Selangor kaji letak meja luar restoran

➔ MPSJ akan dirujuk mengenai permit guna kawasan parkir untuk letak barang dagangan

Kerajaan negeri akan menyemak semula dasar berhubung kebenaran meletak meja makan di luar restoran, terutama di kawasan parkir, susulan insiden pelanggan maut dirempuh kenderaan dekat Seri Kembangan, malam Ahad lalu.

Menteri Besar Selangor, Amirudin Shari, berkata pihaknya akan merujuk kembali pihak Majlis Perbandaran Subang Jaya (MPSJ) mengenai permit menggunakan kawasan parkir untuk meletak barang dagangan, termasuk meja dan kerusi.

"Menurut dasar sedia ada, pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT) mengeluarkan kebenaran kepada pengguna-

sah kedai makan untuk menggunakan kawasan parkir yang selamat dalam tempoh ditetapkan, kebiasaannya selepas waktu kerja.

"Bagaimanapun, dalam kejadian yang menyebabkan seorang wanita maut itu, saya khatir sama ada pengusaha restoran terbabit melanggar syarat ditetapkan, namun perkara ini harus disemak terlebih dahulu dengan MPSJ."

"Selain itu, kerajaan negeri akan menyemak semula dasar sedia

ada," katanya ketika dihubungi, semalam.

Dalam kejadian kira-kira jam 8 malam Ahad lalu, seorang maut, manakala empat lagi cedera apabila sebuah kenderaan pacuan empat roda Toyota Hilux terbabsas dan merempuh sebuah restoran di Jalan Equine 9B, Taman Equine, dekat Seri Kembangan.

Media sebelum ini melaporkan siasatan awal polis mendapati pemandu lelaki berusia lingkungan 20-an berasal dari Sarawak itu di-

percaya berada bawah pengaruh alkohol ketika kejadian, malah tidak memiliki lesen memandu.

Mengulas lanjut, Amirudin berkata, pihaknya turut bersympati dengan kemalangan menimpa mangsa dan mengucapkan takziah kepada ahli keluarga mendiang.

Pengaruh alkohol

"Kejadian itu diperkatai berpuncak daripada pemandu yang memandu bawah pengaruh alkohol. Justeru, faktor itu perlu diambil kira.

"Bagaimanapun, pihak kami juga akan meminta MPSJ menyiasat perkara ini sama ada restoran berkenaan melanggar sebarang syarat kebenaran.

"Kami tidak akan teragak-agak menarik balik permit itu jika mereka dan pengusaha lain di kawasan terbabit gagal mematuhi peraturan ditetapkan," katanya.

Sementara itu, usaha wartawan untuk mendapatkan kenyataan daripada MPSJ sejak kelmarin masih gagal.

Isu bahasa: Orang Melayu tidak perlu apologetik

PENGUNAAN tulisan Cina pada papan tanda jalan di sekitar Shah Alam, Selangor mencetuskan perbahasan hebat masyarakat sama ada dalam ruang maya atau di kedai-kedai kopi. Meskipun ditentang hebat pelbagai pihak, Majlis Bandaraya Shah Alam (MBSA) enggan menenangkan suasana apabila tetap berpegang dengan keputusan Jawatankuasa Tetap Kerajaan Tempatan Negeri Selangor pada 13 Oktober 2017.

Ternyata ia bukan isu kecil apabila kelmarin, Sultan Selangor, Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah menitahkan semua papan tanda itu diturun dan digantikan sebelum hari keputeraan baginda. Mengulas hal itu, Ahli Fakulti Pusat Penyelidikan Dasar dan Kajian Antarabangsa (Cenpris) Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM), PROFESOR DATUK DR. AHMAD MURAD MERICAN berkongsi buah fikirannya dengan wartawan *Utusan Malaysia*, HADI AB. MANAP.



Tulisan papan tanda urusan rasmi kerajaan

KUALA LUMPUR 20 Nov. - Tulisan pada papan tanda jalan perlu menggunakan bahasa Melayu sepenuhnya kerana ia merupakan urusan rasmi yang memerlukan penggunaan bahasa kebangsaan.

Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka (DBP) dalam satu kenyataan menjelaskan, berdasarkan peruntukan Perlembagaan Persekutuan dan Akta Bahasa Kebangsaan 1963/67 (Akta 32), bahasa Melayu perlu digunakan dalam semua urusan rasmi kerajaan termasuk pada papan tanda jalan.

Menurut DBP, maksud 'rasmi' dalam Perkara 152 membawaerti apa-apa maksud kerajaan sama ada kerajaan Persekutuan atau kerajaan negeri dan termasuklah apa-apa maksud sesuatu pihak berkuasa tempatan.

