS21/6, Jalan SS21/10 and Jalan SS21/13

Jalan SS21/13 is located parallel to where the LRT3 infrastructure

and station are being built. Jalan SS21/2 resident Sally Louis said she was once blocked from exiting her home by one of the

"I was working from home and

my husband, who was sick, needed to go to the clinic. "Luckily my son's car was availa-ble," she said.

Sally was upset that the LRT3 workers were not more mindful of where they parked, as their incon-siderate behaviour could have caused a medical emergency in her case or accidents in a residential

Savinderjeet said the problem had been ongoing for about a year, but it became worse these past few months.

"We have lodged complaints with the LRT3 contractors, but they hav-

en't addressed our concerns. "They told us that a carparl would be built behind their site

But we also don't want the carpark access to go through our neighbourhood," he said.

He suggested that the workers park their cars at the nearby mall instead and use the shuttle service to transport workers from the mall to the project site. Damansara Utama Residents and

Owners Association (Duroa) presi-dent Habeeb Rahman also alleged that the LRT3 workers were dirtying the neighbourhood by throwing rubbish such as face masks, food containers and water bottles by the

"We are quite sure the littering and haphazard parking are by the

"It does not make sense for residents to litter outside their homes," he said.

Habeeb was also concerned about the safety of residents here, particularly senior citizens and

children, as well as the noise pollution coming from the speeding vehicles and construction site. "We have complained to our

councillor, and she has promised to bring them up to Petaling Jaya City Council," he said.

LRT3 project delivery partner MRCB George Kent Sdn Bhd (MRCBGK) refuted the residents

"Our cars are parked within the designated parking areas that do not obstruct residents' access," said project director Patrick

Hwang.
He said the temporary carpark

would be ready by Nov 14. He also said MRCBGK had reminded its staff and work package contractors to be mindful of safety, cleanliness and traffic meas-

"We have intensified our house keeping from twice a week to six days a week from Monday to Saturday," he said, explaining that the housekeeping activities were carried out to keep the surrounding housing areas and drains

## Miti: Signing of RCEP to be key outcome of Asean summit

KUALA LUMPUR: The signing of the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) Agreement will be the central outcome of the 37th Asean Summit and Related Meetings, to be held virtually from Nov 9-15. The Asean Summit will be hosted by Vietnam who is the Asean chair for 2020.

The RCEP agreement would make this grouping the largest free trade agreement in the world, covering nearly half of the world's population while contributing one third of the world's gross domestic product.

The agreement, which has been in negotiation since 2013, would enhance regional economic integration, promote the flow of investments and strengthen global supply chains, the International Trade and Industry Ministry (Miti) noted in a statement yesterday.

According to the ministry, leaders are all set to convene at the summit, and Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin will lead the country's delegation accompanied by Senior Minister cum International Trade and Industry Minister Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali alongside Foreign Minister Datuk Seri Hishammuddin Tun Hussein.

With Asean member states still battling the Covid-19 pandemic, Miti said the summit will be an ideal platform to discuss ways and means to deal with the health and economic challenges.

Under the theme "Cohesive and Responsive", member states will also focus on how best to enhance unity, cooperation and solidarity towards regional economic integration

Prior to the Leaders' Summit, the economic ministers will convene at the Asean Economic Community Council Meeting to discuss tangible solutions and the way forward to support the recovery of the regional economy by keeping markets open for trade and investment. In this regard, the proposed Asean Comprehensive 2 Recovery Framework (ACRF) and its implementation plan, will be submitted for the Asean Leaders' endorsement at the summit. "Our expectation is for the ACRF to be implemented so as to provide sustainable solutions to economic recovery made all the more imperative because of Covid-19," Azmin said.— Bernama



## Wider drains to prevent flash floods in Klang

WIDER drains are being built to alleviate flash floods in three housing areas in Klang. Klang Municipal Council (MPK) Engineering Department director Zamri Othman said the older drains could no longer accommodate the high water volume. He said wider drains would do a better job in holding, controlling and regulating water movement due to high rainfall.

fall.

"It will also prevent overflow onto the roads and backflow.
"Having larger drains is a viable solution to lessen the occurrence of flash floods in older neighbourhoods," he added.

Sentosa assemblyman G. Gunarajah said the new wider drains would be built in Taman Menara Maju, Taman Seri Mewah and Kampung Miskin. "It is cost-efficient and easier to

maintain "The drains in these areas are

"The drains in these areas are more than 20 years old.
"Some parts of them have slipped due to soil settlement, while other sections of the drains are broken and blocking water flow," he said.
Gunarajah said RM3mil from the Malaysian Road Record Information System (Marris) funds would be used for Taman Sentosa area.
Marris funds are from the Federal Government channelled into a trust fund for maintenance

purposes. StarMetro checked Taman Menara Maju and saw workers building the drains in Jalan Tan Sri Manickavasagam 3, 9 and

The work, which is estimated to cost RM298,000, will include fixing the road kerbs around the drains.

drains.
Gunarajah said the earth drain bordering Jalan Tan Sri Manickavasagam 1 would be upgraded to fix the problems of water backflow.
"Construction work was delayed because of the movement control order.
"But with work progressing in all three areas, we expect it to be completed at the end of this month," he added.

