Berucap pada majlis itu, Reezal Merican berkata, beliau yakin pengukuran kemampuan

bandar ini akan memperkukuhkan usaha PBT dalam memberikan perkhidmatan terbaik kepada rakyat, seterusnya berusaha meningkatkan tahap kemampuan bandar dan tahap daya huni di kawasan masing-masing.

Katanya, KPKT amat menyokong usaha kejuranan hijau untuk disebar luas ke seluruh peringkat komuniti bagi memperkasakan pembangunan hijau yang merupakan salah satu fokus kerajaan sejak Rancangan Malaysia ke-10 lagi.

"Kami di KPKT akan terus memberdaya agenda Malaysia Berdaya Huni sebagai landasan asas menggembleng usaha semua pihak individu, komuniti, PBT mahupun pihak berkuasa negeri agar sama-sama menuju kerangka Keluarga Malaysia.

"Malah, program AKH ini diwujudkan untuk memberi pengiktirafan kepada individu, komuniti setempat, institusi awam dan swasta serta PBT yang telah melaksanakan pelbagai

inisiatif kejuranan hijau di kediaman atau di premis masing-masing," katanya, hari ini.

Beliau berkata, di Malaysia, tahap kemampuan bandar diukur melalui sistem yang diperkenalkan PLANMalaysia iaitu Jaringan Penunjuk Mampan Bandar Luar Bandar Malaysia (MURNInets) sejak 1998 lagi.

"Pelaksanaan MURNInets selaras dengan Matlamat Pembangunan Mampan (SDG) dan Agenda Perbandaran Baharu yang kini menjadi hala tuju utama pembangunan di peringkat global, sekali gus turut menjadi agenda utama pembangunan negara.

"Pengukuran Bandar Mampan di Malaysia dilaksanakan, berasaskan kepada kerangka MURNInets yang mengandungi lima strategi, enam dimensi, 20 tema dan 39 penunjuk yang dibentuk berdasarkan dasar pembangunan utama negara berkaitan ekonomi, sosial dan fizikal," katanya.

# Jangka ratifikasi CPTPP tahun depan

**PETALING JAYA:** Malaysia dijangka meratifikasi Perjanjian Komprehensif dan Progresif bagi Perkongsian Trans-Pasifik (CPTPP) selewat-lewatnya pada pertengahan tahun depan.

Menurut Menteri Kanan Perdagangan Antarabangsa dan Industri, Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali, ia berikutan kajian analisis kos faedah (CBA) perjanjian itu yang dijangka dapat dimuktamadkan pada akhir tahun ini.

"Kita melaksanakan CBA sekali lagi pada tahun ini memandangkan dunia sedang menghadapi pandemik dan harus melihat semula kesan daripada perjanjian perdagangan antarabangsa yang sudah ditandatangani.

"CBA yang dimuktamadkan pada hujung tahun ini akan dikemukakan dan mendapat mandat baharu daripada jemaah menteri sebelum proses dalaman dapat diteruskan," katanya selepas merasmikan Sidang Kemuncak Aeroangkasa Malaysia (MyAERO'21), di sini semalam.

itu diterajui oleh Pejabat Penyelaras Industri Aeroangkasa Kebangsaan (NAICO) di bawah Kementerian Perdagangan Antarabangsa dan Industri den-

gan kerjasama Institusi Jurutera Malaysia (IEM).

Terdahulu dalam ucapannya, Mohamed Azmin menegaskan perusahaan kecil dan sederhana

(PKS) tempatan perlu memperhebat rangkaian produk aeroangkasa dan rantaian nilainya di peringkat antarabangsa.

Jelasnya, ini sejajar dengan

sasaran pendapatan industri aeroangkasa mencecah RM30 bilion menjelang 2025.

Kata beliau, Rancangan Malaysia Ke-12 (RMK12) telah melakar hala tuju pencapaian industri aeroangkasa sebagai sektor strategik yang akan merealisasikan aspirasi negara untuk menjadi hab antarabangsa.