"Seksyen 2, Akta 32 menetapkan bahawa bahasa kebangsaan hendaklah digunakan bagi maksud rasmi dan Seksyen 9 pula menjelaskan bahawa tulisan bagi bahasa kebangsaan ialah tulisan Rumi.

"Dengan syarat bahawa ini tidak melarang penggunaan tulisan Melayu yang lebih dikenali dengan nama tulisan Jawi bagi bahasa kebangsaan," jelasnya dalam kenyataan itu.

"Penggunaan bahasa kebangsaan di tempat awam termasuklah pada papan tanda jalan akan mencerminkan citra negara Malaysia."

Isu papan tanda jalan dengan tulisan Cina di Shah Alam, Selangor mula 'panas' apabila gambar tersebut dimuat naik oleh penduduk sekitar dan tular dalam media sosial.

Tambah kenyataan itu lagi, memandangkan penggunaan tulisan dan bahasa pada papan tanda jalan di bawah bidang kuasa pihak berkuasa tempatan, DBP berharap agar semua pihak menjunjung tinggi semangat Perlembagaan Persekutuan dan undang-undang setia ada.

"Penggunaan bahasa kebangsaan di tempat awam termasuklah pada papan tanda jalan akan mencerminkan citra negara Malaysia," jelasnya.

UTUSAN: Adakah ini bukan isu besar?

AHMAD MURAD: Tidak, ini isu besar, segera dan ia bukan perkara baru. Apa alasan sekalipun, tindakan sebegitu tidak wajar. Inilah masalah pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT). Tidak kira di kawasan pekan atau bandar mana sekalipun di Malaysia, papan tanda jalan dalam bahasa Melayu bukan hanya keutamaan tetapi satu kewajipan. Walaupun tidak ada undang-undang dalam mananya akta atau undang-undang kecil, yang Dipertua PBT mesti bertindak bukan hanya sebagai birokrat dan penjawat awam tetapi juga sebagai pemelihara warisan dan budaya.

Bahasa jiwa bangsa. Patutkah penggunaan tulisan Cina dengan alasan alternatif 'dwibahasa'?

Jika kaum-kaum lain masih lagi gagal menguasai bahasa kebangsaan, mereka perlu belajar dan membaca. Itu salah mereka kerana tidak ada alasan atas nama alternatif dwibahasa. Malah, perlu ditambah

selain daripada tulisan Rumi, papan tanda jalan di Malaysia sepatutnya menggunakan tulisan Jawi di atas tulisan Rumi. Ia hendaklah konsisten. Kalau orang bukan Melayu mengadu, kita mesti jawab bahawa apakah huruf Jawi itu hanya untuk orang Islam dan Melayu? Hal ini kerana orang bukan Melayu juga boleh belajar dan membaca dalam tulisan Jawi. Hal ini berlaku di banyak tempat di dunia.

Titah Sultan Selangor kelmarin telah memberikan gambaran ia bukanlah sesuatu perkara yang patut diputuskan oleh Jawatankuasa Tetap Kerajaan Tempatan Negeri Selangor. Apa komen Profesor?

Saya percaya ia sepatutnya tidak diputuskan sebegitu dan ini bukan soal siapa yang patut memutuskan di peringkat negeri. Soal bahasa Melayu ialah soal nasional dan bukan negeri atau daerah. Maksudnya, Perlembagaan Persekutuan dan kerajaan Pusat mesti menetapkan sama ada secara dasar atau pentadbiran mengenai bahasa

di papan tanda jalan. Jika dasar dan pentadbiran gagal, gubal akta pada peringkat Persekutuan melalui Parlimen.

Apakah punca kepada isu ini? Puncanya ialah larai dan tidak bertanggungjawab serta takut dan apologetik kepada pihak bukan Melayu.

Saranan kepada kerajaan negeri dan PBT lain agar perkerasama tidak berulang?

Pegawai dan penjawat awam Melayu perlu berhenti menjadi birokrat kosong dalam soal-soal bahasa dan budaya. Jika kita tidak mengharapkan mereka, siapa lagi yang dapat melaksanakan tugas itu dan jika mereka larai serta tunduk kepada desakan maka mereka tidak objektif dalam menjalankan tugas. Yang Dipertua, pegawai dan ahli majlis PBT mesti salah satunya menjalani kursus sejarah dan warisan negara dan setempat. Ahli majlis mesti lulus peperiksaan bahasa Melayu, sejarah dan warisan setempat dan nasional. Sikap positif mesti diwujudkan.