## Dark stretch source of worry

### Faulty street lights along Jalan Puchong raise fears of break-ins

RESIDENTS of Taman Aman Sari in Puchong have had sleepless nights for the past two months because of faulty street lights along Jalan

Puchong.

Hoi Chee Kheong said the affected main road faced the backyards of several houses in Jalan 18A

As the area was pitch-dark at night, he said, houseowners were worried that burglars might scale the retaining wall to enter their property.

"It is easy to climb over the retaining wall separating these

"Due to the movement control order (MCO), the roads here are also practically devoid of traffic after 10pm," said Hoi. Aman Sari Homeowners

Association secretary Rajendran Mudaliar said many break-ins had occurred in the residential area a few years ago.

"It took place during the day when the occupants were not at

"Residents are now afraid burglars might enter their homes when they are asleep at night," he said. He pointed out that a row of trees along the length of the retaining

wall outside the housing area made it worse.

"Intruders can use these trees to climb into the properties," he

Rajendran said complaints had been made to Subang Jaya City Council (MBSJ) about the faulty street lights and hoped that they would be fixed soon.

Faulty street lights in Jalan Puchong Sri Cempaka Apartments To Kuala Lumpur -Jalan 18b Sekolah Kebang Bukit Kuchai Affected area covers a 500m stretch.

Mechanic Ng Chee En, who works at a tyre shop along this stretch, said the road was mostly used by

motorcyclists.

"Without proper lighting, they cannot see the potholes and this can cause accidents," he said.

Motorcyclists also face the danger of getting rammed from behind

when stopping at junctions before turning into either Aman Sari, Taman Tenaga or Jalan Merbuk

Subang MCA division chairman Lawrence Chiew, who had received complaints from the residents, said the affected area covered a 500m stretch and 20 non-functioning street lights along Jalan Puchong

"Those heading towards Puchong cannot see the right turn into

Taman Tenaga.
"Meanwhile, people heading towards Kuala Lumpur have to drive on a downhill slope for 200m before arriving at a T-junction near Taman Kandan.

"Without street lights, motorists cannot see stationary vehicles at the

traffic lights," he said.

There is a bus stop facing the back of the row of houses in Jalan 18A, meaning passengers getting off at this stop at night will have to walk in the dark.

MBSI councillor Kavitha Chandrasegaran said complaints had been forwarded to Public Works Department (JKR) as these street lights were under its purview.

Selangor JKR road division superintendent civil engineer Zainuddin Hussain said an electrical trip had caused the street lights to malfunc-

"Petaling JKR will ask the contrac-tor to check and fix the problem immediately," he assured.

## Hawkers' reluctance to move delays upgrade

FOOD stall operators along Jalan 13/4 in Petaling Jaya, who were ordered to move out to make way for upgrading work, are reluctant to do so due to economic uncertainty.

There are 10 hawker stalls located along the road shoulder since the 1970s.

Last week, Petaling Jaya City Council (MBPJ) ordered the stall owners to vacate the premises for demolition work to take place.

Petaling Jaya mayor Datuk Mohd Sayuthi Bakar said MBPJ could not carry out work to shift water pipes located beneath the stalls.

"The pipes need to be moved to the opposite side of the road.

"We have delayed this project several times and it is adding to MBPJ's cost," he said. He highlighted that the hawkers were given several options for relo-

cation, namely Pasar Besar Jalan Othman, Kompleks C in Jalan Sultan and PJ Midtown in Section 13.



The hawkers along Jalan 13/4 in Petaling Jaya are reluctant to move due to high rentals and uncertain business elsewhere.

The traders should consider moving to Kompleks C as there is better customer traffic and rental is

"PI Midtown comes with a RM1,000 rental. We will give them a 50% discount although some may

still find it expensive.
"We cannot delay the work any longer," said the mayor.
The hawkers' representative, Md Ismail Kassim, 51, said it was not the right time for them to move, especially due to Covid-19.

"We have been here for decades. "Rental elsewhere is expensive and we have to build our new base of customers.

"We also have to buy new equipment to start business elsewhere, and it can cost up to RM10,000," he said, adding that they currently

paid a rental of RM60.
"As for PJ Old Town, we will not

get a good crowd there.
"Kompleks C has existing stalls
with their regulars," said Ismail.
He also said the stalls at Jalan

13/4 had suffered a 70% dip in busi-

ness since the pandemic hit.
"We hope the city council will allow us to stay on until middle of next year," he added.

Petaling Jaya resident Mohamed Umar Peer Mohamed said he had helped the hawkers to send a letter to Selangor Mentri Besar Datuk Seri Amirudin Shari to halt the relocation and demolition of the