"Untuk memartabatkan ekosistem aeroangkasa di Malaysia, adalah penting untuk kita meningkatkan pembentukan nilai merentasi keseluruhan rantaian nilai dalam usaha memperkukuh ekosistem sektor berkenaan.

"Beberapa pelanggan segmen pengeluaran produk tulen (OEM) juga telah menyatakan hasrat untuk mendapatkan komponen daripada syarikat tempatan dan kita lihat sudah ada syarikat besar yang mengambil peluang membida projek-projek ini.

"Mereka memerlukan sokongan daripada PKS tempatan maka saya menyeru PKS meningkatkan rantaian nilai mereka dengan menggunakan teknologi terkini dalam usaha memenuhi rantaian nilai terutama berkaitan reka bentuk produk dan pemrosesan," ujarnya.

### Mintah ketepi rasa sakit

**PETALING JAYA:** Penyerang Terengganu, Jordan Mintah menyifatkan pengorbanannya menahan sakit susulan kecederaan siku demi Piala Malaysia berbaloi apabila berjaya meledak dua jaringan dalam aksi menentang Selangor, Ahad lalu.

Mintah belum cergas 100 peratus ekoran kecederaan yang dialami bahkan rasa sakit masih lagi dirasai ketika beraksi di Stadium Majlis Bandaraya Petaling Jaya (MBPJ) yang menyaksikan skuad kendalian Nafuzi Zain meraih kemenangan 3-1 ke atas Selangor sekali gus mengekalkan rekod bersih.

Namun, penjarang terbanjak Liga Perdana itu tidak menjadikan kecederaan sebagai halangan besar untuk menjadi tulang belakang pasukan selepas berjaya meledak dua jaringan menerusi sepakan percuma sekali gus meletakkan Terengganu juara Kumpulan B.

"Sebenarnya perlawanan tadi (Ahad) saya masih rasa sakit lagi dan belum cergas sepenuhnya sebab setiap kali kalau terjatuh memang akan rasa sakit di bahagian siku.

"Tetapi, saya tahu saya perlu berkorban untuk Piala Malaysia sebab saya mahu berikan apa yang penyokong mahu dan setiap kali saya di padang, saya akan lupa semua rasa sakit," ujarnya

nya tidak boleh meraikan jaringan namun perlulah mematuhi SOP kerana keselamatan adalah keutamaan ketika penularan Covid-19 belum lagi terkawal sepenuhnya.

"Bayangkan jika Terengganu menerima nasib seperti Negeri Sembilan sudah pastinya sia-sia saja usaha pemain

bermain bermati-matian untuk melangkah ke pusingan seterusnya.

"Oleh itu, jaga tingkah laku dan patuhi arahan dikeluarkan demi keselamatan semua pihak kerana Terengganu antara pasukan berpotensi beraksi di final Piala Malaysia," katanya ketika dihubungi Arena Metro.

Akhbar ini semalam melaporkan kemenangan Terengganu menentang Selangor dicemari insiden penyokong pasukan pelawat 'menerjah' ke dalam kawasan tepi padang bagi meraikan gol.

dan Mintah ketika meraikan gol kedua tanpa dikawal ketat oleh pegawai perlawanan.

Insiden berkenaan sekali gus menimbulkan persoalan tahap keselamatan selain terhadap pematuhan SOP yang ditetapkan Liga Bolasepak Malaysia (MFL) bagi membendung penularan Covid-19.

## MBSA laksana inisiatif tanpa tunai menjelang awal 2022

**SHAH ALAM** - Majlis Bandaraya Shah Alam (MBSA) bakal memperluaskan inisiatif bayaran tanpa tunai menjelang awal tahun hadapan susulan sambutan baik yang diterima daripada pengguna.

Inisiatif pembayaran tanpa tunai ini bakal menyediakan medium bayaran secara dalam talian antaranya seperti perbankan internet, terminal kad, JomPAY dan SnapNPay.

Datuk Bandar Shah Alam, Datuk Zamani Ahmad Mansor berkata, dengan pelaksanaan itu, MBSA telah mengorak langkah ke hadapan dalam memberikan kemudahan pembayaran yang lebih fleksibel kepada pengguna dan penduduk di bandar raya itu.