SHAH ALAM 20 Nov. - Menteri Besar, Amiruddin Shari akan menghadap Sultan Selangor esok, katanya ringkas kepada pemberita ketika ditemui selepas majlis sambutan Maulidur Rasul peringkat negeri di Stadium Malawati di sini hari ini.

Sultan Sharafuddin turut berkenan mencemar duli merasmikan sambutan Maulidur Rasul itu.

Amiruddin bagaimanapun enggan mengulas lanjut berhubung pertemuannya dengan Sultan Sharafuddin dan hanya menyifatkan sebagai perjumpaan biasa bagi membincangkan isu pentadbiran kerajaan negeri.


Semalam, Sultan Sharafuddin menitahkan agar papan tanda jalan yang mempunyai



Thousands observe Prophet Muhammad's birthday celebrations

PETALING JAYA: This year's Maulidur Rasul, or the observance of the birthday of Prophet Muhammad, was celebrated nationwide.

In Selangor, Mentri Besar Amirudin Shari led a 2km procession from Shah Alam Stadium to Melawati Stadium.

Joining him were state secretary Datuk Mohd Amin Ahmad Ahya, Selangor Islamic Religious Department director Datuk Haris Kasim and Selangor Mufti Datuk Mohd Tamyes Abd Wahid.

The procession involved the participation of some 3,000 representatives from 84 contingents, comprising government departments and agencies.

In Alor Setar, the celebration was held at Dewan Sri Negeri, Wisma Darul Aman. Kedah Ruler Sultan Sallehuddin Sultan Badlishah, his consort Sultanah Malilia Tengku Ariff and Raja Muda of Kedah Tengku Sarafudin Badlishah Sultan Sallehuddin joined in the event.

Also present were Mentri Besar Datuk Seri Mukhriz Mahathir and his wife Datin Seri Norzietta Zakaria.

The Sultan, in his speech, advised Muslims to uphold moral values and stay away from undesirable elements such as crime and drug abuse that could lead to moral decadence in the society.

He said parents played an important role in inculcating good moral values in their children.

In Penang, 55 contingents involving more than 2,700 participants, including from various government departments, agencies and non-governmental organisations, took part in a 2km procession from Maahad Al-Mashor Al-Islami to Balik Pulau Polytechnic.

Deputy Chief Minister Datuk Ahmad Zakiyuddin Abdul Rahman, Penang Islamic Religious Council

president Datuk Abdul Malik Abul Kassim and state secretary Datuk Seri Farizan Darus also joined in the procession.

In Perak, the state-level celebration was held at the Advanced Technology Training Centre near Kamunting. It was attended by 2,000 people and led by Raja Muda of Perak Raja Jaafar Raja Muda Musa.

Also present were Raja DiHilir Perak Raja Iskandar Dzulkarnain Sultan Idris Shah and Mentri Besar Datuk Seri Ahmad Faizal Azumu and his wife Datin Seri Dr Noeme Ashikin Mohammed Radzi.

In Kuala Terengganu, despite a drizzle, Mentri Besar Dr Ahmad Samsuri Mokhtar joined 2,000 people in a procession from Dataran Shahbandar to the state stadium.

Terengganu Ruler Sultan Mizan Zainal Abidin and Sultanah Nur Zahirah also attended the celebration.

Sultan Mizan, in his speech, called on Muslims to practise the true teachings of Islam.

He said they should also emulate the practices of Prophet Muhammad in everyday life, including the way he talked and socialised, to present

a positive picture of Islam.

In Johor, more than 7,000 people took part in a 1km procession from SM Sri Mersing to Masjid Jamek Bandar Mersing.

Leading the procession was Tengku Temengong of Johor Tunku Idris Iskandar Sultan Ibrahim, who represented his father Sultan Ibrahim Ibni Almarhum Sultan Iskandar.

Also present was Mentri Besar Datuk Osman Sapian.

In Melaka, 6,429 participants from 111 contingents, led by Chief Minister Adly Zahari, took part in a

4km procession from the Hang Tuah Stadium to Dataran Masjid Al-Azim.

The celebration was also attended by Yang di-Pertua Negeri Tun Dr Mohd Khalil Yaakob.

In Kota Kinabalu, Yang di-Pertua Negeri Tun Juhar Mahiruddin and his wife Toh Puan Norlidah R.M. Jasni led more than 10,000 participants in a state-level procession from Sutera Avenue to the Sabah state mosque.

Chief Minister Datuk Seri Mohd Shafie Apdal, Law and Native Affairs Minister Datuk Aidi Moktar and other Muslim state cabinet members also joined in the 1.4km walk.

In his speech, Mohd Shafie called on his administration to work together with the people to instil unity in order to spur development.