“Jumlah mereka yang membayar tanpa tunai ini meningkat setiap fasa di

mana pada tahun ini lebih 60 peratus memilih kaedah berkenaan.

“Jadi melihat peningkatan itu, kami mencadangkan ia diperluaskan lagi penggunaannya,” katanya selepas majlis pelancaran inisiatif berkenaan yang berlangsung di Auditorium MBSA pada Selasa.

Dalam pada itu, Zamani berkata, pembayaran tanpa tunai itu bukan sahaja membabitkan cukai taksiran malah semua perkhidmatan lain seperti pembayaran kompaun, parkir dan sewaan premis.

Ujar beliau, pihaknya berharap inisiatif itu dapat memudahkan serta menjimatkan masa orang ramai di samping mempromosikan amalan gaya hidup baru komuniti tanpa tunai menjelang tahun 2022.

**Shahrel Fikri mula mencari rentak**

**PENYERANG** Selangor FC, Shahrel Fikri Md Fauzi mengakui masih belum mampu beraksi 90 minit selepas mendapat peluang kembali diturunkan sejak aksi ketiga Kumpulan A Piala Malaysia sebagai pemain gantian.

Sebelum ini, Shahrel Fikri terpaksa melupakan musim 2021 sepenuhnya selepas berdepan kecederaan pergelangan kaki pada awal Mei lalu sebelum akhirnya kembali mendapat kepercayaan untuk bermain.

Kehadirannya sejak perlawanan menentang Kuching City FC di Stadium Tan Sri Dato' Haji Hassan Yunus, Larkin pada 3 November lalu ternyata memperkuatkan serangan *The Red Giants*, malah bekas penyerang Perak FC itu membuktikan diri sentuhannya masih lagi berbisa apabila me-

ledak gol tunggal Selangor FC ketika berdepan Terengganu FC di Stadium Majlis Bandaraya Petaling Jaya (MBPJ) pada Ahad lalu.

"Setakat ini apabila diberi tanggungjawab saya rasa tidak mustahil untuk mendapatkan sekurang-kurangnya satu gol dan Alhamdulillah, malam ini (Ahad) saya berjaya menjaringkan gol. Saya rasa macam terlalu cepat juga masuk padang sebab sasaran sebenarnya untuk mula balik musim depan, tetapi selepas proses pemulihan berjalan lancar, saya dapat beraksi semula untuk musim ini, cuma kena kerja lebih keras lagi untuk tahun depan.

"Kaki saya dah pulih sepenuhnya, cuma hanya mental dan fizikal sahaja kena lebih kuat dan nak bermain 90 minit sepenuhnya memang agak su-

kar, tetapi saya akan cuba perlahan-lahan untuk masuk pada separuh masa kedua terlebih dulu," jelasnya.

lepas berehat panjang.

"Saya ada bercakap dengan Eky (Shahrel Fikri) minggu lalu untuk menambahkan lagi minit permainannya. Eky juga ada memberitahu saya, dia tiada masalah untuk beraksi dalam tempoh 45 minit," ujar Neitzel.

Chettiar community urges MPK to retain original name of Klang's Chetty Padang >4

CHETTIARS, who established the 150-year-old Sri Nagara Thandayuthapani Hindu Temple in Jalan Bukit Jawa, are against Klang Municipal Council's (MPK) unilateral decision to rename Chetty Padang to Jejak Warisan Klang @ Chetty Padang.

Sri Nagara Thandayuthapani Hindu Temple incoming president Dr A. Ramanathan, 75, said MPK must retain the original name as it gives people of all races and cultural backgrounds a sense of identity.

On Oct 28, MPK president Ahmad Fadzli Ahmad Tajuddin told reporters after a full board meeting that the Selangor government wanted the field renamed Jejak Warisan Klang @ Chetty Padang.

"MPK had suggested the new name for the field," Ramanathan said.

"Historical facts must be set right.

"Half of Chetty Padang was gifted to the British government."

He said that half of the current 1.34ha field parallel to the temple was gifted to the British during the colonial days to be used as police barracks for Punjabi recruits.