In Sarakei, Yang di-Pertua Negeri Tun Abdul Taib Mahmud and Chief Minister Datuk Patinggi Abang Johari Tun Openg joined more than 5,300 participants in a 3.5km procession.

In his speech, Abdul Taib said Islam was a religion that did not oppress others, but united people of all races and religions.

In Kuantan, the state-level celebration at Masjid Sultan Ahmad Shah I was attended by Regent of Pahang Tengku Abdullah Sultan Ahmad Shah and Tengku Puan Tunku Azizah Aminah Maimunah Iskandariah.

Tengku Abdullah, in his speech, advised the people to avoid a conflict in the country, adding that they should always respect and help others regardless of race and religion.

He expressed disappointment that there were some people who wanted to change the country's political landscape by accepting the western policy of equality. — Bernama

Dual language road signs out

Shah Alam dismantling them after decree from S'gor Ruler

SHAH ALAM: The Shah Alam City Council, responding to a royal decree, has begun dismantling road signs in the city with both Malay and Chinese languages written on it.

The dismantling of all such signs is being done in stages and is expected to be completed soon, said the council's corporate and public relations division head Shahrin Ahmad.

The Sultan of Selangor Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah, in a decree on Monday, wanted all these road signs to be changed before his 73rd birthday on Dec 11.

The decree was made known through his private secretary Datuk Mohamad Munir Banir.

"We will uphold the decree and replace the road signs, which included Chinese characters, with those in the Malay language only," said Shahrin.

A Shah Alam resident had uploaded a post on Twitter, questioning the use of road signs which also featured Chinese characters, as the majority of residents in the city are Malays.

The individual had also asked what had happened to the Jawi script that was used on the road signs before.

The council, in its reply to the Twitter user, explained that the meeting of the Selangor local government committee on Jan 13 last year had decided on the use of road signs with two languages, besides the romanised script.

It added that the Jawi script will be used in road signs in traditional villages, and the Chinese characters for road signs in new villages.

In Putrajaya, Shah Alam MP Khalid Samad said all quarters should abide by the decree of the Sultan of Selangor.

The Federal Territories Minister said the matter in Shah Alam came under the jurisdiction of the Selangor government. — Bernama

Living on the edge in Taman Ukay Heights

Residents continue to live in fear as only temporary measures are taken to prevent soil erosion at site of mudslide

CONDITIONS attached to a project site as stipulated by a local authority are there for a reason – to prevent untoward incidents.

However, reports of disasters as a result of non-adherence to pre-set conditions at construction sites crop up all the time.

The recent incident at Taman Ukay Heights in Ampang is one such example.

The affluent neighbourhood is not flash-flood prone, but on Nov 11, residents were caught off guard when muddy waters rushed downhill creating a river-like current that damaged everything in its path.

A downpour was the precursor to the flash flood affecting a large part of the housing estate leading up to Lorong Kolam Ayer Lama.

The incident even caused a retention wall at one of the houses to collapse.

A project site uphill of the housing estate was identified as the source of the problem.

Ampang Jaya Municipal Council (MPAJ) had earlier issued a temporary stop-work order to the project contractor for failing to adhere to conditions of the work site.

The stop-work order was issued because of aggressive traffic flow of lorries and unsafe work conditions.

Part of the conditions to the stop-work order was to build silt traps, wash troughs and rearrange traffic flow.

However, before the contractor could fulfil the conditions, the flash flood occurred.

The contractor, according to MPAJ, was engaged to upgrade the monsoon drains and carry out slope strengthening and stabilisation works.

According to residents, an estimated 60,000 tonnes of soil and rubble was dumped and loaded onto the slope skirting the ravine at Jalan Teberau.

This figure was derived based on the number of lorries (20-tonne lorries) carrying soil to the site.

Heavy rain on Nov 11 caused water to push the earth downhill, causing havoc in Ukay Heights.

On Nov 13, Ampang MP Zuraida Kamaluddin visited the neighbourhood to gauge the situation.

When met at a separate event, Zuraida, who is also the Housing and Local Government Minister said a construction site nearby was responsible for the flash floods.

She said the ministry would need to review and study ways to stop flash floods caused by activities at construction sites.

StarMetro visited the neighbourhood when clean-up works were under way and found MPAJ, KDEB Waste Management Sdn Bhd and a group of workers undertaking the task.

Residents claimed that the landowner of the site sent workers to help in the clean-up effort.

However, workers clearing silt from the drains were seen dumping



earth back from where it originated.

Residents who caught the workers in action, put a stop to it.

Dr R. Sharmila said it was ridiculous to dump the earth back at the project site as another downpour could cause another mudflow.

After the earlier mudflow, residents fear for their safety should the next downpour unleash another nightmare in their path.

A resident, who declined to be named, said, "Many landowners develop and redevelop their land, as well as reconstruct their houses in big scale, and the neighbours patiently put up with the inconvenience.

"But this landowner has totally disregarded the effects of the activities to the surrounding."

"With an estimated 60,000 tonnes of earth uphill, it is like 60,000 cars waiting to come crashing down on my property," he said, adding that the roads were also damaged by the heavy use by lorries carrying earth.

Another resident, who also declined to be named, said there were natural streams running on the land which were buried under

piles of earth.

"The water may be seeping underground which can be disastrous in the future. We don't want another Highland Towers incident."

"With no trees or vegetation holding the earth, we also fear the ravine will be affected and collapse as it is very close to the road."

"A soil erosion will be disastrous as there are more houses uphill and downhill," she said.

MPAJ councillor D. Nallan said he was aware of the case.

"We asked for the silt and debris from the drains to be cleared but not to be dumped back on the land. There must have been a mistake."

"MPAJ has also given approval to use tarpaulin sheets and cover the exposed earth as a temporary measure to prevent soil erosion."

"We have also planned for a meeting with the residents tomorrow to brief them about our findings and find a permanent solution," he said.

MPAJ press relations officer Norhayati Ahmad confirmed that the monsoon drains had been cleared to prevent flash floods from recurring.

MBSA REMOVING DUAL-LANGUAGE SIGNS

It will be completed soon, says Shah Alam City Council officer

SHAH ALAM

THE Shah Alam City Council (MBSA), responding to a royal decree, yesterday began dismantling road signs in both the Malay and Chinese languages in the city.

MBSA Corporate and Public Relations Division head Shahrin Ahmad said the work to dismantle such signs was being done in stages and was expected to be completed soon.

Sultan of Selangor Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah, in a decree relayed on Monday through his private secretary, Datuk Mohamad Munir Banir, wanted the road signs to be changed and the work completed before his 73rd birthday on Dec 11.

"MBSA upholds the decree of the sultan of Selangor and will replace the road signs," said Shahrin. A resident here had uploaded a post on Twitter questioning the use of dual-language road signs in the city where the

majority of the residents are Malays.

The individual had also asked what happened to the Jawi script that had been used on the road signs before.

MBSA, in its reply to the Twitter user, had said that the meeting of the Selangor Local Government Committee on Jan

13 last year had decided on the use of road signs with two languages besides the romanised script.

It had said Jawi scripts would be used for road signs in traditional villages and Chinese scripts for signs in new villages, depending on the community in the area.

In Putrajaya, Shah Alam member of parliament Khalid Samad said all quarters should abide by the decree of the sultan on the changing of road signs.

Khalid, who is the federal territories minister, said road signs here came under the jurisdiction of the Selangor government.

He said there was no problem

with the road signs in the federal territories.

"It is only rational for the road signs to be retained in the Malay language for the convenience of the people," he said after attending the national-level Maulidur Rasul celebration at the Putrajaya International Convention Centre. **Bernama**

Amirudin: State govt will review policy

PETALING JAYA: The state government will review the policy of allowing dining table and chairs placed outside eateries, especially in nearby parking areas.

This follows an incident, which saw a four-wheel-drive vehicle crash into five restaurant customers, killing a female diner at Jalan Equine 9B, Taman Equine, Seri Kembangan, last Sunday.

Selangor Menteri Besar Amirudin Shari said the state government would refer the matter to the Subang Jaya Municipal Council (MPSJ) on the issuance of permits, which allowed parking areas to be used for placing eateries' merchandise, including tables and chairs.

"Based on the existing policy, local authorities could issue permission to eateries to use parking areas for a stipulated period of time, usually after working hours.

"In the incident which saw a woman being killed, I am concerned that the restaurant operator was in breach of the stipulated conditions. However, this should be checked with MPSJ. The state government will also review the policies," he told the New Straits Times Press.

"We will ask MPSJ to investigate the matter, whether the restaurant was in breach of any stipulated conditions. We would not hesitate to withdraw the

(eateries') permit, if it and other operators in the area failed to comply with the regulation."

The driver involved in the incident was detained on Monday morning and had been remanded for four days to facilitate investigation.

Serdang district police chief Assistant Commissioner Ismadi Borhan said the man, in his 20s, would be remanded until tomorrow.

Ismadi said the Sarawakian was an unlicensed driver and was believed to have been operating the vehicle in an intoxicated state.

The case is being investigated under Section 4l(l) of the Road Transport Act 1987.