"We must understand that the British requested for the privately-owned land belonging to the Chettiar clan.

"Our people supported the government of that time and gifted half of the land.

"There is a marked difference between land acquisition and it being gifted.

"During that time, part of the land (that was gifted to the British) was used for religious and cultural purposes.

"It was not land acquisition but a gift made for a specific purpose in the best interest of Klang."

he added.

Ramanathan said since the Chettians had gifted the land, MPK must at least uphold the name.

"It is a classic name. We must retain it to honour the Malay, Chinese and Indian sportsmen and sportswomen of the past, who trained for hours on this field and represented Selangor and Malaysia at sporting events," he said.

"We cannot compromise on historical facts.

"A majority of the Klang people want MPK to reinstate the Chetty Padang name on the archway at the field's entrance.

"Keep the two words as it is, do not add other words," he said.

Current president A. Nagappan, 57, said the people want the name Chetty Padang retained as this

would also allow future generations to reconnect and retrace historical events.

"MPK must keep the original name as it gives us a sense of cultural identity," he said.

Businessman and temple committee member S.M. Subramaniam, 62, said it was time the Chetty Padang name was restored.

"Our voices are being ignored. We cannot have the name mangled, we want the original name," he added.

Meyappan Muthiah, 73, said the local council must retain the name as most Klang folk have fond memories of the field as it was used for athletics, cricket, hockey and football.

Temple trustee Ganesan Nagappan, 65, agreed that since the field had belonged to the Chettians so its original name should be retained to reflect Malaysia's cultural mosaic.

Selangor MCA Youth deputy chief Datuk BK Tan said MPK in its uni-

lateral move had failed ratepayers.

"It is disheartening that MPK decided on the new name for Chetty Padang and ignored the people's voice.

"It is not difficult, just keep the two words.

"It is time MPK improves on its approach in dealing with ratepayers, conduct public engagement to get feedback and allow the people to have a say and not bulldoze with unilateral decisions that cause disharmony," added Tan.

YOUNG women have an important role to play in advocacy for gender equality and women empowerment, and it is with this in mind that the "Creating Agents for Change" programme was launched in October.

"Change is important, but it's hard, especially if we've been doing things the same way for a very long time. It needs new thinking and new actors, and I think it's particularly important to have young women be those agents of change," says Datin Paduka Marina Mahathir at the launch.

"In order to protect and advocate for the rights of women in Malaysia, we need to raise more women leaders to be agents for change in attitudes, approaches, policies, and laws," she adds.

As such, twenty young Malaysian women activists are set to become advocates through the Creating Agents for Change programme.

Launched online (via Zoom) by the US Ambassador to Malaysia Brian D McFeeters, Selangor State Executive Councilor for Health, Unity, Women and Family Empowerment Dr Siti Mariah Mahmud, and activist Marina, the programme is organised by women's NGO Empower Malaysia and 3R Malaysia with the support of the US Embassy.

The five-month, capacity-building programme will equip the young women who are aged between 18 to 30, to become better advocates in their fight for gender equality.

"This demographic is selected because they spend the majority of their time using digital media. Every user has a platform and a certain degree of influence, whether it's to their friends or their family, and it's what they do with it that differentiates them from others," says Empower's project coordinator Denise Lee.

#### Importance of advocacy

McFeeters says the programme is a continuation of the US Embassy's Wanita Empowered campaign that started about a year ago and is a major priority.

"The Covid-19 pandemic has exacerbated existing inequalities for women in every sphere, from health and economy, to security and social protection, but women have also played a large role in responding to the virus as front line workers, caregivers at home, and world leaders," says McFeeters.

"Women's unpaid workload has increased significantly as a result of school closures and increased needs of older family members during the pandemic.

"They are also hit by the economic impact of Covid-19 as they

disproportionately work in the informal economy, putting them at greater risk of falling into poverty," he adds.

"The pandemic has also led to an increase of violence against women and girls because during the lockdowns, women have been trapped at home in abusive situations, struggling to access critical services that have been impacted during the lockdowns.

"Domestic violence, sexual harassment, child marriage – these are just some of the issues that the participants are working to combat," he says.

Creating Agents for Change involves a series of workshops that will immerse the 20 young women in the foundations of human and gender rights to anchor their advocacy efforts. They will also receive in-depth media training to enhance their creativity in promoting social change and learn how to use media tools effectively to run their own media-focused advocacy campaigns in the future.

#### Persevere through challenges

Speaking at the launch, Dr Siti Mariah offered advice that not only the 20 participants but all women advocates in general can benefit from.

Dr Siti Mariah encouraged the participants not to become discouraged in their advocacy work, but rather, persevere when they don't see things improving immediately.

"If you wonder whether your advocacy will be successful and when the results will materialise, realise that you might not always see it in your lifetime. But, also know that we're all part of a link in the chain because what we do now will be continued by others in the future who have the same goals and aspirations as us," she says.

Speaking from her own personal experience, Dr Siti Mariah reveals that advocacy work often involves taking small steps consistently and speaking out or communicating.

"In my early days as an MP with the Islamic party, women were not a part of any committees, and I had to voice out that there should be women representatives for every committee that we have," says Dr Siti Mariah.

"There would also be meetings at 9pm after prayers which often ran till midnight, and as women, we wear many hats (such as attending to our children) which

made this difficult. And I would communicate my thoughts on this and after that, they changed it to (an) earlier (time) at 6pm," she says.

"Although it may not always be taken well, we need to speak out because how else would men know the needs of women if we women do not tell them?" Dr Siti Mariah asks rhetorically.

Secondly, don't be discouraged when you meet with walls in your advocacy work, she says.

"Change can be subtle. In my 20 years of experience, as advocates, we may be very passionate and enthusiastic, and sometimes, we meet with walls or those who are resistant to change.

"But don't be discouraged. Instead, try to think out of the box. I found that talking about *mempertahankan* (empowerment) sometimes gives people a negative and wrong impression of aggressive women with big muscles forcing their way through, and as a result, instead of being willing to listen,

people (whether men or other women) are driven away.

"So, we have to be wise in our approach, lobby first before we introduce our idea or thoughts," she advises, advocating a "work smart as well as work hard approach".

Thirdly, advocacy for women to part of decision-making is a conversation that must happen, she says.

"We need to communicate and speak out. The hardship that women have to go through when women aren't involved in decision and policy-making can only be eliminated if we talk about it," says Dr Siti Mariah.

"Gender mainstreaming is not just about women. It's about society, and also affects men and children, so we need to talk about it so that people will understand why it's important – and why gender advocacy and the presence of women in decision-making for both the public and private sectors is vital," she says.

The Creating Agents for Change programme will allow young women from various backgrounds the safe space to actively engage in critical conversations on advocacy and gender issues.

In addition, a variety of gender experts and advocacy groups – Amnesty International, Legal Dignity, MISI Solidariti, Justice for Sisters and many more – will be brought in to connect participants with current rights activists in Malaysia. The merging of rights-based thinking, creativity, media advocacy skills, and meaningful connections are instrumental as stepping stones towards enhancing their capacity as young activists.

At the end of the programme, the participants will have the opportunity to design and produce their own audio-visual content to highlight various gender issues and their efforts will be showcased in a special screening held in conjunction with International Women's Day in March 2022.

Malaysian host and presenter Dayah Bakar, a young person herself, says that social media is a good platform to share one's thoughts, ideas and messages, and as an advocate, it's a good way to put across what you're passionate about in a way that people can relate to, in order to generate awareness on important issues.

"To all those going through the programme, I believe that you'll learn a lot. Similar to the 3R project that I went through, you'll have very experienced and knowledgeable mentors who will teach you so many things," she says.

Dayah's message to the participants is simple but impactful: "Speak your own mind, be relatable and as creative as you can. Remember that a simple message can impact or change someone's life."

"The participants in this programme will learn that advocating for change is difficult but it can be done. There are knowledge and skills to be picked up and ways to implement them in effective ways. The programme can improve the community's understanding towards advocacy work in Malaysia and I believe there will be community support when people understand that these agents of change want to benefit all of society, not just themselves," concludes Marina.

# Learning all about river care

NGO works with DID, MPK and local community to conserve Sungai Klang

GLOBAL Environment Centre (GEC), Drainage and Irrigation Department (DID), Klang Municipal Council (MPK) and the local community have come together in a strategic partnership for the benefit of Selangor's waterways and to enhance public awareness on the importance of caring for rivers.

The Sungai Klang Urban River Open Classroom launched last month is a hands-on river educational site in Taman Pengkalan Kampar, Klang.

People in the area can now learn and explore effective ways to care for the river, especially on monitoring and protecting its water quality.

The activity is supported by the Mainstreaming of Biodiversity Conservation into River Management Project implemented by DID, as well as United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). It is funded by Global Environment Facility (GEF) with GEC as the implementing partner.

In his address at the event, DID river basin management division director Datuk Jamil Shaari said, "While DID is primarily responsible for the care of rivers from a technical standpoint, the soft approach is as vital to ensure we achieve our river health targets.

"The involvement of local communities living near rivers is a key enabler to the effectiveness and success of all river care efforts."

He expressed hope that through this project, greater emphasis would be given to the importance of river care and the biodiversity within the river and along

the riverbanks.

Jamil said the project highlighted the negative effects of invasive species — including plants, animals, pathogens and other organisms — that disrupt the food chain and cause riverbank erosion while resulting in water quality degradation.

"DID appeals to all quarters to work towards becoming citizens of knowledge, which can lead us to act wisely and keep from polluting or destroying rivers and the environment," he said.

He congratulated River Ranger Sungai Pinang — the first River Ranger community in Malaysia — and GEC for keeping the movement alive and active for the past 10 years.

MPK president Dr Ahmad Fadzli Ahmad Tajuddin thanked Selangor DID for selecting Klang as part of the pilot project.

In 2015, the cooperation between MPK and GEC also led to the setting up of the Flood Ranger squad and subsequently, the publication of "Module on Role of

Community in Integrated River Basin Management" as well as the launch of the Smart Ranger programme in schools in 2019.

The Sungai Klang Urban River Open Classroom event included a visit to the new Open Classroom, a safety briefing and water quality monitoring by River Ranger Kampung Sungai Pinang, Klang.

KUALA LUMPUR (Nov 9): The cost-benefit analysis (CBA) for the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) will be finalised by the end of the year.

International Trade and Industry Minister Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali said the CPTPP is expected to be ratified by middle of next year.

“We had to conduct the CBA again this year due to the pandemic since we need to take a second look at the impact of the international trade agreement that we have signed.

“The CBA will be completed by the end of this year, and when it is submitted, we will get a new mandate from the Cabinet before we continue the internal process,” he said after officiating the Malaysia Aerospace Summit 2021 here today.

Mohamed Azmin said the findings from the CBA will be presented to the Cabinet for the evaluation and consideration of the CPTPP.

Earlier in his speech, Mohamed Azmin said revenue from the aerospace industry will reach RM30 billion by 2025.

KUALA LUMPUR (Nov 9): Thirteen areas in Kuala Lumpur are currently experiencing unscheduled water supply disruption due to a burst pipe at Jalan Lingkaran Tengah 2 (MRR2) here.

"Repairs are expected to be completed by Wednesday (Nov 10) at 11.30am and consumers will start receiving water supply in stages after the work is completed," according to a statement from Air Selangor Sdn Bhd.

"The affected areas are Taman Muda, Taman Bukit Permai, Taman Bukit Pandan, Kampung Cheras Baru, Taman Mawar, Taman Seraya, Taman Mega, Taman Bukit Teratai, Taman Melur, Taman Saga, Taman Putra, Pandan Mewah and Taman Mestika," said the Air Selangor management.

It informed that it had shut off the water supply at 11.30am on Tuesday (Nov 9) to ensure that pipe repair work could be carried out.

Air Selangor said it would send tanker trucks to the affected priority areas such as hospitals, dialysis centres and funeral parlours.

"Consumers are expected to comply with social distancing and wear face masks when taking water supply from the tanker trucks.

SHAH ALAM (Nov 9): The Selangor government has denied giving approval to the construction of a new expressway named Sungai Klang Expressway (SKE) as alleged in a video clip that went viral on social media recently.

State Infrastructure and Agriculture Committee chairman Izham Hashim said the state government had probed into the video clip and found that there is no such project being approved for implementation in Selangor.

“Instead, we (the state government) found that the alleged proposed construction of the SKE as shown in the video is almost similar to the proposed construction of the Sungai Klang Link, a project which has received the approval in principle by the State Executive Council on Jan 17, but which has yet to be approved by the federal government,” he told a press conference here on Tuesday (Nov 9).

Izham explained that every highway privatisation project to be implemented in any state is subject to the federal government’s approval, while the state government would only act as the project facilitator so as to

ensure compliance with rules and regulations in force.

“We will refer the matter to the state legal adviser to see what legal action can be taken against the SKE company, which is believed to have just been established late last year, as the state government had never received any proposal from the company,” he said.

According to Izham, the circulation of the video, if continued, could cause uneasiness and confusion among the public as logos of several local authorities are being used, implying that the project has been approved.

# Govt expects to ratify CPTPP by mid-2022

*MITI had previously stated its plans to seek a mandate from the Cabinet on the ratification by year-end or 1Q22*

THE government expects to ratify the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) by mid-next year after it finalises the cost benefit analysis (CBA) for the partnership.

International Trade and Industry (MITI) minister Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali said the government had to conduct another round of the CBA due to the pandemic that disrupted the processes involved.

"We had conducted another CBA this year since there was a global pandemic. We had to look at the impact of the free trade agreement we have signed, the CBA will be completed by year-end.

"Once it is submitted, we will get a new mandate from the Cabinet before we proceed with the internal process. We expect everything to be completed by mid next year," he said after officiating the Malaysia Aerospace Summit 2021 (MyAero'21) in Kuala Lumpur yesterday.

MITI had previously stated its plans to seek a mandate from the Cabinet on the ratification of the CPTPP by year-end or the first quarter of 2022 (1Q22).

Currently, as a signatory, Malaysia does not enjoy preferential tariff rates offered and is not allowed to

block any consensus made by parties in all CPTPP meetings.

Meanwhile in his keynote address at the event, the minister said the aerospace industry is estimated to reach RM30 billion by 2025.

He noted that the 12th Malaysia

Plan charts the direction for the advancement of the aerospace industry as a strategic sector that will realise the nation's aspiration to be a global powerhouse.

"In order to uplift the aerospace ecosystem in Malaysia, it is imperative that we enhance value-creation across the whole value chain rather than just becoming a part of it.

"In this regard, Malaysia's small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) have been formidable in a narrow range of aerospace products and would therefore require to move up the value chain into product and process designing," he said.

With the recovery in the global economy increases demand for air travel as well as logistics, Mohamed Azmin said original equipment manufacturers such as Airbus, Rolls-Royce, Collins Aerospace and Spirit AeroSystems have declared their intention to increase procurement from more competitive sources.

Large local players are taking advantage of this development and will require a strong SME supply chain to support local value creation, he said.

"The global aerospace landscape

is accelerating its reforms to meet aggressive carbon footprint reduction aspirations, where the environmental, social and governance agenda becomes a prerequisite to participate in the industry.

"Transforming with this requirement provides opportunities for the Malaysian supply chain to be future-ready for other similar global industry requirements," said Mohamed Azmin.

He strongly urged local SMEs to fully capitalise and respond to the new trajectory towards environmental, social and governance transformation.

The adoption of advanced technology and digitalisation would be pivotal in achieving a sustainable supply chain, said Mohamed Azmin, as the transformation is not only limited to the companies themselves but also applies to supplies, service and utility providers.

MyAero'21 brings together 500 participants of the aerospace industry community to discuss the way forward for the Malaysian aerospace industry.

It is spearheaded by the National Aerospace Industry Coordinating Office under MITI and is organised in collaboration with The Institution of Engineers Malaysia.
